Special recognition was given to Mayor Bill Shewey for being the recipient of the 2018 Oklahoma Mayor of the Year, presented by the Mayors' Council of Oklahoma during the Oklahoma Municipal League Annual Conference.

A public hearing was held regarding the submission of the Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER) for the 2017 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program Year.

Grants Administrator Stephanie Moffitt addressed commissioners, explaining that this CAPER report was to acknowledge that one hundred percent of the CDBG allocation was spent for low- to moderate- income areas activities and programs. She noted that anyone could comment during the meeting, and that the time for comment would end the next morning by 9:00 am.

Mayor Shewey called the meeting to order with the following members present and absent:

PRESENT: Commissioners Janzen, Norwood, Waddell, Wilson, Pankonin and Mayor Shewey.

ABSENT: Commissioner Ezzell.

Director of Marketing and Public Relations Steve Kime, Human Resources Director Sonya Key, and Ex-

Reverend Kenneth Wade from St. Paul's Lutheran Church gave the Invocation, and Public Utilities Director Lou Mintz led the Flag Salute.

Motion was made by Commissioner Waddell and seconded by Commissioner Pankonin to approve the minutes of the regular Commission meeting of August 21, 2018, and the vote was as follows:

AYE: Commissioners Janzen, Norwood, Waddell, Wilson, Pankonin and Mayor Shewey.

NAY: None.

Animal Adoption Coordinator Charlet Ringwald presented "Little Queso", a 1 ½ to 2-year-old mix male dog available for adoption at the Enid Animal Shelter.

A Proclamation was read and presented proclaiming September 8, 2018 as "Walk 4RKids Day in Enid".

Motion was made by Commissioner Wilson and seconded by Commissioner Janzen to appoint Mr. Tom Andrew as the At-Large Representative to the Special Sales Tax Oversight Committee, and the vote was as follows:

AYE: Commissioners Janzen, Norwood, Waddell, Wilson, Pankonin and Mayor Shewey.

NAY: None.

A hearing was held to consider rezoning for property described as Lots 1 and 2, Block 13, Rock Island Heights Addition and Lots 6-10, Block 17, Southern Heights 2nd Addition, located at 301 East Iowa from R-2 Residential Single-Family District to R-7 Residential Multi-Family District.

City Planner Chris Bauer spoke regarding the proposal to rezone property at 301 East Iowa. He explained that the location was currently the site of an existing church. The applicant was Forgotten

Ministries, and the purpose for acquiring the property was to provide transitional housing for women. The road, water, and sewer was determined to be adequate for the purpose of the proposed rezoning. At their meeting of August 20, 2018, the Metropolitan Area Planning Commission (MAPC) recommended approval. The MAPC vote was seven in favor, and two opposed.

It was noted that the City had received a rezoning protest petition that included a total of sixty-five signatures. Of the sixty-five signatures, seven represented property owners with 19.2% of the property lying within three hundred feet. In entirety, there were thirty-five property owners (7 within 300 feet, 23 within a quarter mile, and 5 beyond a quarter mile), fifteen tenants, fourteen duplicates, and one unknown address included among the signatures submitted.

Attorney Ronald "Skip" Kelly, 205 NW 63rd Street, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, addressed commissioners and spoke in opposition of the rezoning. He explained that he was a long-time property owner in Enid. He further explained that he was not representing any religious faith, but he was representing the interest of residents and expressed hope that the continuation of the matter be addressed from the point of view of the application, the residents, the implications and effects, causes and concerns by the mere fact of the application itself. He stated that he had requested a copy of the application, but had not received a copy. Additionally, he stated that this matter, from some degree from the beginning, was unknown to many of the residents of Southern Heights, East Park Addition, and Rock Island Addition.

According to Mr. Kelly, based on statutory requirements of notice, he did not have verification that notice was given to every owner that was effected by the project, including the mailing of the notice to all individuals within a quarter of a mile of the project and notice that the notice was provided in the legal news of a publication of circulation in the area.

He expressed concern that some individuals received notice, but some might not have, and for those who did receive notice, there was no description of what this was for. Additionally, he spoke regarding the history of the neighborhood, and expressed concern regarding the potential effect on the residents and properties of the neighborhood

In closing, Mr. Kelly requested that commissioners seriously consider denying the application, or at least, given a proper time, in reference to verifications of the issues that he had asked and had not received.

Motion was made by Commissioner Norwood to table this item, to allow for further discussion and examination, and bring the item back at a future meeting.

Motion was seconded by Commissioner Janzen.

Mr. Bauer explained that, if the item was tabled, the best course of action would be to provide notification again.

Brief discussion was held regarding the benefit or lack of benefit of postponing action on the item.

Commissioner Norwood withdrew his motion to table, to allow for an opportunity for citizens from the community to speak.

Discussion was held at-length, and many citizens addressed a variety of concerns and opinions regarding the proposed rezoning, including the needs of the community, the need for transitional housing, and the potential of the neighborhood being positively or negatively impacted.

Mr. Jeremiah Herrian, of Forgotten Ministries, addressed commissioners, noting that rules for the housing were something that they were very strict on. He explained that this was not a prison facility, but housing for women that were in transition. Additionally, he explained that they were in a unique position, as far as being next to children, in that they run an afterschool program in their homeless shelter, which was in close proximity of the men's transitional housing. He noted that transitional housing was already

in Enid, in neighborhoods, and close to schools, and there was success with the individuals who came

through there, and have come out as productive members of society.

He noted that Forgotten Ministries had been provided the facility at the proposed location and the resources in that community to help transition women. Additionally, he noted that the ministry had been there three years in that area and had many success stories.

Following discussion, the hearing concluded.

BACKGROUND:

This is a companion to Item 7.1.

The Engineering Department has received a request from Bradly Classen to close a portion of a stormwater detention easement located in Lot 4, Block 13, Plat of Blocks Twelve & Thirteen, Willow West Fourth Addition, lying in the Northeast Quarter (NE/4) of Section Thirty-five (35), Township Twenty-three (23) North, Range Seven (7) West of the Indian Meridian, Garfield County, Oklahoma.

The applicant has already begun construction of a pool house on a portion of the stormwater detention easement. To complete the pool house, a portion of the easement would have to be closed. If the easement is not closed, the encroachment would have to be removed by the applicant.

A drainage study was completed by Brueggemann Holtzen Engineering, P.C. to determine if the existing storage and outlet were adequate with the encroachment. The drainage study concludes that the newly calculated flows remain lower than allowable flows, and the new water surface elevation is below the allowable flow. Therefore, the current design remains adequate if a portion of the easement is closed.

The Metropolitan Area Planning Commission (MAPC) reviewed this request at its meeting of August 20, 2018, and voted unanimously to approve closing.

Pursuant to Section 7-1-4 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2003, all utility companies and property owners within 300 feet of the portion of the storm water detention easement to be closed have been notified of this hearing.







