BACKGROUND:

This is a companion item to Items 6.2, 7.1, and 7.2.

This site consists of 54 acres. The request is to change the land use from Low Intensity Residential Designation to High Intensity Industrial Designation to allow for I-2 zoning uses. Currently the lot is undeveloped. If approved, the property will be used for warehouse, commercial and industrial uses.

The site has access to 42nd Street via a private access easement across the Thunder Travel Plaza and Roberts Ranch truck washout and limited access to Owen K. Garriott Road / US Highway 412. Water is available in 42nd Street and Market Avenue. Sanitary sewer is available in 42nd Street and north of Market Avenue. Both can be extended to the property to support the proposed uses.

The Metropolitan Area Planning Commission unanimously recommended approval at their January 20, 2015 meeting.













ORDINANCE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF ENID, OKLAHOMA:

<u>Section I</u>: That Title 2, Chapter 6, Article B, Section 2-6B-4 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby amended to read as follows:

2-6B-4: AMBULANCE SERVICE:

- A. Ambulance Business License: The fee required in section 3-8A-43-8A-2 of this eCode shall be two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00).
- B. Ambulance Vehicle Permit: The fee required in Section 3-8B-2 of this Code shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).
- BC. Ambulance Driver's License: The fee required in section 3-8C-63-8C-2 of this Code for the original issuance or renewal of a license shall fifty dollars (\$50.00).
- D. Ambulance Attendant's License: The fee required in section 3-8C-2 of this Code for the original issuance or renewal of a license shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00).

<u>Section II</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Section 3-8-1 through 3-8-13 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, are hereby repealed.

<u>Section III</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Section 3-8-1 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8-1: **DEFINITIONS**:

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this Chapter and Articles A, B and C, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

AMBULANCE: Any ground, air or water vehicle which is approved by the Oklahoma Commissioner of Health, designed and equipped to transport a patient or patients and to provide appropriate on-scene and en route patient stabilization and care as required. Vehicles used as ambulances shall meet such standards as may be required by the State Board of Health for approval, and shall display evidence of such approval at all times.

AMBULANCE ATTENDANT LICENSE: A license issued under Article C of this Chapter which authorizes an Emergency Medical Technician licensed by the State of Oklahoma to care for the patients of an Ambulance Service.

AMBULANCE BUSINESS LICENSE: A license issued under Article A of this Chapter which authorizes an Ambulance Service to operate within the city limits of Enid.

AMBULANCE DRIVER LICENSE: A license issued under Article C of this Chapter which authorizes an Emergency Medical Technician licensed by the State of Oklahoma to drive ambulances for an Ambulance Service.

AMBULANCE PATIENT or PATIENT: A wounded, injured, sick, invalid or otherwise incapacitated person who is or will be transported to or from a health care facility in an ambulance.

AMBULANCE SERVICE: Any private firm or governmental agency which is licensed by the State Department of Health to provide levels of medical care based on certification standards promulgated by the Oklahoma Board of Health.

AMBULANCE VEHICLE PERMIT: The permit which an Operator is required to obtain under this Chapter for each and every motor vehicle operated under the Ambulance Service's Business License.

ATTENDANT: An Emergency Medical Technician licensed by the State of Oklahoma who has the duty of caring for a sick, ill or injured person who is being transported as a patient in an ambulance.

DISPATCHER: An individual employed by an Ambulance Service responsible for sending an ambulance to provide service or transport to a patient.

DRIVER: An individual licensed by the State of Oklahoma with the appropriate driver's license for the size, weight, and type of motor vehicle used, who has successfully completed an Emergency Vehicle Operator Course approved by the Oklahoma Department of Health, as well as any required refresher course.

EMERGENCY: A sudden, unforeseen event giving rise to a need for ambulance transport with life support services and is a condition which an individual has a need for immediate medical attention or where the potential for such need is perceived by emergency medical personnel or a public safety agency.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN/BASIC: An individual licensed by the Oklahoma Department of Health to perform emergency medical services at a basic level or standard of care in accordance with the Oklahoma Emergency Response Systems Development Act and in accordance with the rules and standards promulgated by the Oklahoma Board of Health.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN/PARAMEDIC: An individual licensed by the Oklahoma Department of Health to perform emergency medical services at a paramedic level or standard of care in accordance with the Oklahoma Emergency Response Systems Development Act and in accordance with the rules and standards promulgated by the Oklahoma Board of Health.

MEDICAL DIRECTOR: A physician, fully licensed without restriction, who acts as a paid or volunteer medical advisor to a licensed Ambulance Service and who monitors and directs the care so provided. Such physicians shall meet such qualifications and requirements as may be promulgated by the Oklahoma Board of Health.

OPERATOR: The owner, director or manager of any Ambulance Service which is licensed to operate in the city limits of Enid.

PRIVATE SICK CALLS: Includes all private calls made directly to an Ambulance Service company, except those defined herein as "emergency accident calls".

RESPONSE TIME: The elapsed time from the time the emergency call is received by the Ambulance Service until a complete crew arrives on scene, unless the call is scheduled in advance.

TRANSFERABLE: Shall mean:

- A. Any change in the business structure of a licensee, including, but not limited to, changes from or to:
 - 1. A sole proprietorship;
 - 2. A partnership, including any change in the partners; and,
 - 3. A corporation, including any change in the shareholders, whether by operation of law or otherwise.
- B. Bankruptcy, an assignment for the benefit of creditors, or the appointment of a receiver.
- C. A sale or transfer of over ten percent (10%) of the assets of a licensee.

<u>Section IV</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Section 3-8-2 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8-2: ADOPTION OF OKLAHOMA RULES AND REGULATIONS; SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS:

All applicable statutes, rules and regulations governing emergency medical services, ambulances, licensing of ambulances services, and certification and licensing of

personnel, as those statutes, rules and regulations may be amended from time to time, are hereby adopted and incorporated as if fully set out herein. The provisions of this chapter are supplementary to all other ordinances.

<u>Section V</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Section 3-8-3 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8-3: GENERAL OPERATING REGULATIONS:

All Ambulance Services shall comply with the following regulations:

- A. Providing Service: Every Ambulance Service shall provide immediate service, twenty-four (24) hours daily, each and every day.
- B. Vehicles in Service: Every Operator shall have two (2) fully staffed ambulances in service in the city limits of Enid, twenty-four (24) hours daily, each and every day. An ambulance temporarily removed from the city limits of Enid to transport a patient from a location in Enid to a location outside of Enid shall not be considered in violation of this subsection.
- C. Employee Uniform: Every Operator shall adopt and use a distinctive uniform color scheme which shall not intringe upon any color scheme already in use by another ambulance Operator. Every driver and attendant shall be required to wear the appropriate uniform while on duty.
- D. Answering Calls: Except for requests for interfacility transfers, an Ambulance Service shall respond when called, regardless of a patient's ability to pay. Patients shall be loaded and transported without being subject to unreasonable delays.
- E. Sanitary Bed Linens: Clean and sanitary bed linens shall be provided for each patient and shall be changed as soon as practicable after the transport of a patient.
- F. Daily Manifest: Drivers shall maintain a daily manifest upon which shall be recorded the time, place or origin, destination, and charges for each trip to be made.
- G. Response Time: Every Ambulance Service shall maintain a response time of eight (8) minutes or less ninety percent (90%) of the time, calculated monthly.

