Program Year 5 CAPER Executive Summary response:

This Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER) describes the activities undertaken during the program year beginning July 1, 2012 and ending June 30, 2013 using Federal funds granted to the City of Enid by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) under the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program. Activities and accomplishments described in this report primarily benefit low-income and moderate-income residents of the City of Enid, neighborhoods with high concentrations of low-income and moderate-income residents, and the city as a whole.

The City of Enid received a 2012 CDBG entitlement allocation of \$405,210.00. In addition to the entitlement funds, \$10,000.00 was available for allocation in program income and reallocated funds. Through the funding cycle all funds were allocated to programs that would further the goals of the consolidated plan and the CDBG program. Of the funds available, a total of \$415.210.00 was expended. Based on citizen participation, local needs expressed by numerous social services, housing, public transportation, the priorities, goals strategies, activities, and services contained in the plan were designed to improve overall livability, with the main objectives being Accessibility, Affordability and Sustainability.

Program Year 5 CAPER General Questions response:

1.) The City of Enid continues to implement the goals and objectives identified in the five-year consolidated plan to achieve development of a viable urban community. The City's CDBG entitlement for 2012 was \$405,210.00 was allocated along with \$10,000.00 in reallocated funds and program income available. In the 2012 Action Plan, projects were chosen based upon citizen input, statistical data and consultation with community based organizations, state agencies and city departments. The City identified fifteen projects in the areas of public facilities improvements, public service, housing, economic development, clearance activities, and administration that would be funded during the 2012-2013 program year. Along with the twelve identified projects, six from previous funding years remained open, and four were completed and closed at the end of this fiscal year. There were 25 projects completed this fiscal year. The table below shows a breakdown of activities open during the program year and those completed in the same period.

A summary of the objectives and activity goals proposed in the 2012 Action Plan include:

- 4RKids, Assisted 4RKids Foundation to purchase an ADA accessible field for ABC Park. 4RKids Foundation is partnering with local community organizations and the City of Enid to complete a fully ADA accessible park including the Miracle League Field located in a low/moderate census tract. The number that has benefited from the activity is well over 11,000 individuals.
- Junior Welfare League was provided assistance to complete ADA and code enforcement upgrades to their facility. 500 children were served with these funds.
- Sandbox Learning Center, a non-profit daycare in a low- and moderate income Census Tract 6, was funded to rehabilitate a restroom and ramp to outdoor playground to ensure Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliance. 105 children benefited from the building rehabilitation this year.
- EPTA received funding to assist low-income, elderly, frail and disabled with bus passes to attend medical appointments, shop for groceries, delivery to and from meal service sites and other social service sites. This program has served 10 individuals and the need continues to grow for transportation services.

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- YWCA was awarded funding to purchase appliances for their homeless shelter where 246 individuals were served during the program year.
- Booker T. Washington Community Center located in the QCT 6 received assistance to do interior building renovations to rehabilitate a restroom. This project is underway and a total of 792 individuals will benefit from the improvement.
- Booker T. Washington Community Center located in QCT 6 received funds to support the After School Tutoring program, which provides students free tutoring, mentoring and a meal. This project has been completed and a total of 114 individuals have benefited from this activity.
- Funds were awarded to CDSA to assist with the emergency repair and barrier removal program and for HOME deliver projects for owner occupied housing. This program has assisted 83 household members.
- Christmas in Action was awarded funding to assist with emergency repairs and barrier removal to repair or replace roofs for 34 low-moderate income households.

- Funds were allocated to the City's demolition assistance program. The program has assisted income-qualifying households with demolition of 49 dilapidated structures identified by the City's Code department.
- Debt service to the Section 108 loan assists with the purchase of the NOC campus in Enid, which provides education opportunities and employment for the community. Through this debt service 15 low/mod jobs will be provide to individuals. NOC is located in the QCT 15.
- Program Administration to provide salary, training, supplies, publication and information distribution expenses are allocated in the amount of \$70,000.

