





A Letter from the City Manager

The GME cast is made up of employees from public relations, engineering, and public works.

COE Engineering staff conducted meetings with consultants for the Alternate Water Supply Request for Proposal. The preliminary engineering proposals for the development of Kaw Lake were due in January 2015.

2015 CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS IN ENID

- **Koch Nitrogen Plant Expansion** This is a \$1.3 billion expansion to North America's largest fertilizer plant. Construction started in October 2014 and will conclude in the fall of 2017. They will average 500 construction workers throughout the project and will peak with about 1000 workers in town during the summer of 2016.
- **Breckinridge Wind Farm** This is a \$200 million project on the east side of Enid that concluded construction in August 2015. They had 200 construction workers in town for the past 8 months.
- Woodring Runway Extension This project was concluded at the end of October and increased Enid's municipal runway to 8000 feet long.
- Aircraft Structures International ASIC is completing work on its fourth hanger at Woodring Airport and plans to move part of their operation into it soon. They have grown from 45 to 60 employees in the past few months as part of this expansion.
- Autry Technology Center Training Facility at Woodring In response to the increasing training needs in the industrial parks on the east side of Enid, Autry has completely renovated their facility at Woodring to accommodate the training of new employees.
- Vance AFB Runway Construction will begin in 2016 to replace one of the runways at Vance. This \$35 million project will take 6-12 months to complete.
- Vance AFB Control Tower Construction was set to conclude by the end of 2015 on the new tower at Vance. This project has been underway for the past few years at the base and will be a great asset for the air field going forward.
- Hanor Corporate Headquarters In the summer of 2015, Hanor Companies announced they would be relocating their corporate headquarters from Wisconsin to Enid, OK. The new office building is under construction on east Garriott.
- Love's Country Store This new truck stop is under construction on east Garriott at 42nd Street. As part of this project, Love's partnered with the City of Enid to loop the water system in the area. They also partnered with ODOT and the Pilot Station across the street to improve the intersection with additional turning lanes and signals.
- **Pilot Travel Center -** Pilot concluded their construction in early 2015 and are partnering with Love's to improve the intersection of Garriott and 42nd street.
- FedEx Distribution Center This new DC is now operational and serving most of NW Oklahoma and Southern Kansas.
- NOC Residential Hall NOC cut the ribbon on these new dormitories in October of 2015.
- Leonardo's Children's Museum Leonardo's has been closed since school started to do \$6.5 million in renovations.
- LaQuinta Inn and Suites Located on the west side of Enid and opened in early November.
- Candlewood Suites This project is underway on east Garriott next to Greenbrier Nursing Home.

- **Homeaway Suites -** This project was completed in the fall of 2015 and is located next to Lowes on West Garriott.
- **Hilton Garden Inn Downtown -** This project is slated to begin construction in May of 2016 and be completed by the summer of 2017.
- Chisholm Creek Housing Addition David Richie is adding over 30 homes to this development in North Enid.
- Tara Estates Milestone Homes out of Ardmore is building 64 homes in this development at Oakwood and Purdue.
- **Esplanade Apartments** Jim and Brenda Dill are constructing this 200 unit market rate complex at Cleveland and Chestnut. The first units are slated to be open in March.
- Stonebridge Housing Addition Gene Anderson is building out the infrastructure now for the development of over 70 homes at Cleveland and Chestnut. The first homes are slated to be done in early 2016.
- Walmart Neighborhood Market This facility opened in early 2015 and is the cornerstone for continued retail development at Cleveland and Chestnut.
- **Enid Walking Trails System -** The City of Enid continues to expand this network of jogging and bike trails around town.
- Carland Group Housing Addition The Carland Group plans to construct about 40 homes on the west side of 30th street just south of Garriott starting in early 2016. These are income restricted properties and are intended to be workforce housing for new employees at AdvancePierre Foods and other businesses in the industrial areas of Enid.
- Zales Hunt Properties constructed a new facility for Zales on West Garriott.
- Enid Public Schools University Center As part of the \$100 million bond issue passed by Enid voters in support of Enid Public Schools, a University Center was completed in the summer of 2015 that now allows EPS students to take concurrent college enrollment classes while in high school.
- Chisholm Elementary School Chisholm Public Schools is building a new elementary school in North Enid which will be completed by the end of 2015.
- World Harvest Church The World Harvest Church recently constructed a new facility on south Garland and have vacated their property downtown. They have about 100 acres as part of their new campus and plan to continue developing that area of Enid with housing, retail and office space.
- Garland Nursing Facility (Highland Park Manor) Highland Park Manor is constructing a new modern facility on north Garland that will be open soon. They will be vacating their property on Willow.
- Express Wellness Center Enid headquartered Express Wellness constructed a new facility just north of the intersection of Garriott and Van Buren and opened in early 2015.

The Envision Enid Comprehensive Plan was completed and adopted by the Mayor and Board of Commissioners on September 1, 2015.


Koch Nitrogen was assisted with the rezoning of adjacent property to enable the \$1.3 billion expansion of their facility.