<u>Section VI</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Section 3-8-4 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8-4: VEHICLES AND EQUIPMENT:

- A. Vehicle Identification; Business Name on Vehicle: Each ambulance shall be identified in such a manner as to indicate clearly that the vehicle is used for ambulance purposes only. The Ambulance Service Operator's business name shall appear on each side and on the rear of the vehicle in letters of not less than three inches (3") in height and one-half inch (½") in width on a metal portion of the body. No advertising of any type shall be placed on the vehicle.
- B. Maintain in Good Operating Condition: License holders shall maintain in good operating condition and ready for use, all equipment which shall be modern and capable of rendering a satisfactory Ambulance Service. All equipment must be approved by the licensee's Medical Director and shall meet or exceed the requirements as required for licensing by the State of Oklahoma.
- C. Inspection: All mechanical, safety and special equipment shall be subject to inspection at any time by authorized officials. No ambulance that has been substantially damaged or altered shall be again placed in service until it has been reinspected. All ambulances shall be subject to the same statutes and ordinances, and rules and regulations relating to safety and operating equipment applicable to other motor vehicles in the city.
- D. The Police Department may conduct vehicle inspections of all approved Ambulance Services as often as in their judgment is warranted to maintain adequate standards, and shall have the right to remove any Ambulance from operation for failure to maintain adequate mechanical standards of equipment, or for failure to comply with any of the provisions of this Chapter or Articles A, B or C.

<u>Section VII</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Section 3-8-5 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8-5: INSURANCE:

A. Insurance Requirements: Every Operator shall maintain in full force and effect, at all times, the following insurance policies:

1. General Liability:

a. Bodily Injury Liability – Limits shall be carried in an amount not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for any claim or to any claimant who has more than one (1) claim for loss arising out of a single accident or occurrence; and not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) to any claimant for his claim for any other loss arising out of a single accident or occurrence; and not less than two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00) for any number of claims arising out of a single accident or occurrence.

b. Property Damage Liability - Limits shall be carried in an amount not less than three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000.00) for any claim or to any claimant who has more than one (1) claim for loss arising out of a single accident or occurrence; and not less than three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000.00) to any claimant for his claim for any other loss arising out of a single accident or occurrence; and not less than two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00) for any number of claims arising out of a single accident or occurrence.

2. Professional Liability:

- a. Bodily Injury Liability Limits shall be carried in an amount not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000,00) for any claim or to any claimant who has more than one (1) claim for loss arising out of a single accident or occurrence; and not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) to any claimant for his claim for any other loss arising out of a single accident or occurrence; and not less than two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00) for any number of claims arising out of a single accident or occurrence.
- b. Property Damage Liability Limits shall be carried in an amount not less than three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000.00) for any claim or to any claimant who has more than one (1) claim for loss arising out of a single accident or occurrence; and not less than three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000.00) to any claimant for his claim for any other loss arising out of a single accident or occurrence; and not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for any number of claims arising out of a single accident or occurrence.

3. Automobile Liability:

- a. Liability Limits shall be carried in an amount of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) to any claimant who has more than one (1) claim for loss arising out of a single accident or occurrence; and not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) to any claimant for his claim for any other loss arising out of a single accident or occurrence; and not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for any number of claims arising out of a single accident or occurrence.
- b. Comprehensive and Collision Loss Limits shall be carried in an amount of not less than actual cash value with deductibles of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) per vehicle).

- c. Medical Payments Limits shall be carried in an amount of not less than one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) to any claimant who has more than one (1) claim for loss arising out of a single accident or occurrence; and not less than three hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) to any claimant for his claim for any other loss arising out of a single accident or occurrence.
- 4. Worker's Compensation Limits shall be carried in an amount not less than the amount prescribed by the laws of the State of Oklahoma.
- 5. Contractual Liability If the Ambulance Service operates a subscription program, limits shall be carried in an amount not less than the actual amount collected from the sale of such subscriptions.
- 6. Umbrella An additional one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) umbrella policy must be provided.
- B. The insurance policies shall be executed by an insurance or indemnity carrier authorized to do business in the State of Oklahoma.
- C. Notice of Cancellation: All such certificates of insurance shall provide for a thirty (30) day cancellation notice to the City Clerk.
- D. Proof of Insurance: The Operator shall submit to the City Clerk annually, or upon any change in insurance, certificates of insurance

<u>Section VIII</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Section 3-8-6 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8-6: RATES AND CHARGES:

Schedule of Rates; Notify City of Rate Change: Every person authorized under this chapter to operate one or more ambulances shall file with the Finance Department a schedule of the rates which will be charged for the transportation of persons in ambulances; notice of any change in such rates shall be given to the Mayor and Board of Commissioners in writing at least thirty (30) days prior to the effective date of such change.

<u>Section IX</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Section 3-8-7 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8-7: PERSONNEL STAFFING:

A. Driver: Each Ambulance shall have a Driver who shall assist in attending to a patient and/or preparing an Ambulance Patient for transport. The Driver shall not also be the Attendant.

- B. Attendant: Each Ambulance shall have, in addition to its Driver, an Attendant who shall attend to the patient and shall remain with the Ambulance Patient being transported.
- C. Dispatcher: Every Operator shall, at all times, have stationed at his central place of business, a person who shall be required to promptly answer all calls for service, promptly dispatch ambulances, and be generally responsible for the conduct of the Ambulance Service.

<u>Section X</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Section 3-8-8 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8-8: 911 DISPATCHING PROCEDURE:

- A. More than One Licensee; Preference: When the dispatcher receives an emergency call for an ambulance, he shall authorize and dispatch an approved Ambulance Service. If there is more than one (1) Ambulance Service, the police dispatcher shall use the call distribution method approved by resolution of the Mayor and Board of Commissioners. If there is more than one licensed Ambulance Service and the caller prefers to use a particular Ambulance Service, the police dispatcher shall authorize and dispatch that Ambulance Service.
- B. Private Sick Call: If an Ambulance Service Operator receives a private sick call which is of an emergency nature and desires to answer such call as an emergency call under code 3, the Operator shall report to the police dispatcher such call. The police dispatcher shall then clear such Ambulance Service to answer such private sick call.

<u>Section XI</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Section 3-8-9 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8-9: USE OF EMERGENCY WARNING DEVICES:

- A. Use of Red Lights and Siren: An ambulance may respond, after receiving a call from a private citizen, or from the city, state or county dispatcher, to a call using red lights and siren.
- B. Emergencies. After an ambulance has responded to a call and arrived at the point of pick up, no ambulance shall proceed to the hospital or other destination with the use of such emergency warning equipment, except in the case of emergency.

<u>Section XII</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Section 3-8-10 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8-10: CENTRAL PLACE OF BUSINESS; TELEPHONE NUMBER:

Each Operator shall maintain a central place of business within the city limits of Enid, at which place he shall provide a properly listed telephone for receiving all calls for Ambulance Service. Every Operator shall keep on file with the City of Enid the business address and telephone number where the Operator may be reached at all times. The Operator shall keep the business records and daily manifests required by this Chapter at the central place of business where all such records and manifests shall be readily accessible for examination by the Finance Department, the Mayor and Board of Commissioners, or their authorized agents.

- A. Daily Manifests: Every Operator shall retain and preserve all daily manifests for at least six (6) months.
- B. Business Records: Every Operator shall keep accurate records of receipts from operations, and such other operating information as may be required by the Mayor and Board of Commissioners.

<u>Section XIII</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Section 3-8-11 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8-11: TERMINATION OF SERVICE:

If an Operator determines that termination of service is necessary, the Operator shall give ninety (90) days' written notice to the city Clerk and shall be required to continue to furnish the service authorized by the license until:

- A. All prepaid ambulance service contracts have expired; or,
- B. The Operator shows proof to the City Clerk that a pro rata part of the premium for prepaid ambulance service contracts has been returned to the customer(s).

<u>Section XIV</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Section 3-8-12 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8-12: AUTHORITY TO ESTABLISH A SOLE-PROVIDER SYSTEM:

To safeguard the public health and well-being and facilitate the prompt dispatch of appropriately equipped and staffed ambulances when needed to protect life and health, the Mayor and Board of Commissioners may, pursuant to 63 O.S. §1-2515, after competitive bidding, establish a sole-provider system for stretcher aid van and/or ambulance service transports.

<u>Section XIV</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Article A, Sections 3-8A-1 through 3-8A-7 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, are hereby repealed.

