The Mayor and Board of Commissioners of the City of Enid, County of Garfield, State of

Oklahoma, the Trustees of the Enid Municipal Authority, a Public Trust, the Trustees of the Enid

Authority, a Public Trust, met in regular session at 6:30 P.M. on the 23rd day of February 2017, in the

Council Chambers of the Administration Building of the City of Enid, located at 401 West Owen K.

Garriott Road in said city, pursuant to notice given by December 15, 2016 to the Clerk of the City of

Enid, and pursuant to notice thereof displayed at the entrance to the Administration Building of said city,

in prominent view and which notice was posted prior to 5:00 P.M. on the 22nd day of February 2017.

Mayor Shewey called the meeting to order with the following members present and absent:

PRESENT: Commissioners Janzen, Ezzell, Wilson and Mayor Shewey.

ABSENT: Commissioner Brownlee.

Staff present were City Manager Jerald Gilbert, City Attorney Andrea Chism, City Clerk Linda

Parks, Director of Engineering Services Christopher Gdanski, Public Services Director Billy McBride,

Public Utilities Director Louis Mintz, Planning Administrator Chris Bauer, Fire Chief Joe Jackson,

Director of Marketing and Public Relations Steve Kime, and Human Resources Director Sonya Key.

Retired Pastor Clarence Glaze, gave the Invocation, and Mr. Billy McBride led the Flag Salute.

Motion was made by Commissioner Janzen and seconded by Commissioner Ezzell to approve the

minutes of the regular Commission meeting of February 7, 2017, and the vote was as follows:

Animal Control Officer Jerad Free presented "Austin," a 5-month old male Lab mix, available for

adoption at the Enid Animal Shelter.

A proclamation was read and presented to former Commissioner Rodney Timm for his

contributions and distinguished service while serving as Ward 4 Commissioner on the Enid City

Commission.

A proclamation was also read recognizing former Commissioner David Vanhooser for his

contributions and distinguished service while serving as Ward 6 Commissioner on the Enid City

Commission.

Motion was made by Commissioner Ezzell to appoint Mr. Jonathan Waddell as Ward 4

Commissioner, and Mr. George Pankonin as Ward 6 Commissioner to fill unexpired terms on the

Commission to May 2017.

Motion was seconded by Commissioner Janzen, and the vote was as follows:

AYE: Commissioners Janzen, Ezzell, Wilson and Mayor Shewey.

Municipal Judge James Long administered the Oath of Office to newly appointed Ward 4 Commissioner Jonathan Waddell, and Ward 6 Commissioner George Pankonin, after which time both took their respective seats on the Commission.

A hearing was held regarding a proposed ordinance amending Chapter 17 in Title 11 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, entitled "Fences;" Section 11-7-2, entitled "Materials;" Section 11-17-4, entitled "Setbacks and View Restrictions;" Section 11-17-6, entitled "General Standards and Regulations;" and Section 11-17-7, entitled "Front Yard Fences."

City Attorney Andrea Chism explained that the proposed ordinance would allow ribbed or corrugated metal panels to be used as fencing material; reduce the set-back requirement from eight feet to zero, should a fence be constructed where it could be seen through; require the top of metal fences to be capped; require the bottom edge of fences to be level with or below the ground; and remove the requirement regarding separation of pickets required for front yards.

There being no further comments, the hearing concluded.

Motion was made by Commissioner Janzen and seconded by Commissioner Wilson to approve a resolution amending the 2016-2017 Capital Improvement Fund Budget by appropriating additional funds in the amount of \$40,709.00 to provide funding for two new entryway signs, and the vote was as follows:

Brief discussion was held regarding a Purchase and Sale Agreement between the City of Enid and

MTK Construction & Properties, LLC, for property located at 116 West Owen K. Garriott Road.

Ms. Chism explained that the referenced contract included the property located at 116 West

Owen K. Garriott Road, the building on that property, and the adjacent vacant lot, at a purchase price,

including closing costs, estimated at \$535,000.00.

Mayor Shewey asked Ms. Chism to comment on the lease that was currently against the property.

