MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF

MAYOR AND BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF ENID, OKLAHOMA,

HELD ON THE 7TH DAY OF APRIL 2015

The Mayor and Board of Commissioners of the City of Enid, County of Garfield, State of

Oklahoma, Trustees of the Enid Municipal Authority, a Public Trust, and the Trustees of the Enid

Economic Development Authority, a Public Trust, met in regular meeting in the Council Chambers of the

Administration Building of the City of Enid, located at 401 West Owen K. Garriott Road in said city, at

6:30 P.M. on the 7th day of April 2015, pursuant to notice given by December 15, 2014 to the Clerk of

the City of Enid, and pursuant to notice thereof displayed at the entrance to the Administration Building

of said city, in prominent view and which notice was posted prior to 5:00 P.M. on the 6th day of April

2015.

-MAYOR AND BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS-

Mayor Shewey called the meeting to order with the following members present and absent:

PRESENT: Commissioners Janzen, Brownlee, Ezzell, Timm, Wilson and Mayor Shewey.

ABSENT: Commissioner Vanhooser.

Staff present were City Manager Jerald Gilbert, Assistant City Manager Joan Riley, City Attorney

Andrea Chism, City Clerk Linda Parks, Director of Engineering Services Christopher Gdanski, Public

Works Director Robinson Camp, Planning Administrator Chris Bauer, Police Chief Brian O'Rourke,

Safety Director Billy McBride, and Ex-Officio Member Chief Master Sergeant Peter Speen.

Pastor Carl Roberts from Grace Ministries gave the Invocation, and Chief Master Sergeant Peter

Speen led the Flag Salute.

Motion was made by Commissioner Janzen and seconded by Commissioner Timm to approve the minutes of the special Commission meeting of March 13, 2015, and the regular Commission meeting of March 17, 2015, and the vote was as follows:

AYE: Commissioners Janzen, Brownlee, Ezzell, Timm, Wilson and Mayor Shewey.

NAY: None.

Officer Gene Robertson introduced "Sasha," a three-month old female Chihuahua, available for adoption at the Enid Animal Shelter.

City Manager Jerald Gilbert recognized the Northwest Oklahoma Elite Enid basketball team for participating in and winning the Oklahoma State Championship for 5th grade boys basketball. Mayor Bill Shewey presented Enid coins to the players and coaches during the presentation. Those recognized were coaches Rashad Sullivan, Chad Owens and Zack Slater, and players Treyton Owens, Jayden Ward, Jaxyn Ward, Ethan Slater, Reese Slater, Brock Slater, Camden Mathis, Trenten Smith, and Taurion Taye Sullivan.

A proclamation was read and presented proclaiming the month of April 2015 as "Child Abuse Prevention Month."

A Letter of Commendation was presented to employee Eugene Harrington for superb execution of his duties as a commercial operator for the City of Enid's Solid Waste Services Department, during a fire in the solid waste bin of his assigned truck on the morning of April 3, 2015. Without hesitation, and disregard for his own safety, Mr. Harrington moved the vehicle to a safe location, away from private property and bystanders, and provided crucial assistance in isolating and extinguishing the fire. His presence of mind, initiative and courage helped ensure the safety of citizens and private property, and preventing serious damage to a critical piece of City equipment. Mr. Harrington's selfless devotion to

duty reflects great credit upon himself and the City of Enid, and in keeping with the highest standards expected of a public servant.

A hearing was held regarding the Fiscal Year 2015 Annual Action Plan, and to consider \$399,384.00 of proposed allocations as recommended by the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Funding Commission.

Opening comments were made by Ms. Stephanie Carr, CDBG Administrator. She explained that the City of Enid, as an Entitlement City for the receipt of CDBG funds, was required to submit an annual action plan (Plan) for expenditure of funds to the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD.) She noted that the amount of CDBG funds available to the City of Enid was determined by HUD, and that the funding allocation for Fiscal Year 2015 had been approved in the amount of \$399,384.00. She stated that the City of Enid was obligated to repay a Section 108 Loan, and administration costs to oversee all projects, leaving a balance of \$159,248.20 for other projects. She went on to say that the CDBG Funding Commission and met and made funding recommendations for the 2015 allocation per the attachment submitted with the Commission's agenda. She added that the purpose of the public hearing was to receive comments from interested citizens regarding the Plan, and that a resolution to approve the Plan would be considered at the April 14, 2015 Commission meeting.