<u>Section XV</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Article A, of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

ARTICLE A AMBULANCE SERVICE BUSINESS LICENSE

<u>Section XVI</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Article A, Section 3-8A-1 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8A-1: LICENSE REQUIRED; ELIGIBILITY:

A. License Required:

- 1. Requirement: No person shall operate any Ambulance Service within the city without first obtaining an Ambulance Business License issued pursuant to the provisions of this article.
- 2. Exception: The provisions of this Section shall not apply to:
 - a. An ambulance picking up a patient on sick calls only in the city, and delivering the patient to a destination outside the city, nor shall it apply to an ambulance picking up a patient outside the city and delivering the patient to a destination within the city.
 - b. An ambulance rendering assistance during any catastrophe or major emergency when the licensee(s) authorized to operate in the City are insufficient in number or inadequate during such catastrophe or major emergency, as determined by the City Manager or his designee.
 - c. Any ambulance operating within the City solely for the purpose of a drill or training exercise.
 - d. Any ambulance rendering requested assistance to a licensed Ambulance Service in cases of disaster or major emergency pursuant to provisions of a "mutual aid agreement" approved by the City Commission.

B. Eligibility: Applicants must, at a minimum, be:

1. Licensed as an Ambulance Service by the State of Oklahoma at the Paramedic Life Support level of care.

- 2. Financially able to render safe and comfortable transportation of patients.
- 3. Financially able to maintain and/or replace vehicles and equipment as needed.
- 4. Of good moral character and have a reputation as a law abiding citizen.

<u>Section XVII</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Article A, Section 3-8A-2 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8A-2: APPLICATION FORM; CONTENTS; FEE:

Every application for a license shall be in writing, signed and sworn to by the applicant, and shall be filed with the City Clerk. The application shall be on a form provided by the City Clerk and shall contain the following:

- A. If the applicant is an individual, the name, age and address of the applicant; if a partnership, the business name of the partnership and the name, age and address of each partner; if a corporation, the names and addresses of its principal officers and the names and addresses of all directors thereof.
- B. Whether the applicant has previously been licensed as an Ambulance Service, and if so, when and by what state or city and whether such license or registration has been revoked or suspended, and if so, the date of and reason for such revocation or suspension.
- C. The names under which the applicant has engaged, does engage and proposes to engage in ambulance service.
- D. The class of transportation service which the applicant desires to furnish; number of vehicles; a brief description of the kind and type of vehicle; passenger capacity of the vehicle; arrangement; and size and gross weight thereof; model, vehicle identification number, and state license number.
- E. The names and qualifications of each attendant, driver or dispatcher employed, or to be employed, in providing ambulance service.
- F. A description of the applicant's training and orientation program for attendants, drivers and dispatchers.
- G. The names and addresses of at least three (3) residents of the city as references. If the applicant provides service in any other jurisdiction, a letter of reference from the chief executive officer or the highest elected official of that jurisdiction regarding the applicant's qualifications and service within the jurisdiction should be provided.

- Copies of insurance policies, as required by Section 3-8-5 of the Enid Municipal Code.
- A list of the rates and charges as required by Section 3-8-6 of the Enid Municipal Code.
- J. The color(s) and design to be used on the exterior of the vehicle.
- K. Applicant's current financial statement.
- L. Proof that the Ambulance Service is licensed by the Oklahoma Department of Health at the Emergency Medical Services/Paramedic level of service.
- M. The address of the central place of business within the city limits of Enid, as well as the location where vehicles, equipment and personnel will be based within the city limits of Enid
- N. Ambulance License Fee as set out in Section 2-6B-4 of the Enid Municipal Code.

<u>Section XVIII</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Article A, Section 3-8A-3 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8A-3: INVESTIGATION:

Upon receipt of an application for a license, the Mayor and Board of Commissioners shall cause an investigation to be made of the character and reputation of the applicant as a law abiding citizen and the ability of the applicant to render safe and comfortable transportation service and to maintain or replace the equipment for such service, the financial responsibility of the applicant to maintain insurance for the payment of personal injury, death and property damage claims, and other pertinent facts which the Mayor and Board of Commissioners may deem relevant in determining the fitness of the applicant to assume the occupation of an Operator.

Section XIX: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Article A, Section 3-8A-4 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8A-4: PUBLIC HEARING:

Public Hearing; Notice: Upon completion of its investigation, the Mayor and Board of Commissioners shall schedule a public hearing on the application. The Mayor and Board of Commissioners shall give to a license applicant and to all current license holders, notice of any public hearing by the Mayor and Board of Commissioners affecting licenses at least ten (10) days prior to the date of the public hearing, and such notice shall be furnished by certified mail. At the time and place specified in the notice, the Mayor and Board of Commissioners shall accord all persons attending an opportunity to be heard. Following the public hearing, or at a subsequent meeting called

for such purpose, the Mayor and Board of Commissioners shall make its determination, taking into consideration all matters brought to its attention regarding the qualifications of the applicant.

The Mayor and Board of Commissioners shall cause a license to be issued in accordance with the provisions of this Article if it finds that: 1) the applicant meets the required qualifications and criteria; and, 2) the residents of the City of Enid, as a whole, will benefit from the proposed service for which the application has been submitted.

<u>Section XX</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Article A, Section 3-8A-5 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8A-5: ISSUANCE:

The Ambulance Business License, if approved by the Mayor and Board of Commissioners, shall be issued by the City Clerk.

Section XXI: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Article A, Section 3-8A-6 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8A-6: EXPIRATION; RENEWAL AND LATE FEES:

- A. The Ambulance Business License is valid for one (1) year and is non-transferable. Operators may renew their licenses annually upon payment of the fee set out in Section 2-6B-4 of the Enid Municipal Code.
- B. Operators shall be required to pay a late fee of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per month plus the annual license fee to renew an expired Ambulance Business License. Expired licenses may be renewed during the three (3) months immediately following the expiration of said license.
- C. Operators who have allowed their Ambulance Business License to expire in excess of three (3) months will not be allowed to renew their license, but shall be allowed to apply for a new Ambulance Business License.

<u>Section XXII</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Article A, Section 3-8A-7 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8A-7: PROHIBITED CONDUCT:

<u>Ambulance Service shall not:</u>

- A. Fail or neglect to render the full service authorized by his license.
- B. Employ an Operator that has been convicted of a felony or any criminal offense involving moral turpitude.

- C. Obtain a license by an application in which any material fact was omitted or stated falsely.
- D. Permit its motor vehicle(s) to be operated in violation of any law.
- E. Fail to comply with or willfully or knowingly violate any of the provisions of this Chapter or Article.
- F. Give or allow a rebate, commission or any reduced rate discount not provided for in the rates established and prescribed herein.
- G. Induce or seek to induce a change or destination to or from a hospital or other place specified by the person hiring the ambulance.
- H. Employ any person who has been guilty of negligence in the operation of its service.
- Recommend or give favor or advantage to any hospital or mortuary operating in the city.
- J. Allows its insurance to be cancelled, withdrawn or terminated.
- K. Allow its vehicle or equipment to become damaged, deteriorated or unclean to the extent that it is, in the judgment of the Police Department or the Mayor and Board of Commissioners, unfit for public use.

<u>Section XXIII</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Article A, Section 3-8A-8 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8A-8: SUSPENSION; REVOCATION:

Proceedings; Investigation; Notice: An Ambulance Business License may be suspended or revoked for any violation of this Chapter or Article. Proceedings for revocation or suspension of a license shall be undertaken by the Mayor and Board of Commissioners in the same manner as proceedings for issuance of a license. All complaints shall be referred to the Mayor and Board of Commissioners, who shall cause an investigation to be made. Prior to any action for suspension or revocation of a license, the City Clerk shall give ten (10) days' notice thereof by certified mail to the Operator holding the license, that the same will be considered at the next regular meeting of the Mayor and Board of Commissioners, provided the date of such meeting shall not be less than ten (10) days from the date of the notice. The Mayor and Board of Commissioners shall thereupon undertake to consider the complaint and either revoke, suspend, or alter the license or dismiss the complaint.