BACKGROUND:

On June 16, 2015, the Commission approved an agreement with Garver, LLC, for professional engineering services to assist in the first phase of a program to develop an alternate water supply from Kaw Lake. On January 5, 2017, the Commission approved an amendment to the agreement for the second phase of the project which included the final configuration of the system, designing 30% of the project, initiating the environmental survey, and finalizing the tenative raw water pipeline route.

This amendment is for Phase Three of the Kaw Lake program. During this phase, the program administration and project controls and reporting will be updated. Land acquisition and design consultant management will be accomplished, including the final design support and the updated Phase Four schedule.

The period of performance for Phase 3 is eighteen months, and the cost for these services is an amount not to exceed \$12,098,170.00.

CONTRACT AMENDMENT NO. 2

This Contract Amendment No. 2, effective on the date last written below, shall amend the original contract between the CITY OF ENID, Oklahoma (CITY) and GARVER, LLC (ENGINEER), dated June 16, 2015 as amended on January 5, 2017 referred to in the following paragraphs as the amended contract.

This Contract Amendment No. 2 adds professional services for the:

Alternate Water Supply - Water Supply from Kaw Lake

The amended contract is hereby modified as follows:

Article I - Scope of Services

The additional specific services, which the Engineer agrees to furnish, are as indicated in the Attachment A "Phase 3 Scope of Services" dated July 16, 2018.

Article II - Time of Performance

The additional work items as described in Article I, shall be completed and submitted to the City in accordance with the schedule below:

Article III - Basis of Payment

For the additional work described under Article I - Scope of Service and for durations described under Article II - Time of Performance, the City will pay the Engineer up to and not to exceed twelve million, ninety eight thousand, one hundred and seventy dollars (\$12,098,170.00). The City represents that funding sources are in place with the available funds necessary to pay the Engineer.

For the additional services as described in Article I, the Engineer shall be compensated for labor in accordance with the same terms as presented in the original agreement. Expenses other than salary costs that are directly attributable to performance of the professional services will be billed at cost as follows:

Direct cost as defined below for miscellaneous expenses separated into the following categories:



- Travel includes meals, lodging, airfare, tolls, and other travel related expenses
- Reproduction outside reproduction costs and presentation material preparation
- Supplies miscellaneous supplies as needed in support of professional services
- Shipping mail/courier expenses
- Cost as defined below for miscellaneous expenses separated into the following categories
 - Mileage amount allowed by the federal government for mileage with an additional \$0.05 per mile for survey trucks/vans
 - Printing charges similar to commercial rates for reports, plan sheets, presentation materials, etc.
 - o GPS Survey \$21 per hour for use of GPS survey equipment
 - Aerial Photography \$400 per acre for use aerial survey equipment
- Direct cost for subcontract/subconsultant fees and Program Management Information System costs.

The table below presents a summary of the anticipated fee amounts for this amendment. Underruns in any work description may be used to offset overruns in another work description as long as the overall fee amount is not exceeded.

This Agreement is a cost plus contract based on the rates and multiplier as presented in the original agreement, with a guaranteed maximum cost to the City of Enid of twelve million, ninety eight thousand, one hundred and seventy dollars (\$12,098,170.00) for the additional work described in Article I. The City of Enid retains any savings below the twelve million, ninety eight thousand, one hundred and seventy dollars (\$12,098,170.00) guaranteed maximum price.

The Engineer, following any billing period in which services have been rendered, will prepare billing. Payments are to be made within thirty (30) days. Billing periods shall be monthly. If any payment due to the Engineer under this agreement is not received within sixty (60) days from date of invoice, the Engineer may elect to suspend services under this agreement without penalty or liquidated damages assessed from the City. Any unused portion of the fee, due to delays beyond the Engineer's control, will be increased by an amount agreed to by the City and Engineer for remaining work to be performed after January 1, 2020.



This Agreement may be executed in two (2) or more counterparts each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.

I. DESCRIPTION OF THE PROJECT

The Program Manager (PM) will provide oversight of the Program and support activities necessary to plan, design, deliver and construct the proposed Program's planned improvements listed below.

II. SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED - PHASE 3

The services listed below are considered the general responsibilities of the PM and City.

A. Program Administration

1. Objective:

The PM will provide qualified individuals to administer professional and technical services including planning, coordinating, scheduling, directing, and controlling program activities through FINAL (100%) DESIGN (Phase 3).

2. PM Responsibilities:

- a. Update Program Strategy Manual –The Program Strategy Manual (PSM) describes the concepts, processes, and procedures used to manage and control the Program. Revisions to the PSM will be made based on management decisions and adjustments made in Phase 2.
- b. PM will prepare for and lead a Phase 3 Program Kickoff Meeting. Kickoff Meeting will identify the major components of PM's work with anticipated deliverable dates. Kickoff Meeting will define the function of future anticipated workshops with City, Final Design Consultants (FDCs), Permitting Agencies, and Stakeholders. Kickoff Meeting is anticipated to last one (1) normal working day.
- c. Supplemental Environmental Services PM will continue the ongoing coordination with the US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) regarding the Program permitting, and environmental assessment. While some components of the permit process may require input and information from FDCs, the PM will remain the primary point of contact with USACE. All submissions as approved by the City will come from the PM to USACE.

- i. Environmental Permitting Assistance PM will provide continued coordination with the USACE on the Section 408, 404, and Nationwide permits initiated during Phase 2. The Section 404 permit application will be prepared upon completion of the NEPA process, obtaining 408 permission, and completion of required design plans. All Section 404 permits require an accompanying water quality certification (Section 401 of the Clean Water Act). All of the Nationwide Permits (NWP) issued by the Tulsa District have Section 401 water quality certification included. The ODEQ has programmatically issued this for all NWPs. However, this ODEQ certification does not apply to tribal lands; therefore, the PM will need to obtain an individual certification from EPA. Application will be made for the NWP 12 to cover all Program activities.
- ii. Assist with the Section 408 Permission and Real Estate Agreement with US Army Corps of Engineers Continued coordination with the USACE on the Section 408 permission, real estate agreement, and storage contract. PM will coordinate with the Intake FDC to obtain 60% plans and the other required technical documentation for the Section 408 permission. The required information will be submitted to USACE for review and approval as soon as the NEPA document is approved. PM will also coordinate with the USACE Real Estate branch to assemble the needed information for the real estate agreement. This information will be submitted for USACE review and approval as soon as the Section 408 and Section 404 permits are completed.
- d. Coordinate and Participate in Stakeholder/Public Meetings PM will provide assistance to City in preparing and participating in up to six (6) stakeholder/public meetings. PM will prepare and deliver presentations as needed to various stakeholders. Assistance will be given with public outreach and communication such as additional video interviews and public information sessions. Continued assistance with various tribal entities as needed.
- e. Provide Funding Agency and Grant Coordination PM will assist City in discussions with funding agencies and financial advisors with regards to cost and schedule. As part of the overall funding strategy, PM will research, review, and recommend grants appropriate to specific projects within the Program. Assist with preparation of grant proposal packages (including WIFIA), integration of grant awards into PMIS and grant administration and execution.
- f. Participate in Regional Partnering Discussions PM will provide assistance to City in discussions with potential regional partners as to the feasibility and impacts associated with adding partners to the pipeline from Kaw Lake.