Mr. Clifford Porter, Executive Director of the Booker T. Washington Community Center, addressed the Commission regarding his request submitted for Booker T.'s After School Program in the amount of \$60,000.00. He noted that the CDBG Funding Commission had recommended partial funding in the amount of \$5,000.00 for said program, and asked that the Commission reconsider the recommendation, and fund \$60,000.00 as requested.

Mr. Sean Byrne, board member of the Booker T. Washington Community Center, spoke in support of the After School Program. He asked that commissioners look at funding and priorities, and the successes Booker T. Washington had contributed to the community.

Ms. Cheri Ezzell, Executive Director of the Community Development Support Association (CDSA), thanked commissioners for their continued support of CDSA's emergency repair program for ADA low income individuals and HOME delivery projects.

Ms. Peggy Kenaga, Taft Elementary School Principal, spoke regarding the funding request for upgrades to playground equipment at Taft Elementary School, and thanked commissioners for the opportunity to utilize CDBG funds for the project.

Mr. Craig Vance, Director of Northwest Oklahoma Disabled American Veterans, addressed commissioners regarding his request of \$313,773.00 for improvements to the City of Enid's Train Depot building, and \$40,000.00 to erect a playground on the premises. He noted that neither project had been recommended for funding, and asked that commissioners reconsider the recommendations and fund a portion of the amount requested.

Following lengthy discussion regarding the criteria used by the Funding Commission to rank and prioritize projects submitted, and the recommended allocation of funds, the hearing concluded.

A hearing was held regarding an ordinance amending Section 2-6B-16 in Article B, Chapter 6, Title 2 of the Enid Municipal Code 2014, entitled "Salvage Yard License;" amending Sections 3-10-1 through 3-10-8 in Chapter 10, Title 3, entitled "Salvage Yards;" amending Section 11-8B-4 in Article B, Chapter 8, Title 11, entitled "Uses By Review;" and amending Section 11-8C-3 in Article C, Chapter 8, Title 11, entitled "District Use Regulations."

City Attorney Andrea Chism explained that because the proposed ordinance affected the City's zoning regulations, per State Statutes, a public hearing was required. She went on to say that the ordinance would add impound lots to the City's ordinances regulating salvage yards, and would provide the same regulations for impound lots as those currently existing for salvage yards.

There being no comments, the hearing concluded.

A hearing was held on a land use amendment for property located at the southwest corner of North Oakwood Road and West Purdue Avenue, from Medium Intensity Commercial Designation to Low Intensity Residential Designation.

Planning Administrator Chris Bauer spoke regarding the land use amendment. He stated that infrastructure was available to support the land use change, and if approved, the property would be used for single family housing.

There being no comments, the hearing concluded.

A hearing was held regarding the rezoning of property located at the southwest corner of North Oakwood Road and West Purdue Avenue, from "A" Agriculture District to "R-2" Residential Single Family District.

Mr. Bauer noted that this was a companion to the hearing previously conducted to amend the land use for said property, and if approved, the property would be used for single family housing,

There being no comments, the hearing concluded.

A hearing was held regarding the rezoning of property located in the 5000 Block of East Owen K. Garriott Road, from "I-1" Planned Industrial Park District to "I-2" Light Industrial District.

Mr. Bauer stated that the property was currently undeveloped, and if approved, would be used for an oil field energy industry service yard. He advised commissioners that infrastructure was available, with road access to State Highway 412, and water and sewer off of 54th Street.

There being no comments, the hearing concluded.