In addition to the activities funded in the 2012 program year, there were activities from previous funding years reporting accomplishments. Those activity expenditures and accomplishments included:

- EPTA-Bus shelter project located in QTC 1 and 7 and has expended B-10 funds in the amount \$1,467.50 and \$1,920.00 from the B-11 allocation to provide bus
- CDSA Housing- Emergency Repairs and Barrier Removal program expended B-11 funds in the amount of \$34,425.27 and a total of \$ 13,125.53 for HOME projects during the program year.
- Christmas In Action-Housing/Roof projects expended B-10 funds in the amount of \$3,364.00, completing the project. Christmas In Action also had expenditures in the amount of \$10,332.23 from their B-11 allocation for emergency repairs to replace roofs for 11 households.
- Debt service to the Section 108 loan was refinanced in 2010 and the lowered the regular annual payments. The loan assists with the purchase of the NOC campus in Enid, which provides education opportunities and employment for the community. NOC is located in the QCT 15. \$53,264.03 was expended from the B-10 line item and \$128,090.16 closing out the B-11 allocation.
- Demolition assistance was given to 22 low- and moderate-income households to remove dilapidated structures identified by code enforcement. The activity expended \$24,373.88 from B-10 funds and \$14,228.02 from the B-11 allocation.
- Sandbox Learning Center expended funds from B-11 in this program year in the amount of \$11,483.19, closing out their B-11 project.
- Booker T Washington expended funds in the amount of \$6,375.00 this program year from the B-11 allocation to replace doors at the facility.
- The First Church of the Nazarene expended \$37,034.15 from the B-11 allocation.
- Administration funds expended from B-09 were \$10,458.50 and the B-11 funds expended were in the amount of \$45,462.02.

All 2012 contracts were signed in October of 2012. Sub recipients were encouraged to expend funds by June 30, 2013, but are not required to expend all funds until contract expiration.

2.) During each program year, the City of Enid uses CDBG funds to assist with public facility improvements. Many of these construction improvements require compliance with Davis- Bacon Prevailing Wage requirements and other procurement policies and procedures. The sub recipient is required to meet with CDBG staff regarding wage requirements. The contractor selected for the project is also required to meet with

CDBG staff regarding Davis Bacon requirements. These meetings are in an effort to educate organizations and contractors of all federal requirements regarding prevailing wage. This also streamlines the approach by the CDBG office to resolve any confusion during the execution of the activity.

Applicants are also encouraged to attend the technical assistance workshop during the application period. During this workshop, CDBG staff will provide assistance to organizations interested in applying for CDBG funding and will be able to provided one-on-one assistance for all applicants. These efforts are in place to address obstacles in communication with subrecipients and contractors regarding local, state and federal compliance issues.

3.) One identified impediment to fair housing is the lack of access to information on fair housing. Many impediments to fair housing could be addressed through informed citizens. The CDBG Department promoted fair housing by distributing Fair Housing information ongoing throughout the year and during the Home Show at the Garfield County Exposition Center during Fair Housing Week in April and by announcing contact information on the City's website. The CDBG Department also distributes materials throughout the year to citizens and realtors as it becomes available.

By serving on the Metro Housing Commission, Enid Chamber of Commerce Housing Committee, Enid Emergency Assistance Task Force, and Garfield Co. Emergency Food and Shelter program, CDBG staff continues to be informed and up to date on housing issues in the community. The City of Enid will continue to partner with the Community Development Support Association and Christmas in Action to address fair housing needs. CDBG staff also meets with the North Central Oklahoma Continuum of Care to be more aware of the issues facing agencies in Enid and research areas where CDBG funding would assist with alleviating any impediments to fair housing.

4.) The City of Enid strives to implement its 5-year Consolidated Plan priorities and objectives, which was developed through input from agencies and the public and focused on programs that can be recommended to meet underserved needs. During the funding year, the City continued its strategy of investing the majority of CDBG funds on a citywide basis to activities that demonstrate significant leveraging of limited CDBG resources while benefiting low to moderate-income persons both directly and through community growth.

5.) The City of Enid continually pursues additional funding to address needs that have been identified in the CDBG plan. A full-time grant writer is utilized to pursue further assistance through public and private grants and federal assistance programs.

CDBG funds were allocated to CDSA to leverage the application for HOME funds through the state participating jurisdiction, the Oklahoma Housing Finance Agency. Unfortunately, neither CDSA nor the City of Enid was invited to participate in the owner occupied rehabilitation funding cycle. By allowing sub recipients to administer projects funds are conserved in the administration line item. Points are awarded to applications that leverage funds with CDBG funds and organizations are encouraged to seek other funds and not depend solely on CDBG funding.

Matching funds are not required but certainly encouraged.

Managing the Process

1. Describe actions taken during the last year to ensure compliance with program and comprehensive planning requirements.