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- g. PM will prepare for and participate in up to fourteen (14) monthly Program team meetings with City staff and report program progress, develop action items, and path forward expectations.
- h. PM will prepare for and participate in up to six (6) quarterly progress updates to City Commission. Program-level status updates will be provided to the Commission through Study Sessions, Small Groups, and Commission Meetings.

3. City Responsibilities:

- a. Provide staff as needed to be involved in each aspect of the Program.
- b. Fulfill data request from PM.

B. Project Controls and Reporting

1. Objective:

The PM will provide data, projections, and reports that are needed in order to make financial and scheduling decisions about the Program.

2. PM Responsibilities:

- a. Update Program Controls, Monitoring, and Reporting Program controls, monitoring, and reporting will be scaled-up to meet the needs of managing the FDCs. Current processes will be reviewed, scaled, and adjusted as necessary and will be documented in the PSM and the DCSM as appropriate. Up to fifteen (15) monthly meetings will be held with the City to review progress.
- b. Purchase, Setup and Oversight of PMIS ProjectMates will be utilized as the Program Management Information System (PMIS) to integrate communications, manage design teams, documentation, controls, schedule, costs, work changes, and reporting for the Program. Input from the City will be needed to set appropriate parameters, workflows, communication processes and desired reporting. Implementation and internal team training as well as testing of the functions will be done prior to FDC selection. PM will provide oversight of PMIS for FDCs.
- c. Program Document Control Utilizing the PMIS, the PM will oversee all Program-related documents, submittals, RFIs, transmittals and file transfers from all internal as well as external team members. The PM will provide instruction to the FDCs in the use of the PMIS as well as oversight of its use.
- d. Refine Program Schedule The Program schedule will be further detailed and maintained by PM for consistent coordination, engineering and environmental, permitting, and land acquisition progress. The PM will work

with each of the FDCs to incorporate regular schedule updates into the Integrated Master Schedule (IMS). The IMS will be used to forecast the completion of each contract and track the overall Program progress. The Program schedule will be a key component to support the coordination of multiple design teams whose individual designs will have effect on the overall Program design. Schedule, track, monitor, and update status of major Program activities. PM will establish Program oversight controls to maintain internal team progress with execution of the Scope of Services and Schedule. The IMS will be utilized to aid in the following tasks:

- Evaluate physical progress of various activities versus schedule progress and report significant variances.
- Establish recovery plans for activities that may fall behind schedule, or are interfered with by additional scope items.
- e. Prepare and issue up to fifteen (15) monthly status reports summarizing activities, schedules, and expenditures. The progress reports will be made available for elected official and public review as appropriate. The progress reports shall include updates on project budgets, schedules (for both Phase 3 services as well as the Program through completion), milestones, and deliverables. PM will provide hardcopies of monthly progress reports in addition to digital copies in PDF format.
- Coordinate and make recommendations to City to resolve issues that will impact program schedule and budget if not otherwise adjusted.

3. City Responsibilities:

- Inform the PM of Project schedule and scope changes beyond PM's control.
- Review and respond to PM recommendations to resolve issues that will impact Program schedule and budget if not otherwise adjusted.

C. Land Acquisition

Objective:

The PM's Land Acquisition Consultant (LAC) will provide and coordinate property acquisition services, including valuation, informing property owners of the City's intent and property owner rights, negotiations with property owners, and securing easements.

2. PM Responsibilities:

a. General – The Phase 2 pipeline alignment will be used as the basis of acquisition. There are approximately 240 parcels along the engineered Pipeline Alignment covering nearly 70 miles in Garfield, Noble, Kay and Osage counties. The LAC will provide Program related land acquisition

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services during Phase 3 and attend regular progress meetings when requested.

- b. Establishment of Fair Market Value The establishment of Fair Market Value will be accomplished by obtaining an Appraisal performed by a State Licensed Certified General Appraiser. All appraisals and valuations will be reviewed and approved by the City. Values used in Appraisals will follow a Master Addenda and Market Study of comparable sales for each county. Formal appraisals are not anticipated for every parcel. Upon approval, the LAC will prepare an Offer Letter for the City's representative's signature.
- c. Establishing Ownership Interest/Property Rights to be Acquired LAC will prepare title reports and Limited Title Certificates (LTCs) based on research from public records in the Office of the County Clerk for each county along with copies of all recorded documents and/or notation of known unrecorded transfers of ownership of property during a period of not less than five (5) years.
- d. The LAC will assist with the acquisition of temporary and permanent pipeline easements by communicating offers to the private property owners and facilitating fair and equitable negotiations. The LAC will serve as the primary point of contact with the private property owners during the land acquisition.
- e. Acquire Easements from Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) and Sovereign Indian Lands – LAC will assist in the acquisition of BIA/Tribal Lands easements which will include coordination for right of way applications, secure a statement of work outlining the requirements for the BIA, and preparation of offer letters.
- f. Exhausted Negotiations Property Rights Brochure will be provided to all owners upon presentation of the offer. Once the efforts in the acquisition process have been exhausted and the City has determined that reasonable negotiation has failed, the responsibility for the acquisition will be transferred to the City of Enid Legal Department.

3. City Responsibilities:

- Review and approval of all easement offer letters prior to delivery to the private property owners.
- All costs associated with land purchase and damages to be paid to the property owners.
- All actions associated with court actions as needed.

D. Design Consultant Management

1. Objective:

PM will provide oversight and management of the FDCs associated with the final design of the planned infrastructure for the Program.

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2. PM Responsibilities:

- a. Provide Design Consultant Selection Support The FDCs will be selected to perform the Final Design for the Program elements. PM will work with the City to develop FDC selection and contract packages (anticipating six (6) to eight (8) FDCs) to include such items as request for qualifications, communication protocols, selection matrices, selection support, scope of services, any prequalification, contract documents, and special conditions. PM will assist City in the review of submitted packages, reference checks and provide recommendations for selection. After selections, PM will coordinate with FDCs to provide proper contract execution including compliance with insurance requirements.
- b. Manage and Oversee FDCs PM will oversee the execution of FDC's work, adherence to Program schedule, compliance with contractual requirements and interface management. The PM will oversee the documentation necessary for design and review the design for compliance with the contract. PM will provide consistent application of project design intent and conformance to procedures outlined in the Design Consultant Standards Manual (DCSM). PM will revise and distribute DCSM as needed with approval from City. PM will review change requests and recommendations proposed from FDCs regarding deviations from the original design intent and provide feedback to City. Monthly progress meetings, estimated at twelve (12) per FDC, in addition to 60% complete and 90% complete milestone review meetings will be held with each of the FDCs as well as interface management meetings to provide consistent design and risk mitigation at critical interface points.
- c. Final Design Geotechnical Investigations PM will oversee the FDCs as they perform final design geotechnical investigations as needed. Additional geotechnical investigations are anticipated at the intake site, along the pipeline, and at the water treatment plant. The final design geotechnical investigations will evaluate the existing geotechnical results with respect to the final design and provide final recommendations for cut, fill, in situ materials, and soil resistivity.