Ms. Chism stated that Family Dollar had a lease for the building on the property, with an option

to extend the lease through 2032 in five-year increments. The City of Enid would assume the lease, and

receive the rent payments on the lease, estimated at approximately \$40,000.00 per year.

Motion was made by Commissioner Ezzell to approve said agreement as presented.

Motion was seconded by Commissioner Waddell, and the vote was as follows:

Brief discussion was held with respect to a resolution declaring the intent to consider approval of a project and creation of a Tax Increment District under the Local Development Act; directing preparation of a Project Plan; appointing a Review Committee; directing the Review Committee to make findings as to eligibility and financial impact, if any, on taxing jurisdictions within the District; directing the Review Committee to make a recommendation with respect to the proposed Project Plan; directing the Planning Commission to make a recommendation with respect to the proposed Project Plan; directing the Review Committee and the Planning Commission to make a recommendation with respect to termination of certain existing tax increment districts; and containing other provisions relating thereto.

Mr. Brent Kisling, Executive Director of the Enid Regional Development Alliance (ERDA), spoke regarding the project. He stated that ADM Milling was looking to make a sizable investment in Enid, and creation of the Tax Increment Finance (TIF) District was the first step in that process to encourage them to make an investment in the community versus other communities around the nation.

Mr. Nate Ellis from the Public Finance Law Group, LLC, stated that the resolution was the

beginning of the a process to create the TIF District that would allow the City to capture a portion of

incremental tax revenues generated by additional capital investment made, which in this case, was from a

\$30-\$35 million proposed project of modernizing the ADM milling facility on 4th Street, utilizing tax

increment financing as a project incentive. He stated that the resolution would authorize and create a

Review Committee to review the Project Plan, and make a recommendation with respect to creation of the

TIF District. Two public hearings would be held throughout the process, with an ordinance coming back

to the Commission to formally create the TIF District and adopt the Project Plan.

Mr. Ellis also stated that in 2012, TIF District No. 5 was created for a proposed development of

Oakwood Mall. He stated that the project languished for a number or years, and essentially went in a

different direction than what was originally intended. As a result, it seemed appropriate to terminate that

TIF District during this process as well.

ORDINANCE NO. 2017-2

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ENID MUNICIPAL CODE, 2014, TITLE 11, ENTITLED "ZONING," CHAPTER 17, ENTITLED "FENCES," SECTION 11-17-2, ENTITLED "MATERIALS," TO ALLOW METAL FENCE PANELS; AMENDING SECTION 11-17-4, ENTITLED "SETBACKS AND VIEW RESTRICTIONS," TO ALLOW FENCES FOUR (4) FEET IN HEIGHT OR LESS TO BE CONSTRUCTED ADJACENT TO THE RIGHT OF WAY; AMENDING SECTION 11-17-6, ENTITLED "GENERAL STANDARDS AND REGULATIONS," TO REQUIRE THE EDGES OF METAL FENCES TO BE CAPPED OR OTHERWISE PROTECTED; AMENDING SECTION 11-17-7, ENTITLED "FRONT YARD FENCES," TO REMOVE THE SEPARATION OF PICKETS REQUIREMENT; PROVIDING FOR REPEALER, SAVINGS CLAUSE, SEVERABILITY AND CODIFICATION.

Brief discussion was held with respect to a resolution appointing ENIDBWP, LLC as the developer of a downtown hotel; ratifying a Master Development Agreement between the Enid Economic Development Authority (EEDA) and ENIDBWP, LLC; and authorizing the Chairman of the EEDA to execute all documents necessary for the closing with ENIDBWP, LLC.

A timeline of events leading to the development of the proposed hotel was provided by Mr. Kisling. He stated that following denial of a Hilton Garden Inn application in November 2016, the City of Enid and ERDA began working with other flags to develop a downtown hotel, and was now presenting a Master Development Agreement with ENIDBWP, LLC, for a Best Western Glo hotel. He spoke with respect to Best Western's rebranding of their entire program, establishing three brands, one of which was their premier brand called Glo for mid-size markets, which fit Enid perfectly. He stated that Best Western

had approved the site next to the CNB Center, and noted that Enid would be the first in Oklahoma to have

a Best Western Glo, and also the first in the contiguous states around Oklahoma.