Program Year 5 CAPER Managing the Process response:

During the program year, the CDBG Department continues to proceed in accordance with the management process set forth in the consolidated plan. The CDBG Program is under the direction and oversight of the Community Development Department, City Manager and Commission. One full time employee, a CDBG Coordinator, is responsible for administering and implementing all funded activities, preparing the 5-Year Consolidated Plan and Annual Action Plans, program and project recordkeeping, adhearance to federal and state program related regulations and statutes. A CDBG Funding Committee composed of representatives from higher education, transport industry; financial management and city commission assist the CDBG Coordinator and City Commission in the review and recommendation of proposals to be funded with CDBG resources.

The CDBG Department is responsible for developing contracts with sub recipients to address the specific goals and objectives of each program. The contract for services between the City and the sub recipient clearly outlines the work to be performed, time of performance; funds budgeted for the work, and all applicable laws and regulations. Whenever appropriate, contracts contain references to specific federal requirements such as Davis-Bacon wage rates, City of Enid purchasing procedures, and Lead Based Paint requirements.

During the course of the contract period, sub recipients are required to submit monthly, quarterly or semi-annual reports, as directed by the contract and CDBG Coordinator. In addition, periodic site visits are conducted to ensure that projects are proceeding in accordance with program guidelines and in a timely manner. Such monitoring is conducted in accordance with guidelines set forth in the CDBG Monitoring Handbook. All monitoring visits are followed up with a written analysis of findings and any recommendations for improvement or corrective actions. In June 2009, a monitoring checklist was developed for use when conducting monitoring visits. This provides for a more consistent approach in monitoring the programs.



2.) The City's CDBG entitlement allocation for 2012 was \$405,210.00, which was disbursed along with \$10,000.00 in reallocated funds and program income available. All funds were committed to projects that met the consolidated plan's goals and objectives. During the program year, \$551,929.31 in CDBG funding was expended. Most projects are Low-Moderate Income Clientele Benefit, meaning the beneficiary must provide proof of income eligibility for services provided with CDBG funds. However, some projects are based on location or area benefit. Of the funds

expended on specific project locations, the percentage spent in each low-mod census tract is:

Housing and homeless activities, bus pass program, tutoring service and demolition assistance were distributed on a citywide basis to benefit low-moderate income clientele (LMC benefit). Applications are accepted with income qualification and documentation is necessary when LMC benefit factor is used. 26% of all expenditures for this fiscal year were for low moderate income clientele and 28% was spent on area benefit projects. Planning and administration expenditures totaled \$251,659.09.

Institutional Structure

Program Year 5 CAPER Institutional Structure response:

By serving on various committees, CDBG Department staff acquires additional knowledge of needs and coordinates efforts to assist with addressing those needs. CDBG staff works closely with other city departments to identify and address gaps in structure.

The City of Enid addressed the insufficient block grant funding gap identified in the Consolidated Plan by utilizing the expertise of a full-time grant writer to pursue additional funding.

Program Year 5 CAPER Monitoring response:

1.) Monitoring is conducted on a daily basis in a manner consistent with the HUD regulatory guidelines that apply to CDBG funds. Depending on the nature of the funds usage, different eligibility and compliance factors may be reviewed. CDBG Department staff keeps continuous contact with sub recipients during the duration of the project. Funds are not released unless the CDBG staff have all supporting satisfactory documentation in order. Annual monitoring visits follow the sub recipient monitoring checklist to ensure comprehensive monitoring is completed. For projects following Davis-Bacon requirements, staff meets with sub recipients before any bids are solicited and with contractors before any work can begin.

Sub recipients submit accomplishment reports monthly, quarterly or semiannually. Also, sub recipients must follow the City of Enid's Purchasing Manual. Purchases of goods and services in excess of the small purchase ceiling follow formal RFQ, REP, or closed sealed bid processes subject to City Commission approval. All transactions are required to pass through the CDBG office for inspection and approval before any funds are released. All reimbursement requests are reviewed by the CDBG Coordinator before being submitted for City Commission approval of payment. The CDBG Department maintains an open door policy for all agencies and frequent unofficial visits are made to sub recipients throughout the year.

2.) To assist with monitoring, CDBG Department developed guidelines and a sub recipient monitoring checklist. The checklist assists with providing consistency

during monitoring visits and allows sub recipients the ability to know what will be expected during a visit.