A cost effective way to connect the Enid Walking Trail to Downtown was identified.

A change was proposed in the PUD ordinance that facilitated the Forgotten Ministries Program Housing.

Uses by Reviews were conducted in front of the Metropolitan Area Planning Commission for NextEra Energy to allow wind turbines in the Breckinridge Wind Project area.

Loves and Microtel Inn and Suites site plans were reviewed and approved.



The Historic Preservation Commission utilized Certified Local Governments matching funds to hire a consultant to write the nominations of the Robert R and Minnie L Kisner Mansion located at 1111 Wynona Avenue, Marshall Hall located on the Northern Oklahoma College campus at 100 South University Avenue, Public Library of Enid and Garfield County at 120 West Maine Street and the Santa Fe Freight Depot at 702 North Washington Avenue to the National Register of Historic Places.





Engineering

Director of Engineering Chris Gdanski

The Engineering Department initiated the preliminary engineering tasks to develop Kaw Lake as an alternate water supply for the City of Enid.

The program will address the projected water needs of the City of Enid through the year 2050. The water rights for an average demand of 18 million gallons per day to supplement the ground water well fields were received from the Oklahoma Water Resources Board. The program is now focusing on the design of the intake structure, pump station, the 66 mile pipeline, terminal storage, and water treatment facility. This design information will be used to obtain a water storage contract with the U.S. Army Corp of Engineers.

This multi-year Capital Improvement Program will provide for a secure and reliable water supply for the Northwest Region and enable Enid to attract future developments.

On October 31, 2015 Fire Marshal Ken Helms and Assistant Fire Marshals Kevin Winter, Bill Moss and Mike Schatz were presented the award for *Investigators of the Year* by the Oklahoma Chapter of the International Association of Arson Investigators (OK-IAAI) at their annual conference in Midwest City. ATF Special Agent and IAAI board member Ashley Stephens nominated the group and presented the award citing an investigation and 2nd Degree Arson conviction of Martin Painter for the May 11, 2014 structure fire.

Founded in 1949, the IAAI mission is "To provide active support to fire, arson and explosion investigation professionals along with organizations and industries serving and associated with fire losses, through leadership, education and training, professional development/credentialing, networking, and the provision of resources. To encourage all in the profession to better communicate to those we serve how they are impacted by fire loss and arson." The IAAI now has over 70 chapters around the globe.

- Crosslin Park Drainage Project
- Don Haskins Park
- La Mesa Park Playground Equipment Refurbishing
- New Dog Park built at Meadowlake
- Fixed Sprinkler systems throughout the city
- Installed cables at Monsees Park
- Refurbished bleachers at Crosslin Park
- Rebuilt North Ballfields 1-4 at Crosslin

Solid Waste

- Landfill staff was able to reduce accumulated brush pile and reduce the accrued lechate. Both items no longer have to be worked on a daily basis, staff is able to keep both projects maintained by working them a few times throughout the month.
- 4/4/14 Commercial scale was open to local businesses. First customer to use the scale was Hi-Plains. (This was never presented to the commissioners so I thought I could put it in here).
- In 2015 management focus has been on establishing equal, fair and transparent services to customers by reviewing current contracts and establishing new fixed rates. The management department has almost tripled its monetary earnings by adjusting contracts that had not been looked at since 2005-2007.
- The demand for rolloff containers has been consistent and high, the department continuously needs to run a second truck to keep up with the work load. In August 2015, 10 rolloff containers were added to the inventory in order to assist with high rolloff container demand. The collection department is preparing to implement an additional rolloff route in 2016.
- In October 2015, department obtained a great relationship with Trails West Mobile Home Park by servicing them 90 polycarts and one dumpster. This relationship increased earnings by \$1268.20.

Water Reclamation

- Reduced the weekly large water leaks from the mid 30's to 5; cut meter leaks from mid 50's to 0 leaks.
- Modernized the sewer camera inspection equipment. WRS department is now capable of recording and providing vital, real-time data, thus increasing response time to City of Enid projects/emergency repairs.
- Completed a water-main installation on the 1900 block of E Elm.
- Assisted with sewer leak that was leaking raw sewage into a fresh water creek on the block of E. Frantz and S. Grand; averting a potential environmental emergency.
- WRS department repaired a major sewer pipe on the intersection of W. Willow and Cleveland Ave. This leak had caused a gigantic sink hole which was putting people's life in danger; the extra sludge in the system was also affecting the water treatment plant operations.
- WRS repaired 80 water-main breaks; 600 meter leaks; conducted 2000 water/sewer locates; replaced 8 fire hydrants; completed 80 service installations; jetted/cleaned/unplugged 3000 feet of sewer-lines; inspected 5000 feet of sewer lines; 250 lift-station calls and/or inspections; assisted with 600 sewer calls.

Water Production

- Produced 3 Billion gallons of water
- Repaired one main line, 3 service lines, and three air reliefs
- Rehabbed, and replaced pumps in 12 wells