3. City Responsibilities:

- Execute and fund the design contracts with the FDCs.
- b. Require the FDCs to comply with the DCSM.
- Provide timely review and comment on all intermediate and final (100% complete) design submittals.

E. Final Design Support

1. Objective:

PM will support the development of the final plans by providing miscellaneous services needed for design of the planned infrastructure for the Program.

2. PM Responsibilities:

- a. Preliminary (30% Complete) Design Update Preliminary engineering (30% Design), as scoped in Phase 2, delivered a complete 30% design for the full-build-out of the Program. The PM will update the 30% Design to reflect the Phasing decisions that were approved by the City. Generally, these decisions resulted in value engineering and capacity deferrals that require adjustment to a majority of infrastructure design. This will deliver a 30% Design package suitable as a basis for final design by the FDCs.
- b. Topographic Survey PM will provide field survey data for final design of the pipeline. PM will utilize radial topography methods, at intervals and for distances as appropriate for the intended use. Surveys will provide ground elevation profiles and assist to locate facilities. The data collected from field surveys will convey existing ground surfaces, buildings, and other structures, streets, drainage features, trees over eight inches in diameter, visible utilities as well as those underground utilities marked by their owners and/or representatives, and any other pertinent topographic features that may be present along the pipeline. PM will establish control points for use during the next phase of the Program.
- c. Perform Final Design of Common Elements PM will be responsible for final design of certain elements that have common interfaces, equipment, and/or use. The purpose is to provide uniformity in selected equipment and implementation across the entire Program. The PM will perform design services for the following common elements: valves, meters, generators, site security, corrosion mitigation, pumps, system hydraulics, and SCADA improvements.
- d. Application Engineering PM will develop the control logic and system architecture necessary for automation, monitoring, and control of the Program infrastructure. PM will also serve as the Program-wide integrator to manage the interfaces of the monitoring and controlled components of the Program. PM will be required to coordinate with each of the FDCs to capture application engineering concepts and planned design to provide for a holistic Program-wide complete control scheme.

3. City Responsibilities:

 Respond to requests from PM regarding final (100% complete) design information and data needs

- Participate in key Program decisions that may occur.
- Provide timely review and comment on all intermediate and final (100% complete) design submittals.

F. Update Phase 4 Projects with Funding Profile and Schedule

Objective:

PM will update the integrated schedule profiling Program costs from the beginning of Phase 4 services through Program Implementation.

2. PM Responsibilities:

- a. PM will incorporate the Integrated Master Program Schedule to identify major purchasing events and milestones for the Program. The Funding Profile will reflect Program cost associated with storage rights, design services, environmental services, land purchases, financial fees, construction project(s), construction phase engineering services, and commissioning engineering services. The Funding Profile will form the basis for financial planning with Financial Advisors, Bond Counsel, and City Management.
- b. PM will refine the Operational and Maintenance (O&M) profile and schedule based on anticipated demand. The O&M profile will reflect the anticipated costs on an annual basis associated with the newly constructed facilities and account for existing facilities that have been decommissioned as part of this program. The O&M costs are anticipated to include: labor, materials, power, repair, equipment maintenance, etc.

III. EXTRA WORK/ADDITIONAL SERVICES

For work not specifically described or included within this Scope of Services, Additional Services will be as directed by the City in writing for an additional fee as agreed upon by the City and PM.

SUBJECT:

APPROVE THE THIRD AMENDMENT TO THE MANAGEMENT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF ENID AND GLOBAL SPECTRUM, L.P.

BACKGROUND:

The City operates Meadowlake Golf Course, which includes a snack bar that has traditionally included low-point beer in its sales. Starting October 1, 2018, all beer is classified as alcoholic beverage and the sale of alcohol by the City is prohibited by the Constitution and state statute. The options for continuing the sale of beer is to obtain a license from the ABLE Commission in the name of Enid Municipal Authority or contract with a third-party for the sale of alcoholic beverages.

This item, if approved, would add the management of the Meadowlake Golf Course snack bar to Global Spectrum's responsibilities. The amendment provides that Global Spectrum will receive 7.5% of the gross sales of food and beverage at the golf course.

THIRD AMENDMENT TO MANAGEMENT AGREEMENT

This Third Amendment to the Management Agreement (this "Third Amendment") is entered into on the _____day of ______, 2018 ("Amendment Effective Date") between the City of Enid, Oklahoma ("City") and Global Spectrum, L.P., a Delaware limited partnership ("Manager").

WHEREAS, the City and Manager are parties to a Management Agreement dated August 1, 2009 ("Original Agreement"), which was subsequently amended by a First Amendment to the Management Agreement dated October 19, 2010 ("First Amendment"), pursuant to which the Manager is managing and operating the Cherokee Strip Conference Center (the "Conference Center") and providing certain services with respect to the Enid Convention and Visitors Bureau ("CVB Services") and which was subsequently amended by a Second Amendment dated July 17, 2012 ("Second Amendment") which added to Manager's management duties Convention Hall and Central National Bank Center (the Original Agreement, as amended by such First Amendment and Second Amendment, is referred to herein as the "Agreement");

WHEREAS, the City operates Meadowlake Golf Course (the "Course"), and , as part of the services provided to the residents that play golf at the course, the City has sold low point beer to patrons from the snack bar at the Course ("Snack Bar");

WHEREAS, changes to the State of Oklahoma's Regulation of the liquor industry are going into effect October 1, 2018 which, among other things, will classify beer as alcoholic beverages and, as a result, , the City no longer desires to sell beer from the Snack Bar or otherwise at the Course and instead desires that Manager do so;

WHEREAS, the City and the Manager now desire to amend the Agreement to provide that the Manager shall manage and operate the food and beverage services at the Snack Bar.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and premises contained herein and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties, intending to be legally bound, do hereby agree as follows:

- 1. Capitalized terms used herein and not defined herein shall have the meanings given to such terms in the Agreement.
 - 2. A new Section 2.1(d) is added to the Agreement, as follows:
 - "(c) Subject to Section 2.2 below, in addition to the services described in the Agreement, Manager shall provide food and beverage service (non-alcoholic beverages and alcoholic beverages) from the Snack Bar ("Snack Bar Services"). The Snack Bar is located in the northeast corner of the Course's clubhouse. The Snack Bar shall be staffed with part-time employees of Manager, at the cost of the City. All costs of utilities, equipment, capital improvements, insurance, etc. related to the Course (including the Snack Bar) shall be paid by the City.

3. A new Section 3.5 is added to the Agreement, as follows:

"Incentive Fee. To compensate for the Snack Bar Services, the Manager shall be entitled to receive a Meadowlake Golf Course Incentive Fee for each full or partial Operating Year of the term. The Incentive Fee shall be equal to seven and a half percent (7.5%) of all gross revenue from food and beverage sales at the Snack Bar. The Incentive Fee shall be paid to Manager by the City no later than ninety (90) days following the end of each Operating Year."