Motion was made by Commissioner Timm and seconded by Commissioner Janzen to approve a resolution modifying the Land Use Map of the Enid Metropolitan Area Comprehensive Plan 2025 for property located at the southwest corner of North Oakwood Road and West Purdue Avenue, from

Medium Intensity Commercial Designation to Low Intensity Residential Designation, and the vote was as

follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 2015-12

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 11 CHAPTER 2, SECTION 11-2-1 OF THE ENID MUNICIPAL CODE, 2014, BY CHANGING THE ZONING ON A CERTAIN PROPERTY AND

DESCRIBING THE SAME. AMENDING THE ZONING MAP ACCORDINGLY.

A presentation regarding the Kaw Lake Alternate Water Supply Development Program request

for proposals was made by Director of Engineering Services Christopher Gdanski. Mr. Gdanski

discussed the process used by staff to evaluate presentations made by the top three firms at the April 1,

2015 special Commission meeting to identify the best qualified firm. He stated that the firm would

complete Phase I objectives of the Program, to include establishing program management processes and

controls, conducting preliminary engineering, and initiating the permitting process. He advised

commissioners that it was staff's recommendation to identify the firm of Garver Engineers, LLC,

Norman, Oklahoma, as the best qualified firm, and to authorize staff to begin contract negotiations with

the firm for the project.

Oklahoma, as the best qualified firm, and authorize staff to begin contract negotiations with the firm for

the project.

A presentation was made by City Engineer Robert Hitt regarding Change Order No. 1 with

Luckinbill, Inc., for Project No. W-1409A, Broadway Waterline Replacement. Mr. Hitt provided a brief

overview of the project, and advised commissioners that the change order provided additional work to

accommodate extensive boring to clear existing utilities, and adjusted final quantities as measured in

place at an additional cost of \$101,471.92, for a total revised contract amount of \$781,331.92.

said change order as presented, and the vote was as follows:

entitled "Restaurants, Cafes," to rename the section, increase the annual fee for drive-in restaurants and

include new fees for mobile food vendor licenses; repealing Sections 3-3-1 through 3-3-15 in Chapter 3,

Title 3, Sections 3-4-1 through 3-4-10 in Chapter 4, Title 3, and Sections 3-5-1 through 3-5-6 in Chapter

5, Title 3, entitled "Business And License Regulations;" creating Sections 3-3-1 through 3-3-12 in

Chapter 3, Title 3, entitled "Business And License Regulations," to adopt portions of State law and rules

of the Oklahoma Department of Health governing food service establishments and requiring compliance

with all applicable laws, rules and regulations governing said establishments, providing definitions,

requiring licenses for the operation of food service establishments, providing punishment for violations,

requiring licensees to collect tax, providing terms and expiration of licenses, requiring licenses to be

posted, providing sanitation and miscellaneous requirements, providing the authority for suspension or

revocation of licenses and the process for reinstatement or appeal, and providing application procedures,

eligibility, required information, conditions of issuance, and geographical and other restrictions; and

amending Section 3-11-1 in Chapter 11, Title 3, entitled "Business And License Regulations," to remove

the sale of foodstuffs from the definition of solicitation and allow schools and universities to fund raise