Mr. Kisling provided a rendering of a proposed Best Western Glo, stating that none of the

developer's hotels were finished with construction because it was that new. He assured commissioners

that the hotel would have a brick façade, and would be a brand new look for the downtown area. He also

commended Ms. Kelly Tompkins from Main Street Enid and Ms. Marcy Jarrett from Visit Enid for their

involvement in the process to ensure that the hotel was something that would match the historic

downtown.

Mr. Kisling spoke on project incentives, stating that they were the same as those with the Hilton

Garden Inn. The land; a 40% room guarantee for five years; and the \$200,000.00 cost share on the

parking lot.

Comments were also made by Ms. Chism who advised commissioners that the resolution would

select ENIDBWP, LLC as the preferred developer of the downtown hotel. It would also allow the EEDA

to incentivize ENIDBWP, LLC, as defined in the Master Development Agreement, ratify the agreement,

allow EEDA to enter into the agreement, and authorize the Chairman of the EEDA to sign any and all

documents necessary for the closing.

Motion was made by Commissioner Ezzell to approve the resolution as presented.

Discussion was held with respect to a Master Development Agreement with ENIDBWP, LLC to develop a downtown hotel.

Ms. Cheryl Denney from the firm of McAfee & Taft, spoke regarding the agreement, stating it was substantially like the term sheet approved in June 2016 for the Hilton Garden Inn. Differences noted were as follows: The hotel would no longer be a Hilton Garden Inn. It would be a Best Western Glo; The requirement for 100 rooms had been decreased to 90 at the request of the developer. As a result, the aggregate square footage of the hotel would decrease proportionately; and, the hotel was no longer

required to have a restaurant. However, there were discussions going on for other alternatives. She also stated that the incentive package, as was stated earlier, was exactly the same. The room occupancy guarantee; the land; and the assistance in building the parking lot.

Ms. Denney stated that the agreement had intentionally been drafted to protect the City. The property would not be transferred to the developer until he was shovel ready. There would be other ancillary documents such as the Room Occupancy Guarantee Agreement to be considered, and approval of preliminary plans and specifications by the Commission. It would be a process, but she hoped it would be a process that progressed quickly.

Ms. Denney was asked to explain the structure of the occupancy guarantee and the way it was calculated. She stated that the Room Occupancy Agreement provided for a five-year, 40% room occupancy guarantee, that would be agreed upon by all parties at a later date. She also stated that the term sheet went into a fairly detailed explanation of what the calculations and such were going to be, adding that the developer and his counsel had reviewed the term sheet and were in agreement on that. She went on to say that when the developer came to the table, he was more interested in a room rate guarantee, and was willing to give up a sales tax rebate incentive, as other developers had asked, to get the guarantee. From the City's perspective, she felt it was a good trade. The room rate guarantee was much less likely to require a payment from the City, and hopefully, if a payment was ever required, it would be captured in a claw back in later years.

Trustee Ezzell stated that he was encouraged by the development. He was also encouraged by a developer who knew Enid doing the deal, and using local banks.

Trustee Wilson commented that having a hotel next to the Event Center would significantly increase the City's convention business. She also stated that Enid needed this hotel. It was definitely an important piece to its downtown, and definitely an important piece to the Event Center package.

There being no further discussion, motion as made by Trustee Ezzell to approve the Master Development Agreement as presented.

Motion was seconded by Trustee Janzen, and the vote was as follows:



BACKGROUND:

The purpose of this project is to increase the water production to meet increasing water demand of the city by replacing abandoned or less productive wells. To date the project has added five (5) new wells near the Ames area to the Enid well field infrastructure.

The improvements have added an estimated over a million Gallons Per Day (GPD) of water supply, however, additional supply is recommended to meet summer demands.

CITY OF ENID RIGHT-OF-WAY AGREEMENT

This Right-of-Way Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into by and between the City of Enid, an Oklahoma Municipal Corporation, hereinafter referred to as "City," and Consolidated Grain & Barge INC. hereinafter referred to as "Owner."