- 4. All costs related to the provision of the Snack Bar Services (including without limitation labor costs, costs of goods, cost of obtaining and maintaining the alcohol licenses/permits, insurance costs, maintenance costs, and other related costs) shall be funded by the City pursuant to a "Snack Bar Budget" (which shall be separate and distinct from the Operating Budget and CVB Services Budget) to be developed each year by Manager, subject to the approval of the City. The establishment and approval process for the Snack Bar Budget shall be the same process as that in place for the Operating Budget, as described in Sections 7.1 and 7.2 of the Agreement. The Snack Bar Budget for the remainder of the 2018-19 Operating Year shall be developed by Manager within 60 days after this Amendment is fully executed.
- 5. Manager shall establish a separate account in the name of the City and under the City's Federal ID number entitled the "Snack Bar Operating Account", or something similar, into which the City shall fund expenses related to the Snack Bar operation pursuant to the Snack Bar Budget. Funding of the Snack Bar Operating Account shall be under the same process as that in place for the Operating Account, as described in Section 9.1 and 9.2 of the Agreement, except that the parties recognize that, at least initially, little revenue will be generated by the Snack Bar services so all amounts required to be funded into the Snack Bar Operating Account will be deposited on a monthly basis into such account by the City. The parties acknowledge that in the future, there is intended to be sufficient revenue generated by Manager's performance of the Snack Bar services to pay for Snack Bar expenses, and Manager shall deposit such revenue into the Snack Bar Operating Account to pay Snack Bar expenses as they become due. Manager shall have the right to access such account and withdraw such funds to pay for expenses related to the Snack Bar services. In no event will Manager have any risk of operating losses from its provision of the Snack Bar Services; the City shall fund all such losses.
- 6. Manager shall keep and maintain, at its offices in the Facility, separate and independent records regarding its activities related to the Snack Bar Services. The City or its authorized agent shall have the right to audit and inspect such records from time to time during the Term, upon reasonable notice to Manager and during Manager's ordinary business hours. Manager agrees to provide to the City, within thirty (30) days after the end of each month during the Term, a statement of revenues and expenditures for such month and year to date related to Manager's provision of the Snack Bar Services, in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Additionally, Manager shall submit to the City, or shall cause the applicable public depository utilized by Manager to submit to the City, on a monthly basis, copies of all bank statements concerning the Snack Bar Operating Account.
 - 7. For the sake of clarity, the parties acknowledge and agree that the

Operating Budget, as such term is used in the Agreement, shall not include revenue and expenses from the CVB Services or Snack Bar Services, and the terms "Revenue", "Operating Expenses", "Net Operating Loss" and "Net Operating Profit" shall not pertain to, and shall exclude, all revenue and expenses from the CVB Services and Snack Bar Services. As such, the Incentive Fee, as described in Section 3.2 of the Agreement, shall not be calculated in any part on the revenues and expenses related to the CVB Services or Snack Bar Services.

- 8. Manager shall seek to obtain all necessary alcohol licenses/permits to be able to legally sell alcohol from the Snack Bar, the costs of which shall be operating expenses of the Snack Bar operation to be funded by the City. The City shall assist Manager in obtaining such licenses/permits. If for any reason Manager is unable to obtain and maintain such licenses/permits, this Agreement shall terminate without liability to either party.
- 8. Except for the modifications specifically set forth above, all of the provisions of the Agreement shall remain unmodified and in full force and effect, including without limitation all of the provisions contained in the First Amendment and Second Amendment. All reference to the Agreement in the Agreement or in any other document referencing the Agreement shall be deemed to refer to the Agreement as amended hereby.
- 9. This Amendment shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Oklahoma, without regard to conflicts of law.







BACKGROUND:

The City of Enid, as an entitlement community for receipt of Community Developemnt Block Grant (CDBG) funding, received a 2018 allocation of \$418,584.00. Booker T. Washington Community Center was allocated \$20,929.33 to assist with the afterschool youth program; CDSA was allocated \$71,922.00 to assist with its homeless prevention activities in the form of emergency repairs, barrier removal and delivery of HOME activities. Making a Difference Inc. was allocated \$20,929.33 for its afterschool program; and Zoe Kids' Café was allocated \$20,929.33 for its afterschool youth program.

Funding was approved for each activity by the City Commission on June 5, 2018 as part of the Fiscal Year 2018 Community Development Block Grant funding process. These agencies and the funded activities further the goals of the City of Enid as submitted in the five year consolidated plan to address decent housing, redevelopment activities, and assist in the enhancement of public services activities.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT CONTRACT BETWEEN THE CITY OF ENID AND BOOKER T. WASHINGTON INC.

This Contract is made and entered into on this 2nd day of October 2018, by and between the City of Enid, Oklahoma, an Oklahoma Municipal Corporation, hereinafter called "City," and Booker T. Washington, Inc., an Oklahoma Non-Profit Corporation, hereinafter called "Subrecipient."

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the City manages certain Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds from the B-18-MC-40-0006 Housing and Urban Development (HUD) contract; and,

WHEREAS, Subrecipient has made application for grant funds in the amount of twenty thousand nine hundred twenty nine dollars and 33/100 cents (\$20,929.33); and,

WHEREAS, the City has reviewed Subrecipient's plan to provide tutoring, recreational and nutritional services for the After School Program at the Booker T. Washington; and,

WHEREAS, the City has approved Subrecipient's grant application, finding a proper public purpose for the use of the funds as described in Subrecipient's plan.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants, and conditions herein stated and in consideration of the mutual benefits, which will accrue to the parties, the receipt and sufficiency of which is acknowledged by the parties, the parties agree as follows:

1. Statement of Work:

- A. <u>Engagement of Subrecipient</u>. The City hereby engages Subrecipient for Subrecipient to provide reimbursement for the After School Program at the Booker T. Washington for the benefit of the residents of the City of Enid. Subrecipient accepts such engagement pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth herein.
- B. <u>Purpose</u>. The purpose of this Contract is to state the terms, conditions and mutual understanding of the parties as to the manner in which the Subrecipient will receive and use CDBG funds.
- C. <u>Scope of Engagement</u>. Subrecipient shall provide an After School Program, including tutoring and recreational activities for youth, through Booker T. Washington, which is located in a designated Low/Moderate Income Census Tract with the City of Enid, Oklahoma, and serves very low, low and moderate income families of the city for one year from the date of execution of this Contract. Approved expenditures are those directly related to youth in the after school program. Activities include: Transportation fees and cost, insurance, utilities, equipment purchases, supplies, activity fees paid to third party and project delivery costs which includes payments for services proved directly to the program.

Administration costs are not to exceed 20% of the grant allocation. \$4,185.57

Total project cost is estimated at \$80,000.00 however; CDBG will only pay actual expenditures not to exceed \$20,929.33.

Such scope of services ("services") shall include the following:

- 1) Ensure recognition of the CDBG funding source for this project in all publication and promotional materials.
- 2) Ensure that, to the greatest extent feasible, opportunities for training and employment arising in connection with this project will be extended to lower income project area residents.
- 3) To the greatest extent feasible, utilize business concerns located in, or substantially owned by residents of, the project area, in the award of subcontracts and the purchase of services and supplies.