<u>Section XXIV</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Article B, Sections 3-8B-1 through 3-8B-4 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, are hereby repealed.

<u>Section XXV</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Article B, of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

ARTICLE B AMBULANCE VEHICLE PERMITS

<u>Section XXVI</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Article B, Section 3-8B-1 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8B-1: PERMIT REQUIRED:

Permit Required:

- A. Requirement: No person shall use, drive, or operate any ambulance within the city without first obtaining an Ambulance Vehicle Permit for such ambulance issued pursuant to the provisions of this article.
- B. Exception: The provisions of subsection A of this section shall not apply to an ambulance picking up a patient on sick calls only in the city, and delivering the patient to a destination outside the city, nor shall it apply to an ambulance picking up a patient outside the city and delivering the patient to a destination within the city.

<u>Section XXVII</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Article B, Section 3-8B-2 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8B-2: APPLICATION FORM; CONTENTS; FEE:

Every application for an Ambulance Vehicle Permit shall be in writing, signed and sworn to by the applicant, and shall be filed with the City Clerk. A separate application shall be filed for each ambulance which may be operated in the city. The application shall be on a form provided by the City Clerk and shall contain the following:

- A. Name and address of the Ambulance Service.
- B. Name and address of the Operator.
- C. License number of the vehicle.
- D. Make, model and year of the vehicle.
- E. Motor number.

- F. Vehicle identification number.
- G. Serial number.
- H. State ambulance license number.
- I. Passenger capacity.
- J. Photo(s) of the vehicle.
- K. Copies of insurance policies, as required by Section 3-8-5 of the Enid Municipal Code.
- L. Ambulance Vehicle Permit Fee as set out in Section 2-6B-4 of the Enid Municipal Code.

<u>Section XXVIII</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Article B, Section 3-8B-3 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8B-3: INSPECTION:

- A. All mechanical, safety and special equipment shall be subject to inspection at any time by authorized officials. No ambulance that has been substantially damaged or altered shall be again placed in service until it has been reinspected. All ambulances shall be subject to the same statutes and ordinances, and rules and regulations relating to safety and operating equipment applicable to other motor vehicles in the city.
- B. The Police Department may conduct vehicle inspections of all approved Ambulance Services as often as in their judgment is warranted to maintain adequate standards, and shall have the right to remove any Ambulance from operation for failure to maintain adequate mechanical standards of equipment, or for failure to comply with any of the provisions of this Chapter and this Article.

Section XXIX: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Article B, Section 3-8B-4 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8B-4: **ISSUANCE**:

If the vehicle meets the minimum requirements of this Chapter and Article, the City Clerk shall issue the permit.

<u>Section XXX</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Article B, Section 3-8B-5 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8B-5: EXPIRATION AND RENEWAL:

- A. Ambulance Vehicle Permits are valid for one (1) year and are non-transferable.

 Operators may renew their Ambulance Vehicle Permits annually upon payment of the fee set out in Section 2-6B-4 of the Enid Municipal Code.
- B. Operators shall be required to pay a late fee of ten dollars (\$10.00) per month, or any part thereof, plus the annual permit fee to renew an expired Ambulance Vehicle Permit.

<u>Section XXXI</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Article B, Section 3-8B-6 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8B-6: SUSPENSION; REVOCATION:

If any motor vehicle for which a permit has been issued shall become unsafe for operation, or if its body or interior facilities shall be so damaged, deteriorated or unclean as to render the vehicle unfit for public use, the permit therefor may be suspended until the vehicle shall be made safe for operation and its body shall be repaired and painted, and its interior facilities shall be reconditioned or replaced, as required by this Chapter, or if, in the opinion of the Police Chief, suspension of the permit will not result in the vehicle being made fit for public use, the Police Chief may revoke the permit.

<u>Section XXXII</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Article C, Sections 3-8C-1 through 3-8C-9 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, are hereby repealed.

<u>Section XXXIII</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Article C, of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

ARTICLÉ C DRIVERS AND ATTENDANTS

<u>Section XXXIV</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Article C, Section 3-8C-1 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8C-1: LICENSE REQUIRED; ELIGIBILITY

A. License Required:

- 1. Requirement: No person shall drive, manage, or control an ambulance on any street in the City, or attend or render first aid to a passenger in such ambulance without first obtaining a License issued pursuant to the provisions of this article.
- 2. Exception: The provisions of subsection A of this chapter shall not apply to an ambulance picking up a patient on sick calls only in the city, and delivering the patient to a destination outside the city, nor shall it apply to

an ambulance picking up a patient outside the city and delivering the patient to a destination within the city.

B. Eligibility:

- 1. Applicants for an Ambulance Driver License must, at a minimum:
 - a. Be licensed as an Emergency Medical Technician/Basic (or higher level of care) by the State of Oklahoma.
 - b. Be of good moral character and have a reputation as a law abiding citizen.
 - <u>C.</u> Have a valid Oklahoma driver's license appropriate for the vehicle being driven.
 - d. Have successfully completed an Emergency Vehicle Operator

 Course approved by the Oklahoma Department of Health within the

 last two (2) years
 - e. Be able to speak, read, and write the English language.
 - f. Be at least eighteen (18) years of age.
 - g. Have a satisfactory criminal record, including no convictions of felonies, offenses involving moral turpitude, offenses involving violence or offenses involving the use or possession of or trafficking in any illegal drug.
- 2. Applicants for an Attendant License must, at a minimum, be:
 - a. Licensed as an Emergency Medical Technician/Paramedic (or higher level of care) by the State of Oklahoma.
 - b. Of good moral character and have a reputation as a law abiding citizen.
 - Be able to speak, read, and write the English language.
 - d. Be at least eighteen (18) years of age.
 - e. Have a satisfactory criminal record, including no convictions of felonies, offenses involving moral turpitude, offenses involving violence or offenses involving the use or possession of or trafficking in any illegal drug.

<u>Section XXXV</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Article C, Section 3-8C-2 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8C-2: APPLICATION FORM; CONTENTS; FEE:

Every application for a license shall be in writing, signed and sworn to by the applicant, and shall be filed with the City Clerk. The application shall be on a form provided by the City Clerk and shall contain the following:

- A. Name, sex, age, and address of the applicant.
- B. Name and address of employing Ambulance Service.
- C. The names and addresses of at least three (3) residents of the city as references.
- D. Whether applicant has previously been licensed as an attendant or driver, and if so, when and by what state or city, whether such license or registration has been revoked or suspended, and if so, the date of and reason for such revocation or suspension.
- E. Information regarding criminal offenses and traffic violations, including violation, date of violation, final disposition and jurisdiction.
- F. Copy of Oklahoma driver's license.
- G. If applicant will be an attendant, proof that applicant is licensed by the State of Oklahoma as an Emergency Medical Technician/Paramedic.
- H. If applicant will be a driver, proof that applicant is licensed by the State of Oklahoma as an Emergency Medical Technician/Basic.
- I. If applicant will be a driver, proof that applicant has successfully completed an Emergency Vehicle Operator Course approved by the Oklahoma Department of Health within the last two (2) years.
- J. Ambulance Attendant or Ambulance Driver License Fee as set out in Section 2-6B-4 of the Enid Municipal Code.

<u>Section XXXVI</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Article C, Section 3-8C-3 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8C-3: INVESTIGATION; REPORT REQUIRED:

- A. Investigation: Upon receipt of an application for a license, the Mayor and Board of Commissioners shall cause an investigation to be made of the character and reputation of the applicant as a law abiding citizen.
- B. Report Required; Fingerprinting: The character, reputation, and pertinent knowledge of each applicant for registration as a driver or attendant shall be investigated and a report of such investigation containing any facts relevant to the character and reputation of the applicant shall be placed on file with the Police Department. The fingerprints and photographs of each applicant shall be obtained and placed on file with the Police Department.