without requiring a solicitor's certificate of registration, and the vote was as follows:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ENID MUNICIPAL CODE, 2014, TITLE 2, ENTITLED "FINANCE AND TAXATION," CHAPTER 6, ENTITLED "FEE SCHEDULE," ARTICLE B, ENTITLED "BUSINESS RELATED FEES," SECTION 2-6B-8, ENTITLED "RESTAURANTS, CAFES," TO RENAME THE SECTION, INCREASE THE ANNUAL FEE FOR DRIVE-IN RESTAURANTS AND INCLUDE NEW FEES FOR MOBILE FOOD VENDOR LICENSES; REPEALING TITLE 3, ENTITLED "BUSINESS AND LICENSE REGULATIONS," CHAPTER 3, ENTITLED "FOOD AND DRINK," SECTIONS 3-3-1 THROUGH 3-3-15; REPEALING TITLE 3, ENTITLED "BUSINESS AND LICENSE REGULATIONS," CHAPTER 4, ENTITLED "DRIVE IN RESTAURANTS," SECTIONS 3-4-1 THROUGH 3-4-10; REPEALING TITLE 3, ENTITLED "BUSINESS AND LICENSE REGULATIONS," CHAPTER 5, ENTITLED "OUTDOOR CAFES," SECTIONS 3-5-1 THROUGH 3-5-6; CREATING TITLE 3, ENTITLED "BUSINESS AND LICENSE REGULATIONS," CHAPTER 3, ENTITLED "FOOD SERVICE ESTABLISHMENTS." SECTIONS 3-3-1 THROUGH 3-3-12. TO ADOPT PORTIONS OF STATE LAW AND RULES OF THE OKLAHOMA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH GOVERNING FOOD SERVICE ESTABLISHMENTS AND REQUIRE COMPLIANCE WITH ALL APPLICABLE LAWS, RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING SAID ESTABLISHMENTS, PROVIDE DEFINITIONS, REQUIRE LICENSES FOR THE OPERATION OF FOOD SERVICE ESTABLISHMENTS AND PROVIDE PUNISHMENT FOR VIOLATIONS, REQUIRE LICENSEES TO COLLECT TAX, PROVIDE TERMS AND EXPIRATION OF LICENSES, REQUIRE LICENSES TO BE POSTED, PROVIDE SANITATION AND MISCELLANEOUS REQUIREMENTS, PROVIDE THE AUTHORITY FOR SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF LICENSE AND THE PROCESS FOR REINSTATEMENT OR APPEAL AND PROVIDING APPLICATION PROCEDURES, ELIGIBILITY, REQUIRED INFORMATION, CONDITIONS OF ISSUANCE AND GEOGRAPHICAL AND OTHER RESTRICTIONS; AMENDING TITLE 3, ENTITLED "BUSINESS AND LICENSE REGULATIONS," CHAPTER 11, ENTITLED "SOLICITING," SECTION 3-11-1, ENTITLED "DEFINITIONS," TO REMOVE THE SALE OF FOODSTUFFS FROM THE DEFINITION OF SOLICITATION AND TO ALLOW SCHOOLS UNIVERSITIES TO FUNDRAISE WITHOUT REQUIRING A SOLICITOR'S CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION; PROVIDING FOR REPEALER, SAVINGS CLAUSE, SEVERABILITY AND CODIFICATION.

public improvements in conjunction with the Walmart Neighborhood Market project located near the intersection of North Cleveland Street and West Chestnut Avenue.

City Manager Jerald Gilbert spoke regarding the agreement, stating that while developing the project, MVG had installed, and intended to install additional public improvements over and above what was required by City ordinances. He stated that the improvements, totaling \$636,269.25, fit with the City's future infrastructure plans in the area, and recommended that MVG be reimbursed for the work completed to date. He went on to say that he agreed with commissioners that an agreement should have been approved prior to the improvements being done, and stated that for future developments, costs for improvements above and beyond those required would not be reimbursed without prior consideration and approval by the Commission.

Motion was made by Commissioner Vanhooser to approve the reimbursement to MVG in the amount of \$636,269.25, utilizing the second draft agreement prepared and submitted to the Commission by the City Attorney.

Motion was seconded by Commissioner Brownlee.

It was noted by City Attorney Andrea Chism that if approved, AC Developments, LLC, would not be a party to the agreement.

Discussion followed.

Commissioner Ezzell stated that he could not support the reimbursement based on MVG's numbers.

Commissioner Vanhooser responded, stating that he had voiced the same concerns. However, he noted that the work completed by MVG had gone through bid processes, numbers had come in higher than the amount being requested, and he was comfortable with the amount based on the bids received.

Following further discussion, the vote was taken as follows:

A brief overview of the Kaw Lake Alternate Water Supply Development Program, Project No. W-1412, and proposals received for Phase I Program Management Services, was given by Director of Engineering Services Christopher Gdanski. He noted that at the March 13, 2015 Special Commission meeting, commissioners had identified the top three firms to make presentations to the Commission for said services, and explained that the selected firm would establish strong program management processes and controls, initiate a storage contract and environmental review processes and permitting, refine program costs and schedule estimates, and develop data required to initiate Phase II of the project.