The Agency certifies that the activity carried out under this Agreement will meet National Objective #1 and provide accessible, affordable after-school programming to a minimum of forty (40) children from low-moderate income families who are Enid residents during FY 2018-19.

The Agency will determine client eligibility by requiring self-reported income certification on membership forms.

- D. <u>Term.</u> This contract shall be effective for one year from the date of execution, and all work required under this Contract shall be completed within that time.
- E. <u>Grant Funds Approved</u>. City shall provide grant funding in the amount of actual expenditures not to exceed twenty thousand nine hundred twenty nine dollars and 33/100 cents (\$20,929.33) from the B-18-MC-40-0006 HUD contract funding allocation under Public Services to administer the After School Program.
- F. <u>Payment to Subrecipient</u>. Subrecipient shall submit either an invoice requesting reimbursement for allowable expenses, or an original invoice for which the City will pay the vendor directly. All vendors must be approved and have a completed Form W-9, Canvass of Bids and a Non-Collusion Affidavit to accompany the

contractors bid. All expenditures must follow the City of Enid Procurement Policies and Procedures. Expenditures require a minimum of three (3) bids/quotes. Invoices require a "Claim or Invoice Affidavit" attached. The invoice submission will be reviewed for payment by the CDBG Director, City Manager and Chief Financial Officer and will be submitted for payment approval at a regularly scheduled meeting of the Mayor and Board of Commissioners after receipt of invoice, and if approved, will be paid within five (5) business days following the meeting. Invoices and supporting documents must be submitted fifteen (15) days prior to the scheduled City Commission meeting for review and processing procedures, otherwise, it will be submitted for approval at the following Mayor and Board of Commissioners regularly scheduled meeting. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT CONTRACT BETWEEN THE CITY OF ENID AND ZOE LIFE CHURCH/ZOE KIDS CAFE.

Emergency Repairs and Barrier Removal costs to prevent homelessness in the amount of \$57,538.00 and HOME delivery costs not to exceed \$14,384.00. The entire allocation of \$71,922.00 may be used for emergency repairs and barrier removal, the cap of 20% applies to HOME delivery charges.
- F. Payment to Subrecipient. Subrecipient shall submit either an invoice requesting reimbursement for allowable expenses, or an original invoice for which the City will pay the vendor directly. The submission will be reviewed for payment at a regularly scheduled meeting of the Mayor and Board of Commissioners after receipt of invoice, and if approved, will be paid within five (5) business days following the meeting. Invoices, affidavits, accomplishment reports and all other supporting documents must be submitted two weeks prior to City Council meeting for processing. City shall not be responsible for any late fees incurred and will not reimburse Subrecipient for any late fees paid. Payments are made only from monies available to the City through the CDBG Program and are subject to the availability of such funds.
- G. <u>Timeliness</u>. Funds not expended within twelve (12) months of the date of execution of this Contract shall be considered for extension only upon written request of Subrecipient and approval by CDBG staff. CDBG staff reserves the right to reallocate any unexpended funds, and the extension of funds is in the sole discretion of CDBG staff.

2. Records and Reports:

- A. Maintain sufficient records to enable the City and HUD to determine whether program objectives are being met as described in 24 CFR §§ 570.506 and 570.507, which are incorporated hereby as if fully setout herein.
- B. Provide City with quarterly accomplishment reports for the duration of the project, but no less than twelve (12) months. Such reports shall be on a form provided by the City and shall include, at a minimum, program usage, number of participants, and expenditures and shall be due to the City CDBG Office on or before the 10th day of each month following each quarter. Reports are due even on months with no activity or expenditures beginning the date of this contract and ending when contract expires. The final report and invoice is due on or before the 10th day following the expiration of this contract.
- C. Retain all books, documents, papers, records and other materials involving all activities and transactions related to this Contract for at least five (5) years from the date of submission of the final activity report, or until all audit findings have been resolved, whichever is later. Permit representatives of the City and HUD to have full access to and the right to fully examine all such material.
- D. The City shall have the right to inspect and audit any and all records related to this Project or to the qualification of the Subrecipient for this Grant at any reasonable time.
- 3. <u>Program Income</u>: In accordance with 24 CFR § 570.504(c), any program income, as defined in 24 CFR § 570.500, received by Subrecipient shall be returned to the City.
- 4. Uniform Administrative Requirements:
 - A. Subrecipient shall comply with the requirements and standards of OMB Circular No. A-122, "Cost Principles for Non-profit Organizations," which is incorporated hereby as if fully setout herein.
 - B. Subrecipient shall comply with the requirements and standards of OMB Circular No. A-133, "Audits of States, Local Governments, and Non-Profit Organizations," which is incorporated hereby as if fully setout herein. Audits shall be conducted annually.
 - C. Subrecipient shall comply with the requirements and standards of OMB Circular A-110, as implemented at 24 CFR Part 84, "Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grants and Agreements With Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals and Other Non-Profit Organizations" or the related CDBG provision, as specified in § 570.502(b), which is incorporated hereby as if fully setout herein.
- 5. Other Program Requirements:

- A. Subrecipient shall comply with the requirements of 24 CFR Part 570, Subpart K, which is incorporated hereby as if fully setout herein, except:
 - 1) The City's responsibilities described at 24 CFR § 57-.604; and
 - 2) The City's responsibilities under the provisions of 24 CFR Part 52.
- B. Subrecipient shall comply with the Single Audit Act of 1984, 31 USC § 7501, *et seq.*, which is incorporated hereby as if fully setout herein. Subrecipient shall, in a timely manner, provide the City with copies of reports on any audits that include funds received from City. In the event an audit results in the determination that Subrecipient has expended contract funds on unallowable costs, Subrecipient shall immediately reimburse the City in full for all such costs. Subrecipient shall be exempt from this Act if expending less than five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.00) per year in federal funds, but records must be available for review and/or audit by appropriate officials of federal agencies, pass-through entities such as the City, and the General Accounting Office (GAO).
- C. Conditions for Religious Organizations. Subrecipient agrees that funds provided under this Contract shall not be utilized for religious activities, to promote religious interest, or for the benefit of any religious organization, in accordance with 24 CFR § 570.200(j), which is incorporated hereby as if fully setout herein.
- D. No employee, officer or agent shall participate in the selection, award or administration of a Contract supported by federal funds if a real or apparent conflict of interest might arise. Subrecipient shall comply with all regulations regarding contracting, procurement and conflict of interest, as set forth in 24 CFR Part 84, Subpart C; 24 CFR Part 85, Subpart C; and 24 CFR 570.611, all of which are incorporated hereby as if fully setout herein.
- E. Subrecipient shall comply with the provisions of Section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968, as amended, and as implemented by the regulations set forth in 24 CFR Part 135, which is incorporated hereby as if fully setout herein.
- F. Subrecipient shall comply with the provisions of the Davis-Bacon Prevailing Wage Act.