Monitoring has generally found that programs and projects are operating according to the regulations and the terms and conditions of agreements. Among the key review areas are the eligibility of beneficiaries and expenditures. Overall, programs and projects have a good record in this regard, especially given that funds are disbursed with few exceptions on a reimbursement basis, with source documents reviewed prior to approval. The CDBG Department works closely with all sub recipients and maintains close working relationships to ensure all work is completed according to CDBG regulations and contract requirements. This also allows for the CDBG Department to determine areas of concerns with each sub recipient, in addition to areas where enhanced guidance may be needed with future contracts.

3.) All CDBG programs are focused on meeting the needs of low-and moderate income households and individuals. Without CDBG funding, many of the programs would be unable to assist the same number of people, or possibly even cease to exist. Throughout the funding cycle and awarding of CDBG funds, the CDBG Department works towards directing funding to projects that meet the goals and objectives in the consolidated plan. During the 2012 funding cycle, projects that were awarded funding addressed both high priorities (clearance and demolition, code enforcement, program administration, rehabilitation of existing owner units including emergency repairs, planned repayment of section 108 loan principal) and medium priorities (public services and public facility improvements). Through the CDBG program, local non-profit organizations were able to complete improvements to their buildings to provide enhanced and expanded services for neighborhoods and the community.

CDBG funding has made a huge impact on the community by making it possible to meet priority needs and objectives identified by the community. Specific examples of progress include creating a suitable living environment by providing public facilities improvements, public services, residential rehabilitation in the form of emergency repairs and barrier removal, clearance activities and economic development. Progress is made in small strides toward the betterment of the community's vision.

By supporting low-and moderate households through the clearance and demolition assistance programs, it allows those households the ability to spend their income on important needs to continue sustaining their families and remain in their homes. All housing activities receiving CDBG assistance are directed towards low-and moderate income households. Public facilities improvements, public services and economic development activities are directed toward low-moderate income individuals and families. The City of Enid would like to call attention to the accomplishment reports that during the 2012 program year, 100% of the housing activity funding went to benefit low/mod households.

During the year, some projects have met some barriers causing them to fall behind schedule but none were detrimental to the completion of the project. Projects, such as the EPTA bus shelter enhancement, have been delayed due to ADA requirements. ADA sidewalks are being constructed before shelters can be placed but we continue to work towards meeting the goals to provide shelter from the elements while waiting for public transportation. The CDBG Department believes all projects will have a great affect on the low-and moderate income population of Enid and works closely with all sub recipients to ensure completion of each project.

During the reporting period, CDBG funds made possible dozens of activities to address the housing, economic, human and neighborhood development and homeless services needs of the community. Under the General Questions section above, there is a list of the results achieved. The impact on their needs were achieved through activities and strategies focused on: child care accessibility, safety for non-profit clientele, continued sustainability of public facilities, emergency housing assistance, neighborhood facilities and infrastructure improvements, access to public transportation, quality educational programs for youth, eliminating blighting structures and conditions, repairing and rehabilitating owner-occupied housing, and continued educational and employment opportunities through the section 108 debt service for the local college.

A major factor impacting the fulfillment of strategies and the overall vision is insufficient funding. However, CDBG funding received helps fulfill the community's overall vision, one project at a time.

As indicated above and in the General Questions section, this report covers the third year of the five years under the City's consolidated plan. Substantial progress has been made in the priority areas of clearance and demolition, code enforcement, program administration, rehabilitation of existing owner units including emergency repairs, and planned repayment of section 108 loan principal. Major goals are on target in accordance with the City's Consolidated Plan.

The City has not identified any adjustments or improvements to strategies and activities identified in the current consolidated plan. However, the CDBG department has implemented a pre-contract meeting requirement with the key members of the sub recipient to review contract content, policies, procedures, protocols and regulations to ensure sub recipient compliance and comprehension before actually entering into a contract.

Lead-based Paint

Program Year 5 CAPER Lead-based Paint response:

The City follows state and federal regulations prohibiting the use of lead based paint (LBP) and relies on sub recipients to advise households receiving CDBG assistance. Staff distributes informational materials detailing the dangers of LBP at the local annual Home Show held in April and on an on-going basis through the department.