WHEREAS, the Owner desires to add a railroad crossing and replace the existing rail signals with new, up to date signal equipment, hereinafter referred to as "Rail Road Signal" in, under and across City owned right-of-way; and,

WHEREAS, the City has determined that such use would not impair or impede the City's rights in and use of such right-of-way; and,

WHEREAS, the City desires to allow such use.

WHEREAS, the parties hereto desire to outlines the terms of such use.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants and conditions herein stated and in consideration of the mutual benefits which will accrue to each of the parties hereto, the sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged by the parties, it is agreed by and between the parties as follows:

1. Authorization, Limitation and Subordination of Use:

- A. The Owner is hereby authorized to replace and operate an existing Rail Road Signal at 30th street Enid OK within City owned right-of-way per attached plans and exhibits. (30th street Enid OK DOT #671134A)
- B. The Owner's use of City owned right-of-way is subject and subordinate to the prior and continuing right and obligation of the City to use and maintain its entire right-of-way and property, including the right and power of the City to construct, maintain, repair, renew, use, operate, change, modify or relocate any railroad tracks, signals, communication, fiber optics or other wire lines, pipelines and any other facility upon, along, across or under any or all parts of the right-of-way, all or any of which may be freely done at any time or times by the City without liability to the Owner or to any other party for compensation or damages.
- C. The Owner's use of City owned right-of-way is also subject to all outstanding prior rights, including those in favor of owners and lessees of the City's right-ofway or property, and the right of the City to renew and extend the same, and this grant of use to Owner is made without covenant of title or for quiet enjoyment.
- D. The Owner's use is also subject to any and all claims, if any, made by adjacent property owners for compensation for the additional burden, if any, placed on adjacent and abutting property by this Agreement.

2. Construction, Maintenance and Operation:

- A. The Rail Road Signal shall be constructed, operated, maintained, repaired, renewed, modified and/or reconstructed by the Owner in strict conformity with the City Standard Specifications for right-of-way crossings, and all amendments thereof and supplements thereto, which by this reference is hereby made a part hereof, except as may be modified and approved by the City Engineer. In the event such specification conflicts in any respect with the requirements of any federal, state or municipal law or regulation, such requirements shall govern on all points of conflict, but in all other respects the specification shall apply. Owner further agrees to bury said Rail Road Signal a minimum of four (4) feet below the bar ditch surface and in such a manner as to pass inspection by the City Engineer or his authorized agent.
- B. All work performed on public right-of-way of the City in connection with the construction, maintenance, repair, renewal, modification or reconstruction of the Rail Road Signal shall be done under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the City.
- C. Prior to the commencement of any work in connection with the construction, maintenance, repair, renewal, modification, relocation, reconstruction or removal of the Rail Road Signal where it passes underneath the roadbed of the City, the Owner shall submit to the City, plans setting out the method and manner of handling the work, including the shoring and cribbing, if any, required to protect the City operations, and shall not proceed with the work until such plans have been approved by the Engineer of the City, and then only under the supervision of his authorized representative. The City shall have the right, if it so elects, to provide such support as it may deem necessary for the use and safety of its right-of-way, the time of construction, maintenance, repair, renewal, modification, relocation, reconstruction or removal of the Rail Road Signal, and, in the event the City provides such support, the Owner shall pay to the City, within fifteen (15) days after bills shall have been rendered therefore, all expense incurred by the City in connection therewith, which expense shall include all assignable costs.
- D. The Owner shall keep and maintain the soil over the Rail Road Signal thoroughly compacted and the grade even with the adjacent surface of the ground.
- Notice of Commencement of Work. If an emergency should arise which requires immediate attention, the Owner shall provide as much notice as practicable to City before commencing any work. In all other situations, the Owner shall notify the City at least ten
 - (10) days (or such other time as the City may allow) in advance of the commencement of any work upon property of the City in connection with the construction, maintenance, repair, renewal, modification, reconstruction, relocation or removal of the Rail Road Signal. All such work shall be prosecuted diligently to completion.