Presentations were made by the top three firms requested by commissioners. Those included Black & Veach, Overland Park, Kansas, Burns & McDonnell, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, and Garver Engineers, LLC, Norman, Oklahoma. Representatives from each firm made presentations regarding their teams' program management approaches and controls, and key components to the process in preparing and implementing Phase I of the Program. Following each presentation, representatives addressed questions and concerns voiced by the Commission.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ENID MUNICIPAL CODE. 2014. **ENTITLED** "ZONING," CHAPTER 10. **ENTITLED** "SUPPLEMENTAL ZONES," ARTICLE A ENTITLED "PUD PLANNED **DEVELOPMENT," SECTION** 11-10A-9. **ENTITLED** "RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENTS; USES PERMITTED," TO PERMIT BOARDING OR ROOMING HOUSES WITHIN A PUD IN THE R-3 RESIDENTIAL ZONING DISTRICT AND DELETING LANGUAGE REGULATING SIGNS: PROVIDING FOR REPEALER, SAVINGS CLAUSE, SEVERABILITY, AND CODIFICATION.

ORDINANCE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF ENID, OKLAHOMA:

<u>Section I</u>: That Title 11, Chapter 10, Article A, Section 11-10A-9, of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby amended to read as follows:

11-10A-9: RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENTS; USES PERMITTED:

A. Principal Uses:

- 1. When located in R-1, R-2, R-4, or R-5 districts, the development may consist of one or more dwelling unit types permitted in the R-7 district subject to the density limitations specified in section <a href="https://doi.org/10.100/j.com/
- 2. Mobile home dwellings are permitted uses only within PUDs which are located in whole or in part in an R-3 district. Mobile home developments may be reallocated in comparable acreage within the PUD irrespective of the general R-3 zoning district boundaries if such uses are designed and located to be compatible with other uses of the PUD and with the residential use of adjacent properties.
- 3. Boarding or Rooming houses are permitted uses only within PUDs which are located in whole or in part in an R-3 district. Boarding or Rooming house developments may be reallocated in comparable acreage within the PUD irrespective of the general R-3 zoning district boundaries if such uses are designed and located to be compatible with other uses of the PUD and with the residential use of adjacent properties.
- B. Accessory Uses: Accessory uses customarily incidental to principal uses within the PUD are permitted. In addition to accessory uses customarily incidental to permitted principal residential uses, accessory commercial facilities may be

included within the residential portion of a PUD in accordance with the following standards:

1.

The accessory commercial uses may include, but not be limited to, the following uses:*
Athletic clubs and facilities (public or private).
Bakery, retail only.
Barbershop.
Beauty shop.
Bookstore.
Cafeteria.
Candy store.
Dairy store.
Delicatessen.
Dry cleaning, pick up.
Food specialty store.
Gift, novelty, souvenir shop.
Grocery (other than supermarkets).
Health food store.
Hobby store.
Ice cream store.
Laundry, pick up.
Liquor store.
Newsstand.
Office (performing services to residential areas).

Pharmacy.

Private club.

Pro shop.

Restaurant (other than drive ins).

Shoe repair shop.

Tailor shop.

Tobacco store.

*Uses other than those listed above must be specifically approved by the planning commission.

- 2. In residential PUDs, the aggregate floor area of accessory commercial uses shall not exceed fifty (50) square feet per dwelling unit or a total of thirty thousand (30,000) square feet, whichever is less, exclusive of tennis, swimming, racquetball, and health facilities.
- 3. Each accessary commercial establishment, except private clubs or restaurants, shall be limited to a maximum of three thousand five hundred (3,500) square feet enclosed floor area.
- 4. The accessory commercial uses shall be internally oriented, designed primarily for the service, convenience and benefit of the residents of the PUD, and shall be designed and located in such a manner as to be compatible with the residential uses of the PUD and of adjacent properties. No freestanding accessory commercial structure shall be located within three hundred feet (300') of the perimeter of the PUD.
- 5. All unenclosed parking lots within residential PUDs containing more than ten (10) spaces shall contain a minimum of ten foot (10') landscaped strips along all street frontages with shade trees planted in an amount equivalent to one shade tree for every thirty five feet (35') of street frontage. In addition, the remaining perimeter of the parking lot shall be planted with a four foot (4') landscaped strip and shade trees in the amount equivalent to one shade tree for every fifty feet (50') of the perimeter which does not abut upon a public street. For the purposes of this article, landscaped strips may include trees, shrubs, flower beds, planted earthen berms, and other vegetation as well as ornamental objects such as decorative fences, walls, statues, and fountains.