6. Suspension and Termination:

- A. This agreement may be terminated or suspended, in whole or in part, by written consent of the parties.
- B. Upon default by Subrecipient, City may:
 - 1) Temporarily withhold payments pending correction of the deficiency by Subrecipient; and

- 2) Disallow all or part of the cost of the activity or action not in compliance; and
- 3) Suspend or terminate, in whole or in part, this Contract; and
- 4) Require Subrecipient to return funds to the City and/or disqualify Subrecipient from future funding; and
- 5) Take any other legally available remedy.
- C. In the event of termination or suspension, all materials and/or equipment purchased under this Contract shall, at the option of the City, become the property of the City, and Subrecipient shall be entitled to payment for otherwise valid and allowable obligations which were incurred in good faith prior to notice of such action. This option of the City constitutes a security interest in any materials and/or equipment purchased or property improved by expenditure of funds under this Contract for as long as such materials and/or equipments or improvements have any value, unless the City declines its option or releases its security interest.
- 7. Reversion of Assets: At the time this Contract expires, all CDBG funds on hand at the time of expiration, if any, including accounts receivable, shall be transferred to the City. Additionally, any real property acquired or improved, in whole or in part, by CDBG funds in excess of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00) shall, for five (5) years following the expiration of this Contract, continue to be used to meet the national objectives outlined in 24 CFR § 570.208, which is incorporated hereby as if fully setout herein.

8. General:

A. Duties of the City.

- 1) Upon request by Subrecipient, CDBG staff will provide technical assistance, including, but not limited to, preparation and review of the work write-up and cost estimates.
- 2) CDBG Staff may perform periodic site visits to ascertain that the contracted services are proceeding properly and in a satisfactory manner.
- Mediate in the event of a dispute between Subrecipient and any contractor in the event of dissatisfaction of work performed by a contractor.
- B. <u>Compliance with Laws</u>. Subrecipient shall conduct its business under the terms of this Contract in such a manner that it does not violate Federal, State, or local laws or regulations applicable to the conduct of its operations under the terms of

this contract. Funding provided under this Contract shall be conditioned upon Subrecipient's compliance with all applicable laws and regulations.

C. <u>Insurance</u>. Until the work is complete, Subrecipient shall carry sufficient insurance coverage to protect Contract assets from loss due to theft, fraud and/or undue physical damage.

D. Indemnification and Hold Harmless.

- Subrecipient shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the City and any and all officers, agents and employees of the City, against all damages, including but not limited to, any loss, liability, expense, suit, or claim for injury to persons or damages to property arising out of the activities of Subrecipient, its employees and agents under or in connection with this Contract, whether or not any act or omission complained of is authorized, allowed or prohibited by Subrecipient and all reasonable expenses together with all damages and penalties thereto. Expenses shall include, without limitation, all out-of-pocket expenses, attorney's fees, witness fees, and discovery costs.
- Subrecipient shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the City and any and all officers, agents and employees of the City, from any claim or amount recovered as a result of infringement of patent, trademark or copyright, or from any claim or amounts arising or recovered under Workers' Compensation or any other laws.

E. Integration and Amendments.

- 1) This Contract constitutes the entire agreement between the parties. There are no other agreements, representations or warranties, whether oral or written, regarding the subject matter of this Contract.
- 2) This Contract is subject to such modification as may be required by federal law or regulations. Any such modification may be done unilaterally by the City.
- In the event the parties fail to agree on changes or interpretations of this Contract, the decision of the City shall prevail. No course of dealings involving the parties hereto and no usage of trade shall be relevant or admissible to interpret, supplement, explain or in any way vary any of the terms expressly set forth in this Contract.
- 4) Except as otherwise provided in this Contract, the total grant award may be modified only by written agreement of all the parties to this Contract. Such modification shall be in the form of an amendment which specifically references this Contract.

- 5) Any amendment to this Contract shall be attached to this Contract and all of the terms in this Contract not addressed in the amendment shall remain in full force and effect.
- F. <u>Default.</u> Under this contract, default occurs when Subrecipient fails to keep, observe, or perform any material agreement, term, or provision of this Contract, including applicable laws and regulations, to be kept, observed, or performed by it
- Mon-Discrimination. The parties covenant (1) that no person shall be excluded from participation in, denied the benefit of, or otherwise subjected to discrimination under the terms of this Contract on the ground of race, color, age, sex, handicap, or national origin; and (2) that, in carrying out the terms and conditions of this Contract, no person shall be subjected to discrimination on the grounds of race, color, age, sex, handicap, or national origin.
- H. <u>Independent Status of Subrecipient</u>. Subrecipient is a separate, legal entity from the City and the parties make this Contract accordingly. All persons working for Subrecipient under this contract shall be employees of Subrecipient and shall not be considered employees of the City. The hiring, discharge, supervision, and management of the employees of Subrecipient who provide services under this contract, including, but not limited to, the determination from time to time of the qualifications of such Subrecipient employees who are required to perform the duties of Subrecipient, and the establishment, revision, and administration of wage scales, rates of compensation, conditions of employment, and job and position descriptions with respect to all such employees of Subrecipient hereunder shall be within the sole direction of Subrecipient.
- I. <u>Choice of Law.</u> Any action or proceeding seeking to enforce any provision of, or based on any right arising out of, this contract may be brought against any of the parties in the courts of the State of Oklahoma, County of Garfield, or, if it has or can acquire jurisdiction, in the United States District Court for the Western District of Oklahoma, and each of the parties consents to the jurisdiction of such courts (and of the appropriate appellate courts) in any such action or proceeding and waives any objection to venue laid therein.
- J. <u>Interpretation of Law</u>. This contract shall be deemed to have been made in the State of Oklahoma and shall be construed and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Oklahoma.
- K. <u>Notices</u>. Whenever notice is required to be given in writing, such notice shall be hand-delivered or mailed by certified mail, return receipt requested, and directed to the respective parties at the following addresses:

- L. <u>Assignment</u>. Neither party shall assign this contract or any interest herein without the express, written consent of the other party.
- M. <u>Construction</u>. Captions and other headings contained in this contract are for reference and identification purposes only and do not alter, modify, amend, limit, or restrict the contractual obligations of the parties.
- N. <u>Binding Effect</u>. This contract binds the parties and any successors and assigns of the parties.
- O. <u>Severability</u>. If any one or more of the sections, sentences, clauses, or parts be held invalid for any reason, the invalidity of such section, sentence, clause, or part shall not affect nor prejudice the applicability and validity of any other provision of this contract.
- P. <u>Third Party Beneficiaries</u>. Nothing in this contract, expressed or implied, is intended to confer upon any person other than the parties hereto and their respective assigns, any rights or remedies under or by reason of this Agreement, except as provided expressly herein.
- Q. Good Faith and Best Efforts. City and Subrecipient agree to perform obligations under this Contract in good faith and to use their respective best efforts to ensure that the each perform in a timely manner.
- R. <u>Employment Verification</u>. The City of Enid requires all grant subrecipents to verify that employees working pursuant to contracts with the City of Enid are legally authorized to work in the United States. Subrecipient agrees to verify and document the employment eligibility of all employees who may perform services pursuant to this Contract. Subrecipient also agrees to require all subcontractors who perform services under this Contract to verify and document the employment eligibility of all employees who may perform services pursuant to this Contract.
- S. Governmental Tort Claims Act. By entering into this Agreement, City and its "employees," as defined by the Governmental Tort Claims Act, 51 Okla. Stat. § 151 et seq., do not waive sovereign immunity, any defenses, or any limitations of

THIRD AMENDMENT TO MANAGEMENT AGREEMENT

This Third Amendment to the Management Agreement (this "Third Amendment") is entered into on the _____day of ______, 2018 ("Amendment Effective Date") between the City of Enid, Oklahoma ("City") and Global Spectrum, L.P., a Delaware limited partnership ("Manager").