4. Owner to Bear Entire Expense. The Owner shall bear the entire cost and expense incurred in connection with the construction, maintenance, repair and renewal and any and all modification, revision, relocation, removal or reconstruction of the Rail Road Signal, including any and all expense which may be incurred by the City in connection therewith for supervision, inspection, flagging, or otherwise.

5. Relocation or Removal of Rail Road Signal:

- A. The use herein allowed is subject to the needs and requirements of the City in the operation of its right-of-way and in the improvement and use of its property. The Owner shall, at its sole expense, move all or any portion of the Rail Road Signal to such new location as the City may designate, whenever in the furtherance of its needs and requirement, the City shall find such action necessary or desirable.
- B. All the terms, conditions and stipulations herein expressed with reference to the Rail Road Signal on right-of-way of the City in the location hereinbefore described shall, so far as the Rail Road Signal remains on the property, apply to the Rail Road Signal as modified, changed or relocated within the contemplation of this section
- 6. No Interference with City's Operation. The Rail Road Signal and all parts thereof within and outside of the limits of the property of the City shall be constructed and, at all times, maintained, repaired, renewed and operated in such manner as to cause no interference whatsoever with the constant, continuous and uninterrupted use of the right-of-way and facilities of the City, and nothing shall be done or suffered to be done by the Owner at any time that would in any manner impair the safety thereof.

7. Protection of Fiber Optic Cable Systems:

- A. Fiber optic cable systems may be buried on the City right-of-way. Protection of the fiber optic cable systems is of extreme importance since any break could disrupt service to users, resulting in business interruption and loss of revenue and profits. Owner shall determine if fiber optic cable is buried anywhere on the City right-of-way to be used by the Owner. If fiber optic cable is buried in the City's right-of-way, Owner shall telephone the telecommunication company involved, arrange for a cable locator and make arrangements for relocation or other protection of the fiber optic cable prior to beginning any work in or on the City's right-of-way.
- B. In addition to the liability terms elsewhere in this Agreement, the Owner shall indemnify and hold the City harmless against and from all cost, liability, and expense whatsoever (including, without limitation, attorney's fees and court costs and expenses) arising out of or in any way contributed to by any act or omission of the City, its contractor, agents and/or employees, that causes or in any way or degree contributes to:

- 1) Any damage to or destruction of any telecommunications system by the Owner, and/or its contractor, agents and/or employees, on City right-of-way; and/or,
- 2) Any injury to or death of any person employed by or on behalf of any telecommunications company, and/or its contractor, agents and/or employees, on City right-of-way; and/or
- 3) Any claim or cause of action for alleged loss of profits or revenue by, or loss of service by a customer or user of, such telecommunication company.

8. Claims and Liens for Labor and Material; Taxes:

- A. The Owner shall fully pay for all materials joined or affixed to and labor performed upon the right-of-way of the City in connection with the construction, maintenance, repair, renewal, modification or reconstruction of the Rail Road Signal, and shall not permit or suffer any mechanic's or materialman's lien of any kind or nature to be enforced against the property for any work done or materials furnished thereon at the instance or request or on behalf of the Owner. The Owner shall indemnify and hold harmless the City against and from any and all liens, claims, demands, costs and expenses of whatsoever nature in any way connected with or growing out of such work done, labor performed, or materials furnished.
- B. The Owner shall promptly pay or discharge all taxes, charges and assessments levied upon, in respect to, or on account of the Rail Road Signal, to prevent the same from becoming a charge or lien upon property of the Owner, and so that the taxes, charges and assessments levied upon or in respect to such property shall not be increased because of the location, construction or maintenance of the Rail Road Signal or any improvement, appliance or fixture connected therewith placed upon such property, or on account of the Owner's interest therein. Where such tax, charge or assessment may not be separately made or assessed to the Owner but shall be included in the assessment of the property of the City, then the Owner shall pay to the City an equitable proportion of such taxes determined by the value of the Owner's property upon property of the City as compared with the entire value of such property.
- 9. Restoration of City Property. In the event the City authorizes the Owner to take down any fence of the City or in any manner move or disturb any of the other property of the City in connection with the construction, maintenance, repair, renewal, modification, reconstruction, relocation or removal of the Rail Road Signal, then in that event the Owner shall, as soon as possible and at the Owner's sole expense, restore such fence and other property to the same condition as the same were in before such fence was taken down or such other property was moved or disturbed, and the Owner shall indemnify