<u>Section II</u>: Repealer. All ordinances or parts thereof, which are inconsistent with this ordinance, are hereby repealed.

<u>Section III</u>: Savings Clause. Nothing in this ordinance hereby adopted shall be construed to affect any suit or proceedings now pending in any court, or any rights acquired or liability incurred, nor any cause or causes of action accrued or existing, under any act or ordinance repealed hereby. Nor shall any right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by this ordinance.

<u>Section IV</u>: Severability. If any one or more of the sections, sentences, clauses or parts of this ordinance, chapter or section shall, for any reason, be held invalid, the invalidity of such section, clause or part shall not affect or prejudice in any way the applicability and validity of any other provision of this ordinance. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Commission of the City of Enid that this section of the Enid Municipal Code would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal or invalid sentence, clause, section or part not been included.

<u>Section V</u>: Codification. This ordinance shall be codified as Title 11, Chapter 10, Article A, Section 11-10A-9 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014.

BACKGROUND:

The City of Enid, as an entitlement city for the receipt of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds, is required to submit a Five Year Consolidated Plan and annual action plan for expenditure and use of CDBG funds to the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The plans adhere to federal requirements to undertake projects that provide decent housing, expand economic opportunities and provide a suitable living environment for the City's low-and moderate-income residents and areas. All public hearing requirements have been met and public participation was encouraged. The required components of the plan include a Housing Market Analysis; a Housing and Homeless Needs Assessment; a Non-Housing Community Needs Assessment; a Strategic Plan and an annual Action Plan for the current funding year. This year, the 2015 Annual Action Plan has been prepared in house by CDBG staff. The plan includes the 2015 Action Plan of activities recommended for funding by the CDBG Funding Committee.

The total amount of funding for this program is \$399,384. The CDBG Funding Committee and City staff met and made a funding recommendation, those recommendations were presented during the public hearing held April 7, 2015.

This ordinance was reviewed by the Commission at the April 7, 2015, Study Session. This ordinance provides an occupational tax for State licenses, including two new licenses, and provides for City licensing of beer retailers.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ENID MUNICIPAL CODE, 2014, TITLE 2, ENTITLED "FINANCE AND TAXATION," CHAPTER 6, ENTITLED "FEE SCHEDULE," ARTICLE B, ENTITLED "BUSINESS RELATED FEES," SECTION 2-6B-3, ENTITLED "ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES: LOW POINT BEER." TO INCLUDE NEW AND ADDITIONAL LICENSES, DIFFERENTIATE BETWEEN MITIAL AND RENEWAL FEES WHERE REQUIRED BY STATE LAW TO INCREASE CERTAIN LICENSE FEES TO MATCH STATE LAW AND TO DECREASE LOW-POINT BEER RETAILER FEES, AMENDING TITLE 3, ENTITLED "BUSINESS AND LICENSE REGULATIONS." CHAPTER 2. ENTITLED "ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES." ARTICLE A. CHAPTER 2, ENTITLED "ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES," ARTICLE B, ENTITLED "LOW POINT BEER," SECTION 3-2B-5, ENTITLED "LICENSE FEE," TO PROVIDE FOR PROPATION AND FOR THREE YEAR LICENSES; AMENDING TITLE 3 ENTITLED EUSINESS AND LICENSE REGULATIONS," CHAPTER 2. ENTITLED "ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES." ARTICLE B. ENTITLED "LOW POINT BEER," SECTION 3-2B-6, ENTITLED "EXPIRATION OF LICENSE." TO PROVIDE FOR THREE YEAR LICENSES: AMENDING TITLE 3. ENTITLED "BUSINESS AND LICENSE REGULATIONS," CHAPTER 2, ENTITLED "ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES." ARTICLE B, ENTITLED "LOW POINT BEER," SECTION 3-28-8. ENTITIED "PERMITTING VIOLATION OF LAWS ON PREMISES," TO ALLOW THE REVOCATION OF LOW POINT BEER LICENSES FOR VIOLATIONS OF CRIMINAL LAWS ON THE PREMISES: PROVIDING FOR REPEALER, SAVINGS CLAUSE, SEVERABILITY AND CODIFICATION.

