



Maximum Grade 11% Straight Grade, 17% with Vertical Curves (2" Per Foot), Minimum Grade 2% (1/4" Per Foot) to meet Maximum or Minimum Grade. 5' typ sidewalk location 1' Min. Varies -1.5% maximum - Top Curb Surface of driveway Note: Raise driveway to 7" minimum SECTION A-A above gutter elevations.





NOTES

- 1. The property owner is responsible for any adjustment to structures including, but not limited to, manholes and water valves.
- Concrete temperature may not exceed 90°F.
- 3. All sidewalk replacement must meet ADA requirements.
 4. Expansion material shall be bituminous fiber material or as approved by the
- 5. Contractor shall saw and remove barrier curb. If rollover curb exists, contractor
- may match back of curb or saw and replace rollover curb.

 6. Sidewalk shall be located 5 ft. behind the curb on new construction; or where
- appropriate to match existing conditions. 7. Driveway must be paved from street pavement to property line (or to existing sidewalk); with 3000# Portland Cement concrete.
- 8. A permit is required for making new curb opening and work on Right-of-Way.