and hold harmless the City, its officers, agents and employees, against and from any and all liability, loss, damages, claims, demands, costs and expenses of whatsoever nature, including court costs and attorneys' fees, which may result from injury to or death of persons whomsoever, or damage to or loss or destruction of property whatsoever, when such injury, death, damage, loss or destruction grows out of or arises from the taking down of any fence or the moving or disturbance of any other property of the City.

10. <u>Indemnity</u>:

- A. As used in this section, "City" includes all right-of-way, property, and franchises at or near the location of the Owner's installation and their officers, agents, and employees; "Loss" includes loss, damage, claims, demands, actions, causes of action, penalties, costs and expenses of whatsoever nature, including court costs and attorneys' fees, which may result from:
 - Injury to or death of persons whomsoever (including the City's officers, agents, and employees, the Owner's officers, agents, and employees, as well as any other person); and
 - Damage to or loss or destruction of property whatsoever (including City's property, damage to the roadbed, tracks, equipment, or other property of the City, or property in its care or custody).
- B. As a major inducement and in consideration of the permit and permission herein granted, the Owner agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the City from any loss which is due to or arises from:
 - 1) The prosecution of any work contemplated by this Agreement, including, but not limited to, the installation, construction, maintenance, repair, renewal, modification, reconstruction, relocation or removal of the Rail Road Signal or any part thereof; and/or,
 - 2) The presence, operation, use of the Rail Road Signal or contents escaping therefrom, except to the extent the loss is caused by the sole and direct negligence of the City.
- 11. Removal of Rail Road Signal Upon Termination of Agreement. Prior to any termination of this Agreement, the Owner shall, at Owner's sole expense, remove the Rail Road Signal from those portions of the right-of-way or property of the City and shall restore, to the satisfaction of the City, such portions of such property to as good a condition as they were in at the time of the construction of the Rail Road Signal. If the Owner fails to do the foregoing, the City may do such work of removal and restoration at the cost and expense of the Owner. The City may, at its option, upon such termination, at the entire cost and expense of the Owner, remove the portions of the Rail Road Signal located underneath its roadbed and or right-of-way and restore such right-of-way to as good a condition as it was in at the time of the construction of the

Rail Road Signal, or it may permit the Owner to do such work of removal and restoration under the supervision of the City. In the event of the removal by the City of the property of the Owner and of the restoration of the right-of-way and property as herein provided, the City shall in no manner be liable to the Owner for any damage sustained by the Owner for or on account thereof, and such removal and restoration shall in no manner prejudice or impair any right of action for damages, or otherwise, that the City may have against the Owner.

12. <u>Waiver of Breach</u>. The waiver by the City of the breach of any condition, covenant or agreement herein contained to be kept, observed and performed by the Owner shall in no way impair the right of the City to avail itself of any subsequent breach thereof.

13. Termination:

- A. If the Owner does not use the right-of-way or Rail Road Signal for one (1) year, or if the Owner continues in default in the performance of any covenant or agreement herein contained for a period of thirty (30) days after written notice from the City to the Owner specifying such default, the City may, at its option, forthwith immediately terminate this Agreement by written notice.
- B. In addition to the provisions of subparagraph (A) above, this Agreement may be terminated by written notice given by either party hereto to the other on any date in such notice stated, not less, however, than thirty (30) days subsequent to the date upon which such notice shall be given.
- C. Notice of default and notice of termination may be served personally upon the Owner or by mailing to the last known address of the Owner. Termination of this Agreement for any reason shall not affect any of the rights or obligations of the parties hereto which may have accrued, or liabilities, accrued or otherwise, which may have arisen prior thereto.
- 14. <u>Assignment</u>. The Owner shall not assign this Agreement, in whole or in part, or any rights herein granted, without the written consent of the City, and it is agreed that any transfer or assignment or attempted transfer or assignment of this Agreement or any of the rights herein granted, whether voluntary, by operation of law, or otherwise, without such consent in writing, shall be absolutely void and, at the option of the City, shall terminate this Agreement.
- 15. <u>Binding Effect</u>. Subject to the provisions of Section 14 hereof, this Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their successors and assigns.

