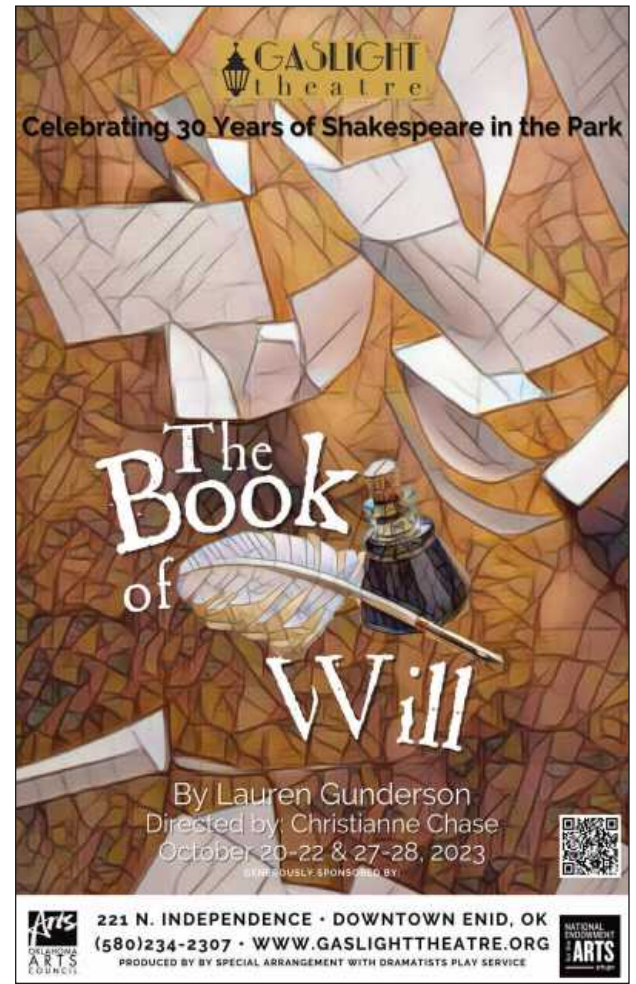
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Gaslight presents 'The Book of Will'

Length of prison sentences appealed for Proud Boys leaders convicted of Jan. 6 plot

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Justice Department is appealing the length of prison sentences for four Proud Boys leaders convicted of seditious conspiracy in the U.S. Capitol attack, challenging punishments that were significantly shorter than what prosecutors had recommended, according to court filings on Monday.

U.S. District Judge Timothy Kelly sentenced former Proud Boys national leader Enrique Tarrio and three lieutenants to prison terms ranging from 15 to 22 years after a jury convicted them in May of plotting to stop the peaceful transfer of presidential power from Donald Trump to Joe Biden after the 2020 presidential election.

Tarrio's 22-year sentence is the longest so far among hundreds of crim-

inal cases stemming from the Jan. 6, 2021, riot at the Capitol, but prosecutors had sought 33 years behind bars for the Miami man.

Prosecutors also had recommended sentences of 33 years for former Proud Boys organizer Joseph Biggs, of Ormond Beach, Florida; 30

years for Proud Boys chapter leader Zachary Rehl, of Philadelphia; and 27 years in prison for chapter leader Ethan Nordean, of Auburn, Washington.

Kelly sentenced Nordean to 18 years, Biggs to 17 years and Rehl to 15 years.

The top of the petition summary stated: "We are opposed to building the Garfield County-Skeleton Creek Solar project. Our top reasons for opposition are due to environmental hazards, fire hazards, decreased property values and permanent destruction of fertile crop ground."

The petition urged county and city leaders not to approve the NextEra project.

The NextEra Skeleton Creek project was designed to generate carbon emissions-free energy from a mix of wind, solar, battery storage, green hydrogen and other renewable sources.

NextEra has made an

investment of about \$12.9 billion in Oklahoma since 2003.

Initially, the Skeleton Creek project met with resistance in Garfield County because of the wind turbines, and their potential impact on Vance Air Force Base operations.

Those concerns potentially pitted two massive industries against each other: wind power, which accounts for about one-third of the state's energy production, and the military, which is the state's largest employer.

But, NextEra worked with the Air Force and Department of Defense, and the Air Force and

DoD eventually approved the plans, Mike Cooper, city of Enid military liaison, said.

Reese Wedel, chairman of the county commissioners, said they knew there was opposition to the project so they made plans for the meeting. Chairs circled the courtroom, and the jury area also was filled with those at the meeting.

"We are glad people showed up to voice their concerns," Wedel said. "This is a work in progress, so it is good to hear both sides."

A corporate spokesperson for NextEra could not be reached Monday for comment.