WHEREAS, the City and Manager are parties to a Management Agreement dated August 1, 2009 ("Original Agreement"), which was subsequently amended by a First Amendment to the Management Agreement dated October 19, 2010 ("First Amendment"), pursuant to which the Manager is managing and operating the Cherokee Strip Conference Center (the "Conference Center") and providing certain services with respect to the Enid Convention and Visitors Bureau ("CVB Services") and which was subsequently amended by a Second Amendment dated July 17, 2012 ("Second Amendment") which added to Manager's management duties Convention Hall and Central National Bank Center (the Original Agreement, as amended by such First Amendment and Second Amendment, is referred to herein as the "Agreement");

WHEREAS, the City operates Meadowlake Golf Course (the "Course"), and , as part of the services provided to the residents that play golf at the course, the City has sold low point beer to patrons from the snack bar at the Course ("Snack Bar");

WHEREAS, changes to the State of Oklahoma's Regulation of the liquor industry are going into effect October 1, 2018 which, among other things, will classify beer as alcoholic beverages and, as a result, , the City no longer desires to sell beer from the Snack Bar or otherwise at the Course and instead desires that Manager do so;

WHEREAS, the City and the Manager now desire to amend the Agreement to provide that the Manager shall manage and operate the food and beverage services at the Snack Bar.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and premises contained herein and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties, intending to be legally bound, do hereby agree as follows:

- 1. Capitalized terms used herein and not defined herein shall have the meanings given to such terms in the Agreement.
 - 2. A new Section 2.1(d) is added to the Agreement, as follows:
 - "(c) Subject to Section 2.2 below, in addition to the services described in the Agreement, Manager shall provide food and beverage service (non-alcoholic beverages and alcoholic beverages) from the Snack Bar ("Snack Bar Services"). The Snack Bar is located in the northeast corner of the Course's clubhouse. The Snack Bar shall be staffed with part-time employees of Manager, at the cost of the City. All costs of utilities, equipment, capital improvements, insurance, etc. related to the Course (including the Snack Bar) shall be paid by the City.

3. A new Section 3.5 is added to the Agreement, as follows:

"Incentive Fee. To compensate for the Snack Bar Services, the Manager shall be entitled to receive a Meadowlake Golf Course Incentive Fee for each full or partial Operating Year of the term. The Incentive Fee shall be equal to seven and a half percent (7.5%) of all gross revenue from food and beverage sales at the Snack Bar. The Incentive Fee shall be paid to Manager by the City no later than ninety (90) days following the end of each Operating Year."

- 4. All costs related to the provision of the Snack Bar Services (including without limitation labor costs, costs of goods, cost of obtaining and maintaining the alcohol licenses/permits, insurance costs, maintenance costs, and other related costs) shall be funded by the City pursuant to a "Snack Bar Budget" (which shall be separate and distinct from the Operating Budget and CVB Services Budget) to be developed each year by Manager, subject to the approval of the City. The establishment and approval process for the Snack Bar Budget shall be the same process as that in place for the Operating Budget, as described in Sections 7.1 and 7.2 of the Agreement. The Snack Bar Budget for the remainder of the 2018-19 Operating Year shall be developed by Manager within 60 days after this Amendment is fully executed.
- 5. Manager shall establish a separate account in the name of the City and under the City's Federal ID number entitled the "Snack Bar Operating Account", or something similar, into which the City shall fund expenses related to the Snack Bar operation pursuant to the Snack Bar Budget. Funding of the Snack Bar Operating Account shall be under the same process as that in place for the Operating Account, as described in Section 9.1 and 9.2 of the Agreement, except that the parties recognize that, at least initially, little revenue will be generated by the Snack Bar services so all amounts required to be funded into the Snack Bar Operating Account will be deposited on a monthly basis into such account by the City. The parties acknowledge that in the future, there is intended to be sufficient revenue generated by Manager's performance of the Snack Bar services to pay for Snack Bar expenses, and Manager shall deposit such revenue into the Snack Bar Operating Account to pay Snack Bar expenses as they become due. Manager shall have the right to access such account and withdraw such funds to pay for expenses related to the Snack Bar services. In no event will Manager have any risk of operating losses from its provision of the Snack Bar Services; the City shall fund all such losses.
- 6. Manager shall keep and maintain, at its offices in the Facility, separate and independent records regarding its activities related to the Snack Bar Services. The City or its authorized agent shall have the right to audit and inspect such records from time to time during the Term, upon reasonable notice to Manager and during Manager's ordinary business hours. Manager agrees to provide to the City, within thirty (30) days after the end of each month during the Term, a statement of revenues and expenditures for such month and year to date related to Manager's provision of the Snack Bar Services, in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Additionally, Manager shall submit to the City, or shall cause the applicable public depository utilized by Manager to submit to the City, on a monthly basis, copies of all bank statements concerning the Snack Bar Operating Account.
 - 7. For the sake of clarity, the parties acknowledge and agree that the

Operating Budget, as such term is used in the Agreement, shall not include revenue and expenses from the CVB Services or Snack Bar Services, and the terms "Revenue", "Operating Expenses", "Net Operating Loss" and "Net Operating Profit" shall not pertain to, and shall exclude, all revenue and expenses from the CVB Services and Snack Bar Services. As such, the Incentive Fee, as described in Section 3.2 of the Agreement, shall not be calculated in any part on the revenues and expenses related to the CVB Services or Snack Bar Services.

- 8. Manager shall seek to obtain all necessary alcohol licenses/permits to be able to legally sell alcohol from the Snack Bar, the costs of which shall be operating expenses of the Snack Bar operation to be funded by the City. The City shall assist Manager in obtaining such licenses/permits. If for any reason Manager is unable to obtain and maintain such licenses/permits, this Agreement shall terminate without liability to either party.
- 8. Except for the modifications specifically set forth above, all of the provisions of the Agreement shall remain unmodified and in full force and effect, including without limitation all of the provisions contained in the First Amendment and Second Amendment. All reference to the Agreement in the Agreement or in any other document referencing the Agreement shall be deemed to refer to the Agreement as amended hereby.
- 9. This Amendment shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Oklahoma, without regard to conflicts of law.