CDSA, a subrecipient, distributes printed materials regarding the dangers and hazards of lead paint to all households receiving owner occupied rehabilitation and emergency repair assistance. All existing dwellings constructed prior to 1978 receiving CDBG assistance through CDSA undergo an assessment to determine the presence of lead-paint and two homes have been abated during the 2012-2013 funding year.

HOUSING

Housing Needs

1. Describe Actions taken during the last year to foster and maintain affordable housing.

Program Year 5 CAPER Housing Needs response:

- 1.) During the 2012-2013 program year, the City of Enid worked with sub recipients to meet the goals towards decent housing set forth in the consolidated plan. Those goals are the removal of architectural barriers and rehabilitation of existing owner units including emergency repairs. To meet these goals, the City of Enid:
 - Provided funds to CDSA to complete emergency housing repairs for owner occupied homes. Funds are provided for HOME administration to allow more HOME projects to be completed with HOME dollars.
 - Christmas in Action received assistance to complete roof repairs during their yearly Build Day activity.

Along with CDBG funded projects, the City worked with developers to create additional affordable multifamily and single family housing in Enid through two tax credit development projects. In 2007, the City of Enid approved site plans for the Roosevelt Park Apartments, proposed by a developer in a qualified census tract. The City also created a tax increment finance district to help fund the construction of the affordable housing complex, which includes 48 apartments. Along with the apartments, the City supported the Carland Group in their application for tax credits to build 26 single family homes on in-fill lots.

Specific Housing Objectives

- 1. Evaluate progress in meeting specific objective of providing affordable housing, including the number of extremely low-income, low-income, and moderate-income renter and owner households comparing actual accomplishments with proposed goals during the reporting period.

Program Year 5 CAPER Specific Housing Objectives response:

The City of Enid continues its commitment to meeting housing needs during the third program year Action Plan. In an effort to continue with the goals of enhancing the housing stock throughout the city limits, the City of Enid places importance on the housing priorities as identified in the Consolidated Plan throughout the application process.

To address these needs the City worked in conjunction with Christmas in Action to financially support Build Day 2012 during which 15 households were assisted. Volunteers focused rehabilitation efforts on owner-occupied housing for frail, elderly and disabled applicants who qualify for assistance with funding provided to assist with roof repair and replacement. The projects objective is to provide decent affordable housing with an accessibility/availability outcome. The City also worked in conjunction with the Community Development Support Association (CDSA) to provide emergency system repairs for low- to moderate income single-family owner-occupied homes, barrier removal for low- to moderate- income homes and project delivery costs associated with housing program and other HUD programs for housing. The number assisted was one hundred thirty two (132) individuals from thirty five (35) households. The objective is to provide decent affordable housing with an outcome of accessibility/availability.

Enid reasonably expects CDBG resources and some local revenue to address identified needs. The City may issue Certification of Consistency to the Consolidated Plan for other federal application assistance when development proposals compliment affordable housing priorities and objectives of the Annual Plan. Although a low CDBG priority, affordable rental development and rehabilitation is strongly encouraged and the need has increased during this consolidated plan period. Nonprofit and/or for-profit development enterprises can apply for competitive housing resources such as HOME, Low Income Housing Tax Credits, Federal Home Loan Bank of Topeka-Affordable Housing Program, State Housing Trust Fund, USHUD Youth Build, local faith-based initiatives similar to Group Work Camps, and/or REI's various housing programs.

Organizations receiving CDBG assistance are encouraged to purse additional leveraging funds through avenues, such as private donations, competitive grants, foundations or federal programs. The proposed public facility improvement, public services, and clearance activites in the 2012 funding cycle will leverage over \$85,000.00 with their CDBG funding and the housing activities will leverage over \$1,300,000.00.

The City of Enid addresses priority areas of removal of architectural barriers for those with disabilities and the rehabilitation of existing owner units including emergency repairs.

Public Housing Strategy

1. Describe actions taken during the last year to improve public housing and resident initiatives.

Program Year 5 CAPER Public Housing Strategy response:

The City of Enid does not have a public housing agency that it works directly with; however, there is a local organization, Community Development Support Association (CDSA), which receives HOME funds. CDSA provides services to residents to help them become more involved in management and participate in homeownership. This organization is not designated as troubled by HUD and is not performing poorly. In fact, CDSA is operating astoundingly.