ORDINANCE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF ENID, OKLAHOMA:

<u>Section I</u>: That Title 2, Chapter 6, Article B, Section 2-6B-3 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby amended to read as follows:

2-6B-3: ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES; LOW POINT BEER:

A. Tax Imposed¹:

- The occupation tax for those service organizations which are exempt under section 501(c)(19), (8) or (10) of the internal revenue code for mixed beverage or bottle club license shall be five hundred dollars (\$500.00) per year.
- As provided in subsection 3-2A-5A2 of this code, every applicant for a certificate of compliance with the zoning, fire, health and safety codes of the city, required by Title 37 of the Oklahoma Statutes, shall pay a verification and certification fee in the amount of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) at the time of filing.
- B. Low Point Beer, Retail License²: The fee required in section <u>3-2B-5</u> of this code shall be sixty dollars (\$60.00) for sales of low point beer for consumption on or off the premises and thirty dollars (\$30.00) for selling such beer in original packages and not for consumption on the premises. (Ord. 2005-36, 12-20-2005)

<u>Section II</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 2, Article A, Section 3-2A-3 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby amended to read as follows:

3-2A-3: PAYMENT REQUIRED; PENALTY:

- A. Payment; Provide Copy of State License: Any state licensee or interim licensee originally entering upon any occupation listed in Section 2-6B3 shall pay the tax therefor at the office of the city clerk on or before the date upon which he enters upon such occupation. Said licensee or interim licensee shall provide a copy of his current state license or interim license before payment of an occupation tax will be accepted.
- B. Term; Prorating Fee: The tax levied under this article shall be for one year, expiring on the date upon which the licensee's State license expires. It paid during the year, the fee shall be prorated on a monthly basis. It paid before the fifteenth day of any month, the tax shall be on the basis as of the first day of said month and if paid after the fifteenth day of any month, the tax shall be on the basis of the first day of the next month.
- C. Issuance, Posting of Receipt: Upon payment of the said occupation tax, the City Clerk shall issue a receipt to said State licensee or interim licensee, which State licensee or interim licensee shall post in a conspicuous place on the premises wherein he carries on his occupation.
- D. Violation: Any person who engages in any of the occupations taxed by this article without paying said occupation tax imposed therefore, or without paying said occupation tax imposed therefore in advance of such operation, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction, shall be punished by a maximum fine of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) plus costs, and/or by imprisonment in the Garfield County Detention Facility for a term of not more than sixty (60) days. Each day of such violation shall constitute a separate offense. (1994 Code § 3-23)

Section III: That Title 3. Chapter 2, Article B, Section 3-2B-2 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby amended to read as follows:

3-2B-2: LICENSE REQUIRED4:

- A. No person shall sell, distribute or dispense any low point beer at retail to the public without first having procured a license from the director of finance. (1994 Code § 3-51)
- B. Violation: Any person who engages in the retail sale of low point beer without first having procured a license shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction, shall be punished by a maximum fine of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) plus costs, and/or by imprisonment in the Garfield County Detention Facility for a term of not more than sixty (60) days. Each day of such violation shall constitute a separate offense.