<u>Section XXXVII</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Article C, Section 3-8C-4 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8C-4: ISSUANCE OF LICENSE AND IDENTIFICATION CARD:

A. Issuance; Form of ID Card:

- 1. If the Police Chief finds the applicant for registration pursuant to this Article to be a fit and proper person to operate and drive an ambulance according to the standards set forth in this Article and in Oklahoma law, or to attend to patients according to the standards set forth in this Article and in Oklahoma law, he shall so certify to the City Clerk, who shall issue to the applicant either an Ambulance Attendard's License or an Ambulance Driver's License and a driver's identification card.
- 2. The identification card shall be of a form prescribed by the Director of Finance and shall contain a picture of the driver affixed in such a manner that another picture cannot be substituted therefor without detection, the driver's name, license number, card number, and the expiration date of the license. The card shall have a space on the reverse side for entering violations and fines. The color of the license shall be changed each license year.
- B. Display Card in Vehicle: Every driver and attendant licensee under this Article shall display such card in his vehicle in such a manner as to be readily visible at all times.

Section XXXVIII: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Article C, Section 3-8C-5 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8C-5: EXPIRATION; RENEWAL; LATE FEES:

A. Ambulance Attendant and Ambulance Driver Licenses are valid for one (1) year and are non-transferable. Attendants and drivers may renew their licenses annually upon payment of the fee set out in Section 2-6B-4 of the Enid Municipal Code.

B. Attendants and drivers shall be required to pay a late fee of ten dollars (\$10.00) per month, or any part thereof, plus the annual license fee to renew an expired license.

<u>Section XXXIX</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Article C, Section 3-8C-6 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8C-6: PROHIBITED CONDUCT:

Attendants and Drivers shall not:

- A. Refuse, without good cause, to promptly transport or attend to any sick or injured person after responding to a call.
- B. Demand or receive compensation other than that established and prescribed herein or fail to give a receipt for monies received.
- B. Continue in employment after conviction of a felony or any criminal offense involving moral turpitude, any criminal offense involving violence, or any criminal offense involving the possession of or trafficking in illegal drugs.
- C. Obtain a license by an application in which any material fact was omitted or stated falsely.
- D. Operate an ambulance in violation of any law.
- E. Fail to wear the appropriate uniform and to keep his/her person clean and presentable when on duty.
- F. Use abusive or obscene language, or fail to conduct him/herself in a professional manner.
- G. Release a patient until he/she is assured that some responsible person is available to receive such patient.
- H. Use a siren or flashing red light unless on an emergency call.
- I. Disobey the lawful orders of a police officer.
- J. Smoke in or within twenty-five (25) feet of the ambulance.
- K. Fail to comply with or willfully or knowingly violate any of the provisions of this Chapter or Article.
- L. Give or allow a rebate, commission or any reduced rate discount not provided for in the established rate.

- M. Induce or seek to induce a change or destination to or from a hospital or other place specified by the person hiring the ambulance.
- N. Induce, or seek to induce, any person engaging an ambulance, to patronize or retain the services of any hospital, convalescent home, doctor, mortuary, cemetery, attorney, private accident investigator, nurse, or any person that could benefit financially as a result of the inducement.
- O. Act negligently in the operation of an ambulance or in the treatment of a patient.
- P. Recommend or give favor or advantage to any hospital or mortuary operating in the city.
- Q. Operate a vehicle or equipment which has become damaged, deteriorated or unclean to the extent that it is, in the judgment of the Police Department or the Mayor and Board of Commissioners, unfit for public use.
- R. Allow another to use his/her license or identification card.
- S. Make or attempt to make any change or erasure to a license or identification card.

<u>Section XL</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 8, Article C, Section 3-8C-7 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby created to read as follows:

3-8C-7: SUSPENSION; REVOCATION:

Proceedings; Investigation; Notice: An Ambulance Attendant or Ambulance Driver License may be suspended or revoked for any violation of this Chapter or Article or upon a third traffic violation while operating an ambulance. Proceedings for revocation or suspension of a license shall be undertaken by the Mayor and Board of Commissioners. All complaints shall be referred to the Mayor and Board of Commissioners, who shall cause an investigation to be made. Prior to any action for suspension or revocation of a license, the City Clerk shall give ten (10) days' notice thereof by certified mail to the license holder (and to his/her employer), that the same will be considered at the next regular meeting of the Mayor and Board of Commissioners, provided the date of such meeting shall not be less than ten (10) days from the date of the notice. The Mayor and Board of Commissioners shall thereupon undertake to consider the complaint and either revoke, suspend, or alter the license or dismiss the complaint.

<u>Section XLI</u>: Repealer. All ordinances or parts thereof, which are inconsistent with this ordinance, are hereby repealed.

<u>Section XLII</u>: Savings Clause. Nothing in this ordinance hereby adopted shall be construed to affect any suit or proceedings now pending in any court, or any rights acquired or liability incurred, nor any cause or causes of action accrued or existing, under any act or ordinance repealed hereby. Nor shall any right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by this ordinance.

<u>Section XLIII</u>: Severability. If any one or more of the sections, sentences, clauses or parts of this ordinance, chapter or section shall, for any reason, be held invalid, the invalidity of such section, clause or part shall not affect or prejudice in any way the applicability and validity of any other provision of this ordinance. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Commission of the City of Enid that this section of the Enid Municipal Code would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal or invalid sentence, clause, section or part not been included.

Section XLIV: Codification. This ordinance shall be codified as Title 2, Chapter 6, Article B, Section 2-6B-4; Title 3, Chapter 8, Sections 3-8-1 through 3-8-11; Title 3, Chapter 8, Article A, Sections 3-8A-1 through 3-8A-8; Title 3, Chapter 8, Article B, Sections 3-8B-1 through 3-8B-6; and Title 3, Chapter 8, Article C, Sections 3-8C-1 through 3-8C-7 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ENID MUNICIPAL CODE, 2014, SECTION 5-7-1 TO AMEND THE DEFINITION OF PROPER ENCLOSURE; SECTION 5-7A-3, TO PROVIDE FOR IMPRISONMENT FOR CERTAIN VIOLATIONS, MANDATE IMPRISONMENT FOR CERTAIN VIOLATIONS, IN CORRECT GRAMMAR, TO ESTABLISH A FEE FOR THE REGISTRATION OF DANGEROUS AND POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS DOGS, INCREASE THE INSURANCE REQUIREMENT FOR DANGEROUS AND POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS DOGS AND REQUIRE THAT THE CITY BE AN ADDITIONALLY INSURED PRIMARILY FOR NOTIFICATION PURPOSES, REQUIRE THE MICRO CHIPPING AND SPAYING OR NEUTERING OF DANGEROUS AND POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS DOGS, REQUIRE PERIODIC INSPECTIONS TO ENSURE COMPLIANCE WITH THE SPECIAL CONDITIONS FOR KEEPING A DANGEROUS OR POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS DOG, TO INCREASE FINES FOR CERTAIN VIOLATIONS, REQUIRE A DANGEROUS OR POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS DOG TO BE MUZZLED, RESTRAINED AND IN THE CARE OF SOMEONE OVER 16 YEARS OF AGE IF NOT IN ITS PROPER ENCLOSURE; SECTION 5-7A-4, TO MANDATE IMPRISONMENT FOR FAILURE TO SURRENDER AN ANIMAL AND TO CORRECT GRAMMAR.

BACKGROUND:

This ordinance was reviewed at the January 22, 2015 Study Session. It increases penalties for violations of the dangerous and potentially dangerous dog ordinance, increases the insurance requirements for maintaining a dangerous or potentially dangerous dog, and sets various other requirements to maintain a dangerous or potentially dangerous dog.