- 17. Third Party Beneficiaries. Nothing in this Agreement, expressed or implied, is intended to confer upon any person other than the parties hereto and their respective assigns, any rights or remedies under or by reason of this Agreement, except as provided expressly herein.
- 18. <u>Notices</u>. Whenever a notice is required to be given in writing and under the terms of this Agreement, or any extension hereunder, such notice shall either be hand-delivered or mailed by certified mail, return receipt requested, and directed to the respective parties at the following addresses:

or at such other address as a party shall specify by like notice to the other party hereto. Notices shall be effective on the date of delivery.

- 19. <u>Severability</u>. If any one or more of the sections, sentences, clauses, or parts be held invalid for any reason, the invalidity of such section, sentence, clause, or part shall not affect nor prejudice the applicability and validity of any other provision of this Agreement.
- 20. Employment Verification. The City of Enid requires all contractors to verify that employees working pursuant to contracts with the City of Enid are legally authorized to work in the United States. Owner agrees to verify and document the employment eligibility of all employees who may perform services pursuant to this Agreement. Owner also agrees to require all subcontractors who perform services under this Agreement to verify and document the employment eligibility of all employees who may perform services pursuant to this Agreement.
- 21. Non-Discrimination. The parties covenant (1) that no person shall be excluded from participation in, denied the benefit of, or otherwise subjected to discrimination under the terms of this Agreement on the ground of race, color, age, sex, handicap, or national origin; and (2) that, in carrying out the terms and conditions of this Agreement, no person shall be subjected to discrimination on the grounds of race, color, age, sex, handicap, or national origin.
- 22. <u>Compliance with Laws</u>. Owner shall conduct its business under the terms of this Agreement in such a manner that it does not violate Federal, State, or local laws or regulations applicable to the conduct of its operations under the terms of this Agreement.

- 23. <u>Interpretation of Law.</u> This Agreement shall be deemed to have been made in the State of Oklahoma and shall be construed and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Oklahoma.
- 24. Choice of Law. Any action or proceeding seeking to enforce any provision of, or based on any right arising out of, this Agreement may be brought against any of the parties in the courts of the State of Oklahoma, County of Garfield, or, if it has or can acquire jurisdiction, in the United States District Court for the Western District of Oklahoma, and each of the parties consents to the jurisdiction of such courts (and of the appropriate appellate courts) in any such action or proceeding and waives any objection to venue laid therein.
- 25. Governmental Tort Claims Act. By entering into this Agreement, City and its "employees," as defined by the Governmental Tort Claims Act, 51 Okla. Stat. § 151 et seq., do not waive sovereign immunity, any defenses, or any limitations of liability as may be provided for by law. No provision of this Agreement modifies and/or waives any provision of the Local Government Tort Claims Act.
- 26. <u>Construction</u>. Captions and other headings contained in this Agreement are for reference and identification purposes only and do not alter, modify, amend, limit, or restrict the contractual obligations of the parties.

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

Internal Control Over Financial Reporting

In planning and performing our audit of the financial statements, we considered the City's internal control over financial reporting (internal control) to determine the audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing our opinions on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the City's internal control. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the City's internal control.

A deficiency in internal control exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct misstatements on a timely basis. A material weakness is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control, such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the entity's financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected on a timely basis. A significant deficiency is a deficiency, or combination of deficiencies, in internal control that is less severe than a material weakness, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance.

Our consideration of internal control was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be material weaknesses or significant deficiencies. Given these limitations, during our audit we did not identify any deficiencies in internal control that we consider to be material weaknesses. We conducted our audit of compliance in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America; the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States; and the audit requirements of Title 2 U.S. *Code of Federal Regulations* Part 200, *Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards* (Uniform Guidance). Those standards and the Uniform Guidance require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether noncompliance with the types of compliance requirements referred to above that could have a direct and material effect on a major federal program occurred. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence about the City's compliance with those requirements and performing such other procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances.