The City of Enid works closely with the Community Development Support Association (CDSA) in pursuing additional public housing. In 2007, the City of Enid approved site plans for the Roosevelt Park Apartments, proposed by a developer in a qualified census tract. The City also created a tax increment finance district to help fund the construction of the affordable housing complex, which includes 48 apartments. The project was completed and is at capacity offering affordable housing to the citizens of Enid.

In addition to assisting with development of the Roosevelt Park Apartments, the City of Enid worked with the Carland Group LLC, who proposed the east side redevelopment project consisting of 30 single family detached homes located on scattered sites in a low/moderate area. To support the tax credit application for the redevelopment project, the City passed a resolution of support and transferred ownership of two in-fill lots for the project. The project was approved for funding by the Oklahoma Housing Finance Authority, the single family dwellings in low income census tracts of the city are currently filled to capacity.

Barriers to Affordable Housing

Program Year 5 CAPER Barriers to Affordable Housing response:

The City of Enid continues its commitment to create diverse housing opportunities and ensure the availability and affordability of a variety of housing options by collaborating with the development community and housing organizations to build affordable housing as demonstrated with the partnership on two development projects. CDSA continues to offer a down payment assistance program for low to moderate income households to assist families with the purchase of homes.

Program Year 5 CAPER Homeless Needs response:

While the entitlement amount that the City recieves for CDBG is inadedequte to address all homeless needs, funds allocated toward emergency repair and barriers removal through CDSA and Christmas in Action assist individuals to remain in their homes and avoid the prospect of homelessness. In total, the City allocated \$90,000.00 to assist with housing rehabilitation needs through CDSA and Christmas in Action (CIA).

While the City of Enid does not receive emergency shelter grants funds directly, the City desires to support agencies and shelters who address and provide homeless needs. As part of the North Central Oklahoma Continuum of Care , the City supports their efforts to address homelessness and serves on the North Central Continuum of Care board. The City has an official Memorandum of Understanding with the Continuum and the CDBG staff serves on the Continuum's Ten (10) year plan to end homelessness committee . By educating staff and offering support, the City hopes to continue collaborative efforts to pursue additional funding to address homelessness.

Specific Homeless Prevention Elements

To prevent homelessness, the City of Enid attempts to keep families in their homes by offering emergency repair assistance through CDSA and roof repairs through Christmas in Action. The City of Enid also has the North Central Oklahoma Continuum of Care 10-year plan to end homelessness available for the public.

Program Year 5 CAPER Community Development response:

1.) The City of Enid strives to meet the priorities as set forth in the 2008-2013 Consolidated Plan during the 2012 Action Plan. The projects identified for expenditure during the 2012 program year were public facilities improvements, public services, housing, economic development, and clearance activities. Specific projects in these areas included:

A summary of the objectives and activity goals proposed in the 2012 Action Plan include:

- EPTA-Bus shelter project located in QTC 1 and 7 and has expended B-10 funds in the amount \$1,467.50 and \$1,920.00 from the B-11 allocation to provide bus

- CDSA Housing- Emergency Repairs and Barrier Removal program expended B-11 funds in the amount of \$34,425.27 and a total of \$ 13,125.53 for HOME projects during the program year.
- Christmas In Action-Housing/Roof projects expended B-10 funds in the amount of \$3,364.00, completing the project. Christmas In Action also had expenditures in the amount of \$10,332.23 from their B-11 allocation for emergency repairs to replace roofs for 11 households.
- Debt service to the Section 108 loan was refinanced in 2010 and the lowered the regular annual payments. The loan assists with the purchase of the NOC campus in Enid, which provides education opportunities and employment for the community. NOC is located in the QCT 15. \$53,264.03 was expended from the B-10 line item and \$128,090.16 closing out the B-11 allocation.
- Demolition assistance was given to 22 low- and moderate-income households to remove dilapidated structures identified by code enforcement. The activity expended \$24,373.88 from B-10 funds and \$14,228.02 from the B-11 allocation.
- Sandbox Learning Center expended funds from B-11 in this program year in the amount of \$11,483.19, closing out their B-11 project.
- Booker T Washington expended funds in the amount of \$6,375.00 this program year from the B-11 allocation to replace doors at the facility.
- The First Church of the Nazarene expended \$37,034.15 from the B-11 allocation.
- Administration funds expended from B-09 were \$10,458.50 and the B-11 funds expended were in the amount of \$45,462.02.
- 2.) The program objectives set forth in the consolidated plan have not been changed. Enid still places emphasis on housing rehabilitation, the removal of architectural barriers, clearance and demolition, code enforcement, planning, and the repayment of the section 108 loan. For any proposed changes to the program objectives, the City would solicit community input.
- 3.) To pursue additional resources to address housing needs in Enid, the City worked with CDSA to apply for HOME funds from the Oklahoma Finance Authority (OHFA) since the City of Enid is not an entitlement for HOME funds. The City of Enid was not selected to participate in the application process for funding. Under OHFA's system, HOME rehabilitation is awarded using a chance lottery drawing that does not consider local housing needs or demand resulting in the City's loss of access to what had been otherwise dependable funding based on the merit of City's housing needs.