INCREASE **N**THE TO INSURANCE REQUIREMENT FOR DANGEROUS AND POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS DOGS AND REQUIRE THAT, THE CITY BE AN **ADDITIONALLY** INSURED PRIMARILY FOR NOTIFICATION PURPOSES, TO REQUIRE THE MICRO CHIPPING AND SPAYING OR NEUTERING OF DANGEROUS AND POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS DOGS. TO REQUIRE PERIODIC INSPECTIONS TO ENSURE COMPLIANCE WITH THE SPECIAL CONDITIONS FOR KEEPING A DANGEROUS OR POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS DOG, TO INCREASE FINES FOR CERTAIN VIOLATIONS, TO REQUIRE A DANGEROUS OR POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS DOG TO BE MUZZLED, RESTRAINED AND IN THE CARE OF SOMEONE OVER 16 YEARS OF AGE IF NOT IN ITS PROPER ENCLOSURE; AMENDING TITLE 5, ENTITLED "PUBLIC SAFETY," CHAPTER 7, ENTITLED "ANIMAL CONTROL," ARTICLE A, ENTITLED "DOGS, CATS, FERRETS AND POTBELLIED SECTION 5-7A-4, ENTITLED "RABIES SUSPECTED: IMPOUNDMENT," TO MANDATE IMPRISONMENT FOR FAILURE TO SURRENDER AN ANIMAL AND TO CORRECT GRAMMAR: PROVIDING FOR REPEALER, SAVINGS CLAUSE, SEVERABILITY AND CODIFICATION.

ORDINANCE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF ENID, OKLAHOMA:

<u>Section I: That Title 5, Chapter 7, Section 5-7-1 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby amended to read as follows:</u>

5-7-1: DEFINITIONS:

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this chapter, shall have the

meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

AGGRESSION TRAINED DOG: A dog that has been or is being subjected to any aggression training conducted by the owner of the dog or another.

ANIMALS: Any and all types of animals, both domesticated and wild, male and female.

AT LARGE: Off the premises of the owner or custodian of the animals and not under the immediate control of the owner or custodian.

CURRENTLY VACCINATED: Properly immunized by or under the supervision of a licensed veterinarian with an antirabies vaccine licensed and approved by the United States department of agriculture for use in that animal species. Vaccine must have been given at appropriate time interval(s) for the age of the animal and type of vaccine administered.

DANGEROUS DOG: Any dog that: a) has inflicted severe injury on a human being without provocation on public or private property; or b) has been previously found to be potentially dangerous and the dog thereafter aggressively bites, attacks or endangers the safety of humans; or c) has been previously found to be potentially dangerous, and the dog thereafter attacks any domesticated pet, fowl or livestock which results in the severe injury or death of said domesticated pet, fowl or livestock, either on public or private property.

DOG: Any dog, whether male or female.

DOMESTICATED PET. A tame animal, which because of its close association with human beings, has lost its ability to live in the wild.

EXOTIC ANIMALS Commercially raised animals of the families: bovidae, cervidae, antilocapridae, suidae, and ratites.

EXPOSURE TO RABIES: A bite or physical contact with the saliva or other potentially infectious tissues from an animal confirmed or suspected of being infected with rabies.

FOWL³: Chickens, turkeys, ducks, geese, guineas or game birds.

HOME QUARANTINE: Confinement of the animal at the owner's residence where the residence has the necessary fencing, shelter and supervision to ensure the animal will be confined, isolated from the public, observed and has adequate care. This quarantine also requires an examination by a licensed veterinarian on the first and last day of confinement.

KEEP OR HARBOR: To maintain, possess, control and use.

LAWFULLY ON PRIVATE PROPERTY: A person shall be considered to be lawfully upon the private property of the owner of a dog when he or she is on the property in the performance of any duty imposed upon the persons by the laws of the state of Oklahoma, or its political subdivisions, the city of Enid, or by the laws of the United States, or the postal regulations of the United States or when reading meters or making repairs to any public utility or service located on the premises, or when working on the property upon the invitation, either express or implied, of the owners or lessee of such property, or when on the property for any other lawful purpose.

LIVESTOCK⁴: Cattle, swine, sheep, horses, mules, donkeys, llamas, alpacas, goats, fowl, and includes exotic animals.

NEUTER: To castrate a male dog, cat or potbellied pig in order to render it unable to reproduce.

NEW OWNER OR OWNER: A person legally competent to enter into a contract acquiring a dog or cat from the city of Enid's animal shelter.

OWNER: Any person, firm, corporation, organization or department possessing, harboring, keeping, having an interest in or having control or custody of an animal.

POTBELLIED PIG: Pigs as defined in section 5.74 of this chapter, whether male or female.

POTENTIALLY DANCEROUS DOG: Any dog, whose behavior, temperament, size, or combination thereof, whether on public or private property and when considered under the totality of the circumstances, including the nature of the surrounding area and whether the dog is aggression trained, constitutes a reasonable risk of injury to a human, animal, or damage to personal or real property.

POUND. An establishment for the confinement of dogs, cats or potbellied pigs seized either under the provisions of this chapter or otherwise.

PROPER ENCLOSURE (FOR DANGEROUS OR POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS DOG): While on the owner's property, a dangerous or a potentially dangerous dog shall be securely confined indoors or in a securely enclosed and locked pen or structure with at least one hundred fifty (150) square feet of space for each dog kept there which is over six (6) months of age, and which is suitable to prevent the entry of children, and designed to prevent the animal from escaping. Such pen or structure shall have a secure top and secure sides and shall provide protection from the elements for the dog.

PUBLIC PROPERTY: Any and all public streets, sidewalks, alleyways, easements, buildings, parks, playgrounds and recreational facilities, and any and all places of business, amusement or entertainment which are privately owned, wherein

merchandise, property, services, entertainment or facilities are offered for sale, hire, lease or use.

SELLER OF RABIES VACCINE: Includes the owner of the business, the manager of the store, and/or the employee selling the vaccine to the purchaser.

SEVERE INJURY: Any physical injury that results in broken bones or lacerations requiring multiple sutures or cosmetic surgery.

SPAY: To perform an ovarian hysterectomy on a female dog, cat or potbellied pig in order to render said animal unable to reproduce.

STERILIZATION: To spay or neuter a dog, cat or potbeflied pig.

WILD ANIMAL: Any animal not properly owned by any person, proof of which may include, but is not limited to, license, tag, vaccination, and registration. (Ord. 2009-22, 9-1-2009)

Section II: That Title 5, Chapter 7, Article A, Section 5-7A-3 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby amended to read as follows:

5-7A-3: DANGEROUS AND POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS DOGS²:

- A. Compliance with City Requirements:
 - 1. No person shall own, possess, keep, or harbor any dangerous dog, except as provided for in Subsection D of this Section.
 - 2. The violation of this Subsection A shall be punishable by a fine of up to seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) plus costs and/or by imprisonment for a term of not more than sixty (60) days.

B. Exceptions:

- 1. This Section shall not apply to any animal owned by the police department or other law enforcement agencies.
- 2. Dogs shall not be declared dangerous if the threat, injury or damage was sustained by a person who, at the time, was committing a willful trespass or other tort upon the premises occupied by the owner of the dog or was tormenting, abusing, or assaulting the dog or has, in the past, been observed or reported to have tormented, abused or assaulted the dog or was committing or attempting to commit a crime.
- C. Court Determination; Destruction; Appeal:

1. Complaint; Animal Confined: When any complaint is filed in the Municipal Court alleging that a dangerous dog is owned, possessed, kept, or harbored, then the person against whom the complaint is filed, or any other person having control or custody of the dog alleged to be dangerous, shall immediately deliver the dog to the animal control shelter.

2. Decision to Destroy Dog; Appeal:

- a. If the Court finds the party against whom the complaint is filed guilty of owning, possessing, keeping or harboring a dangerous dog, the Court must determine whether the dog should be destroyed.
- b. If the Municipal Court finds the party against whom the complaint is filed guilty of owning, possessing, keeping or harboring a dangerous dog; and determines the dog is to be destroyed; and the Court's judgment is appealed, then the dog shall not be destroyed until the appeal is disposed of by the District Dourt. If the judgment is not appealed, the dog shall be immediately destroyed.