We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion on compliance for each major federal program. However, our audit does not provide a legal determination of the City's compliance.

Opinion on Each Major Federal Program

In our opinion, the City complied, in all material respects, with the types of compliance requirements referred to above that could have a direct and material effect on each of its major federal programs for the year ended June 30, 2016.

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Report on Internal Control Over Compliance

Management of the City is responsible for establishing and maintaining effective internal control over compliance with the types of compliance requirements referred to above. In planning and performing our audit of compliance, we considered the City's internal control over compliance with the types of requirements that could have a direct and material effect on each major federal program to determine the auditing procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing an opinion on compliance for each major federal program and to test and report on internal control over compliance in accordance with the Uniform Guidance, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of internal control over compliance. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the City's internal control over compliance.

A deficiency in internal control over compliance exists when the design or operation of a control over compliance does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, noncompliance with a type of compliance requirement of a federal program on a timely basis. A material weakness in internal control over compliance is a deficiency, or combination of deficiencies, in internal control over compliance, such that there is a reasonable possibility that material noncompliance with a type of compliance requirement of a federal program will not be prevented, or detected and corrected, on a timely basis. A significant deficiency in internal control over compliance is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control over compliance with a type of compliance requirement of a federal program that is less severe than a material weakness in internal control over compliance, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance.

Our consideration of internal control over compliance was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control over compliance that might be material weaknesses or significant deficiencies. We did not identify any deficiencies in internal control over compliance that we consider to be material weaknesses. However, material weaknesses may exist that have not been identified.

The purpose of this report on internal control over compliance is solely to describe the scope of our testing of internal control over compliance and the results of that testing based on the requirements of the Uniform Guidance. Accordingly, this report is not suitable for any other purpose.

Report on Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards Required by the Uniform Guidance We have audited the financial statements of the City of Enid, Oklahoma, as of and for the year ended June 30, 2016, and have issued our report thereon dated December 22, 2016, which contained an unmodified opinion on those financial statements. Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming an opinion on the financial statements as a whole. The accompanying schedule of expenditures of federal awards is presented for purposes of additional analysis as required by the Uniform Guidance and is not a required part of the financial statements. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, the schedule of expenditure of federal awards is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the financial statements as a whole.

CONSIDERATION AND DENIAL OF TORT CLAIM OF STEPHANIE PARKER.

BACKGROUND:

On or about January 20, 2017, Stephanie Parker submitted a tort claim for property damage in the amount of five hundred twenty-one dollars and ninety cents (\$521.90). The claim alleged that while driving east near 2418 E. Pine Avenue and going around a parked car, Ms. Parker hit a pot hole causing damage to her 2004 Buick Lesabre. The City forwarded that claim to its insurer, Oklahoma Municipal Assurance Group (OMAG), which opened an investigation of the claim. A municipality may be liable only if it had prior notice of a defect or problem and failed to take appropriate remedial action within a reasonable time before the damage occurred. The City of Enid had no notice of this issue prior to the incident. OMAG found no liability on the City's part and recommended that the City deny the claim.

Deny tort claim.

SUBJECT:

CONSIDERATION AND DENIAL OF TORT CLAIM OF MITCHELL CHASE.

BACKGROUND:

On or about January 24, 2017, Mitchell Chase submitted a tort claim for a plumber bill in the amount of one hundred one dollars and thirty-one cents (\$101.31). The claim alleged that after a water main break and after the water was restored, rust and debris was sent into his pipes causing loss of water flow at the bathtub and sink. Mr. Chase called a plumber who found bits of rust lodged in the faucet. The City forwarded that claim to its insurer Oklahoma Municipal Assurance Group (OMAG), which opened an investigation of the claim. A change in water pressure in the City's line may cause sediment and rust to come loose from the pipes and could block faucets. This sediment is from mineral buildup inside of water pipes and is unavoidable. OMAG found no liability on the City's part and recommended that the City deny the claim.

Deny tort claim.