Applicants were encouraged to provide visual aids during the second public hearing. At this public hearing, the applicants are given an opportunity to present their application to the CDBG Funding Committee. The committee then has the opportunity to ask any remaining questions. Applicants were granted use of a computer and projector during the meeting, as well as access to a digital camera, to create any visual aids. All applications are discussed based on a point system by the CDBG Funding Committee.

As with previous funding years, the focus is to fund projects that will further the goals and objectives set forth in the consolidated plan. All applications that are received before the deadline are reviewed by CDBG staff for eligibility and then passed to the CDBG Funding Committee for funding consideration.

- 4.) All CDBG funds expended met a national objective. Out of all funds disbursed other than section 108 and administration, 100% were expended to benefit low/mod income individuals and households.
- 5.) No activities funded with CDBG funds displaced or relocated families from their homes. The CDBG Department property acquisition and rehabilitation activities do not displace families from their homes. Christmas in Action activities only affect the roof and CDSA completes emergency repairs as soon as possible. The demolition assistance program requires that a dilapidated residential property be vacant a minimum of 6 months before the property is considered for assistance.
- 6.) Through the microenterprise assistance program, individuals can receive funding to create a sole proprietorship business. Most applicants are unable to find assistance elsewhere for various reasons, i.e. bad credit, lack of financial capability. Two microenterprises that were assisted received start up funding, while the third received funding for improvements to keep the business operational. NOC has agreed to hire low-and moderate income individuals by advertising the available positions in low-mod areas first and giving preference to Section 3.
- 7.) For activities that fall under an area low-and moderate benefit, the CDBG Department staff refers to census tract data to determine the income level and population of the proposed service area. Census tracts that are identified as low-and/or moderate census tracts receive focus for CDBG funding.
- 8.) Program income in the amount of \$1,200.00 was received during the 2012-2013 program year for outstanding microenterprise loans. Each microenterprise funded receives assistance in the form of a 50% loan/50% grant. The loan portion is to be paid back in 10% increments each year for five years.
- 9.) None of the expenditures made in previous reporting periods have been disallowed or reimbursed.

- 10.) Currently, all microenterprise loans have been expended. There is a total outstanding balance of \$7,920.91 for three loans, one of the four loans has been paid in full.
- 11.) The City does not have any lump sum agreements. Expenditures are reimbursed throughout the project when requests are made and receipts or invoices are submitted to the CDBG Department.
- 12.) CDSA and Christmas in Action assist the city with addressing housing activities. A total of \$81,417.42 assisted 35 families to remain in their homes.
- 13.) The City of Enid does not have a Neighborhood Revitalization Strategy area. There was a designated NRSA during the 2003-2007 Consolidated Plan, but it expired in 2007.

Antipoverty Strategy

1. Describe actions taken during the last year to reduce the number of persons living below the poverty level.

Program Year 5 CAPER Antipoverty Strategy response:

The City of Enid continues to work closely with CDSA to help families move to economic self-sufficiency by improving conditions in which low-income people live and supporting partnerships among providers of services to low-income people.

Through the City's continued support of Northern Oklahoma College (NOC) with the Section 108 Loan to assist with the purchase of the Enid campus, opportunities for further education are provided at an affordable rate. Northern Oklahoma College (NOC), Northwestern Oklahoma State University (NWOSU), and Autry Technology Center worked together to provide expanded economic and educational opprotunities to the community at a lower tuition cost than other regional and state universities. For example, the cost for undergradute studies with tuition and manadatory fees for a year at Oklahoma State University is \$206.70 per credit hour and University of Oklahoma is \$216.43 per credit hour while NWOSU is \$137.00 per credit hour and NOC is \$76.75. This information was gathered from the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education website.