D. Special Conditions for Maintaining Dangerous Dog

- 1. Registration; Special Conditions of the Court finds the dog should not be destroyed, the dog may be released to the owner only upon completion of these special conditions:
 - a. Register the animal as a dangerous animal with the animal shelter to the City. The application for such registration shall contain the name and address of the owner, the breed, age, sex, color, any other identifying marks of the animal, and the location where the animal is to be kept. The application fee for such registration shall be ten dollars (\$10.00) and shall be in addition to any other fee required to register an animal with the City of Enid.
 - Confine the animal, at all times, either indoors or outdoors, in a proper enclosure, as defined in Section 5-7-1, for a dangerous dog.
 - c. At any time when a dangerous dog is not confined in a proper enclosure, as defined in Section 5-7-1, the animal shall be muzzled and restrained by a substantial chain or leash and under physical restraint of a responsible person over sixteen (16) years of age. The muzzle must not cause injury to the animal or interfere with its vision or respiration, but must prevent the dog from biting any person, dog or other animal.
 - d. Display in a conspicuous place on the owner's premises and on the dog's enclosure a clearly visible warning sign stating that there is a

dangerous dog on the property and stating "Beware of Dangerous Dog". The sign must include a warning symbol that informs children of the dog's presence.

- e. Maintain, in full force and effect, a policy of liability insurance such as homeowner's insurance or surety issued by an insurer qualified under Oklahoma Statutes in the amount of not less than two hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000.00) insuring the owner for any personal injuries inflicted by the dangerous dog and naming the City of Enid as an additionally insured.
- f. Arrange for the alteration of the reproductive capacity of the dog through spaying or neutering of the dog. Such alteration shall be at the owner's expense.
- g. Microchip the dog at the owner's expense.
- h. Monthly inspections of premises by animal control are required. The fee for such inspections is set forth in section 2-6D-2 of this code.
- i. The Court may provide any additional conditions particular to the circumstance surrounding the maintenance of a dangerous dog.
- 2. Noncompliance by Owner; Destruction of Dog: If the owner does not meet all the special conditions required by the Court under this Subsection, the dog will not be released to the owner and it will be destroyed.
- Confiscation and Impoundment:
 - a. If the owner of a dangerous animal violates any of the conditions imposed, the dog shall be immediately confiscated and impounded by the animal control department.
 - Such violation shall be punishable by a fine of up to seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$750.00) plus costs and by a mandatory term of impresonment of not less than twenty (20) days nor more than sixty (50) days.
 - c. Upon conviction, the dog will be destroyed.

E. Potentially Dangerous Dog:

1. Complaint: Any person may file a complaint alleging that a person owns, possesses, keeps or harbors a potentially dangerous dog.

2. Exceptions:

- a. This subsection G shall not apply to any animal owned by the police department or other law enforcement agencies.
- b. Dogs shall not be declared potentially dangerous if the threat, injury or damage was sustained by a person who, at the time, was committing a willful trespass or other tort upon the premises occupied by the owner of the dog or was tormenting, abusing, or assaulting the dog or has, in the past, been observed or reported to have tormented, abused or assaulted the dog or was committing or attempting to commit a crime.
- 3. Court Determination: The Court shall set the matter for a hearing to determine whether the dog is potentially dangerous. The Court will render a finding in writing to the owner.
- 4. Conditions: If the following conditions are not met, the potentially dangerous dog will be seized and destroyed:
 - a. Registration: Upon a finding that the dog is potentially dangerous, the owner must register the dog as potentially dangerous. The application for such registration shall contain the name and address of the owner, the breed, age, sex color, and any other identifying marks of the animal, and location where the animal will be kept. The application fee for such registration shall be ten dollars (\$10.00) and shall be in addition to any other fee required to register an animal with the City of Enid.
 - Confine the animal, at all times, either indoors or outdoors, in a proper enclosure, as defined in Section 5-7-1, for a potentially dangerous dog.
 - At any time when a potentially dangerous dog is not confined in a proper enclosure as defined in Section 5-7-1, the animal shall be muzzled and restrained by a substantial chain or leash and under physical restraint of a responsible person over sixteen (16) years of age. The muzzle must not cause injury to the animal or interfere with its vision or respiration, but must prevent the dog from biting any person, dog or other animal.
 - d. Display in a conspicuous place on the owner's premises and on the dog's enclosure a clearly visible warning sign stating "Beware of Dog". The sign must include a warning symbol that informs children of the dog's presence.

- e. Maintain, in full force and effect, a policy of liability insurance such as homeowner's insurance or surety issued by an insurer qualified under Oklahoma Statutes in the amount of not less than one hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000.00) insuring the owner for any personal injuries inflicted by the dangerous dog and naming the City of Enid as an additionally insured.
- f. Arrange for the alteration of the reproductive capacity of the dog through spaying or neutering of the dog. Such alteration shall be at the owner's expense.
- g. Microchip the dog at the owner's expense.
- h. Inspection: Quarterly inspections of the premises by animal control are required. The fee for such inspections is set forth in section 2-6D-2 of this code.
- i. Other Conditions: The Court may provide any additional conditions particular to the circumstances surrounding the maintenance of a potentially dangerous dog.

5. Confiscation and Impoundment:

- a. If the owner of a potentially dangerous dog violates any of the conditions, the dog shall be immediately confiscated and impounded by the animal control department.
- b. Such violation shall be punishable by a fine of up to seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) plus costs and by a mandatory term of imprisonment of not less than ten (10) days nor more than sixty (60) days
- Upon conviction, the dog will be destroyed.

F. Change of Custody of Dangerous or Potentially Dangerous Dog; Notification:

- 1. Any owner of a dog that has been found to be dangerous or potentially dangerous must notify the animal control shelter if the dog is sold, given away of custody is otherwise transferred. Such written notification shall occur within forty-eight (48) hours of the event and shall contain the name, address and telephone number of the new owner.
- 2. Any owner of a dangerous or potentially dangerous dog must notify in writing the potential owner of the dog's status and conditions of maintenance prior to transferring custody. If the dog remains in City limits, the new owner shall be required to agree to the conditions of maintenance previously imposed by the Court.

- 3. An inspection of the new premises, if in City limits, shall be required. The fee for such inspection is set forth in section <u>2-6D-2</u> of this code.
- 4. The violation of this subsection E shall be punishable by a fine of up to seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) plus costs and/or imprisonment for a term of not more than sixty (60) days.

G. Notification of Escape or Bites:

- 1. Any owner of a dog that has been found to be dangerous or potentially dangerous must notify, within four (4) hours, the Animal Control Shelter if the animal is unconfined, loose, or if it has attacked a person, other animal or other dog.
- 2. Violation of this subsection F shall be punishable by a fine of up to seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) plus costs and/or by a mandatory term of imprisonment of not less than five (5) days nor more than sixty (60) days.
- H. Concealing Dangerous or Potentially Dangerous Dogs:
 - It shall be unlawful for any person to conceal, or cause to be concealed, any dog which has bitten or attacked any person or has been determined to be a dangerous or potentially dangerous dog from any animal control officer or police officer.
 - 2. The violation of this subsection H shall be punishable by a fine of up to seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) plus costs and by a mandatory term of imprisonment of not less than ten (10) days nor more than sixty (60) days
- I. Change of Address of Dangerous or Potentially Dangerous Dog; Notification:
 - 1. Any owner of a dog that has been found to be dangerous or potentially must notify the Animal Control Shelter if the dangerous or potentially dog is moved to a new address. Such written notification shall occur not less than torty-eight (48) hours prior to the move and shall contain the new address and telephone number of the owner, as well as an updated insurance certificate.
 - 2. An inspection of the new premises shall be required. The fee for such inspection is set forth in section <u>2-6D-2</u> of this code.
 - 3. The violation of this Subsection shall be punishable by a fine of up to seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) plus costs and/or imprisonment for a term of not more than sixty (60) days.

- J. Running at Large and Subsequent Attacks:
 - 1. No owner of any dog that has previously, when unprovoked, inflicted bites on any human or severely injured any human either on public or private property or when unprovoked, created an imminent threat of injury or death to any person, may permit such dog to run at large or aggressively bite or attack any person while such person is lawfully upon public or private property.
 - 2. The violation of this subsection I shall be punishable by a fine of up to seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) plus costs and by a mandatory term of imprisonment of not less than thirty (30) days nor more than sixty (60) days. (Ord. 2014-13, 5-6-2014)

Section III: That Title 5, Chapter 7, Article A Section 5-7A-4 of the Enie Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby amended to read as follows:

5-7A-4: RABIES SUSPECTED; IMPQUNDMENT³:

- A. Rabies Quarantine Procedures:
 - 1. Voluntary Impound: Any dog cat or ferret suspected of being afflicted with rabies, or which has bitten a person, shall immediately be voluntarily impounded by the owner under the supervision of a licensed veterinarian for a period of ten (10) days, unless one of the exceptions found in subsection B of this section is applicable.
 - 2. Seizure and impound: If the animal is not immediately voluntarily impounded, the animal shall be seized pursuant to warrant by officers of the animal control shelter and impounded under the supervision of a licensed veterinarian for a period of ten (10) days, or euthanized to allow for immediate rabies testing.
 - 3. Multiple and Severe Wounds; Euthanasia: If the impounded animal has inflicted multiple and severe bite wounds or deep punctures or lacerations to the tace, head, or neck it may be subject to immediate euthanasia to allow for immediate rabies testing.
 - 4. Release or Disposal: For all other impounded dogs, cats or ferrets, if upon examination by a veterinarian at the end of the impoundment, the animal has no signs of rabies, it may be released to the owner, or in the case of a stray, it shall be disposed of in accordance with applicable ordinances.

5. Stray Animals: Any stray dog, cat or ferret suspected of being afflicted with rabies or which has bitten a person shall be subject to being euthanized to allow for immediate rabies testing.

B. Exceptions:

- 1. A dog, cat or ferret that has an owner and is currently vaccinated by a licensed veterinarian with an approved antirabies vaccine and has not inflicted severe injury may be placed in a home quarantine if the animal control officer determines that home circumstances are adequate until the end of a ten (10) day period from the bite.
- 2. A dog, cat or ferret that has an owner, that bites a member of the owner's immediate family and the animal is apparently healthy at the time of the bite incident may be placed in a home quarantine, if the animal control officer determines that the home circumstances are adequate, regardless of vaccination status. The owner must provide proof of rabies vaccination on unvaccinated pets to the animal shelter after completion of the ten (10) day home observation period.
- 3. Animals in service to the blind or hearing impaired, search and rescue dogs or other animals used for police enforcement duties shall be exempt from any quarantine when a proper record of immunization against rabies is established. However, the animal must be examined at the end of the ten (10) day period by a licensed veterinarian.
- 4. For other special circumstances, the Communicable Disease Division (CDD) of the Oklahoma Department of Health will be contacted to determine whether the animal should be quarantined or euthanized.
- C. Failure To Surrender Animal: Any person who fails to surrender any animal to an animal control officer or to a licensed veterinarian for impoundment pursuant to the provisions of this Section shall be punished by a fine of up to seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) plus costs and by a mandatory term of imprisonment of not less than ten (10) days nor more than sixty (60) days.

D. Redemption of Impounded Animals:

- 1. Any impounded dog or cat which has a current license on it shall be held ten (10) days, during which time the owner or keeper of such dog or cat may redeem it upon payment of the fees as established in subsection 2-6D-2B of this code.
- Any unlicensed or unredeemed animal may be destroyed or adopted by any person who follows the procedures identified in section <u>5-7A-5</u> of this article and pays the fees as established in subsection <u>2-6D-2B</u> of this

code. No such animal shall be destroyed or sold unless its owner has been given at least two (2) days' written notice of such impoundment. Such notice shall be written and shall be either mailed to the owner, if his name and address are known, or posted at the animal control shelter if the name and address of the owner are not known.

- E. Authority of Police to Destroy: Notwithstanding the provisions of subsections A and C of this section, members of the police department and authorized employees of the animal control shelter may kill or destroy any animal which is vicious or which they are unable to take up and have impounded.
- F. Spaying or Neutering; Refund of Certain Fees:
 - 1. Any owner who redeems a dog or cat under the terms of subsection D of this section shall have the impoundment fees charged under subsection D of this section refunded, exclusive of the license and boarding fees, if the dog or cat is spayed or neutered within sixty (60) days of the date of redemption for an adult animal, or in the case of an infant animal, within thirty (30) days of the date a female animal attained the age of eight (8) months.
 - 2. A certificate presented to the City, signed by a licensed veterinarian certifying to the spaying or castration shall be proof that the dog or cat has been spayed or castrated. (Ord. 2014-13, 5-6-2014)

<u>Section IV</u>: Repealer All ordinances or parts thereof, which are inconsistent with this ordinance, are hereby repealed

Section V: Savings Clause. Nothing in this ordinance hereby adopted shall be construed to affect any suit or proceedings now pending in any court, or any rights acquired or liability incurred, nor any cause or causes of action accrued or existing, under any act or ordinance repealed hereby. Nor shall any right or remedy of any character be lost impaired or affected by this ordinance.

<u>Section VI</u>: Severability. If any one or more of the sections, sentences, clauses or parts of this ordinance, chapter or section shall, for any reason, be held invalid, the invalidity of such section, clause or part shall not affect or prejudice in any way the applicability and validity of any other provision of this ordinance. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Commission of the City of Enid that this section of the Enid Municipal Code would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal or invalid sentence, clause, section or part not been included.

<u>Section VII</u>: Codification. This ordinance shall be codified as Title 5, Chapter 7, Section 5-7-1 and Title 5, Chapter 7, Article A, Sections 5-7A-3 and 5-7A-4, of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014.

By acceptance of this permit, the permittee agrees to operate and maintain the facility in accordance with the Public Water Supply Operation rules (OAC 252:631) and to comply with the State Certification laws, Title 59, Section 1101-1116 O.S. and the rules and regulations adopted thereunder regarding the requirements for certified operators.

This permit is issued subject to the following provisions and conditions.

- 1) That the recipient of the permit is responsible that the project receive supervision and inspection by competent and qualified personnel.
- 2) That construction of all phases of the project will be started within one year of the date of approval or the phases not under construction will be resubmitted for approval as a new project.
- That no significant information necessary for a proper evaluation of the project has been omitted or no invalid information has been presented in applying for the permit.
- 4) That the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality shall be kept informed of occurrences which may affect the eventual performance of the works or that will unduly delay the progress of the project.
- That the issuing of this permit does not relieve the responsible parties from any damage which may occur as the result of the location and operation of the well(s) in this area.
- That chemical and radiological analyses of the water will be furnished to this Department before the water is served to the public, to assure that it meets the requirements of the Federal Safe Drinking Water Act and Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality Rules.
- 7) That before placing this facility into service, at least two samples of the water, taken on two (2) consecutive days, shall be tested for bacteria to show that it is safe for drinking purposes.
- 8) That the permittee will retain permanent control of an area at least 50 feet in all directions from the well, in order to preclude any construction or action which will subject the well to the danger of pollution.

- 9) That any deviations from approved plans or specifications affecting capacity, flow or operation of units must be approved by the Department before any such deviations are made in the construction of this project.
- 10) That the water well(s) not be placed in operation until written approval is granted by this Department.
- That the recipient of the permit is responsible for the continued operation and maintenance of these facilities in accordance with rules and regulations adopted by the Environmental Quality Board, and that this Department will be notified in writing of any sale or transfer of ownership of these facilities.
- That the water leaving the well will be non-corrosive as determined by a calcium carbonate saturation index (Langelier index), and if full time chlorination is required, the water shall contain at least 1.0 mg/l free chlorine or 2.0 mg/l combined.