<u>Section IV</u>: That Title 3, Chapter 2, Article B, Section 3-2B-5 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby amended to read as follows:

3-2B-5: LICENSE FEE:

The license fee to be paid to the director of finance for a three-year license for selling low point beer for consumption on or off the premises shall be as established in subsection 2-6B-3B of this code, and the fee a three-year license for selling such beer in original packages and not for consumption on the premises shall be as established in said subsection 2-6B-3B of this code. (1994 Code § 3-54). To ensure the license expires simultaneously with the licensee's County permit, the fee shall be prorated on a monthly basis for terms of less than three (3) years. If paid before the fifteenth day of any month, the tax shall be on the basis as of the first day of said month and if paid after the fifteenth day of any month, the tax shall be on the basis of the first day of the next month.

Section V: That Title 3, Chapter 2, Article B, Section 3-2B-6 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby amended to read as follows:

3-2B-6: EXPIRATION OF LICENSE.

A license issued pursuant to the provisions of this Article shall be valid up to three (3) years and shall expire simultaneously with the licensee's Garfield County permit. (1994 Code § 3-55)

Section VI: That Title 3, Chapter 2, Article B, Section 3-2B-8 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby amended to read as follows:

3-2B-8: PERMITTING VIOLATION OF LAWS ON PREMISES:

No owner, operator, proprietor or manager of any place where low point beer is sold shall permit:

- A Any violation of the laws of the city or of the state relating to low point beer, narcotic or dangerous drug faws, prostitution activity, gambling or other criminal conduct on the premises;
- B. Any person under the age of majority to be in a separate or enclosed bar area which has as its main purpose the selling or serving of low point beer for consumption on the premises, unless said person's parent or legal guardian is present, in violation of section 3-2B-9 of this article.
- C. Any person to exit the licensed premises with an open container of low point beer. (1994 Code § 3-44)


<u>Section VII</u>: Repealer. All ordinances or parts thereof, which are inconsistent with this ordinance, are hereby repealed.

<u>Section VIII</u>: Savings Clause. Nothing in this ordinance hereby adopted shall be construed to affect any suit or proceedings now pending in any court, or any rights acquired or liability incurred, nor any cause or causes of action accrued or existing, under any act or ordinance repealed hereby. Nor shall any right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by this ordinance.

Section IX: Severability. If any one or more of the sections, sentences clauses or parts of this ordinance, chapter or section shall, for any reason, be held invalid, the invalidity of such section, clause or part shall not affect or prejudice in any way the applicability and validity of any other provision of this ordinance. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Commission of the City of Enid that this section of the Enid Municipal Code would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal or invalid sentence, clause, section or part not been included

Section X: Codification. This ordinance shall be codified as Title 2, Chapter 6, Article B, Section 2-6B-3 and Title 3, Chapter 2, Article B, Section 3-2B-8 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014.

THIS CONTRACT is entered into between SHARON KAYE RICE ("Seller") and THE CITY OF ENID, OKLAHOMA, ("Buyer").

Upon Approval of this Contract by both Seller and Buyer, evidenced by their signatures hereto, a valid and binding contract of sale shall exist, the terms and conditions of which are follows:

1. SALE: Seller agrees to sell and convey to Buyer Surface Rights only by Warranty Deed and Buyer agrees to purchase the following described real estate (the "Property") located in Garfield County, Oklahoma:

Lot Seven (7), Block Two (2), Lahoma Addition to the City of Enid, Oklahoma. (The street address of which is 2322 C Court, Enid, Oklahoma.)

PURCHASE PRICE: The total purchase price is FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$55,000.00) payable by Buyer to Seller as follows: Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) as earnest money deposit, to be held in escrow and the balance at closing.

TITLE: Seller is to provide, thirty (30) days prior to closing, an Abstract of Title certified at least to the date of this Contract, showing Seller's title to the property to be marketable in fact, as defined by the Title Examination Standards of the Oklahoma Bar. Buyer shall have seven (7) days after receipt of the abstract to deliver to Seller written objections to the condition of Seller's title. CONTRACT FOR SALE OF REAL ESTATE

THIS CONTRACT is entered into between SHARON KAYE RICE ("Seller") and THE CITY OF ENID, OKLAHOMA, ("Buyer").

Upon Approval of this Contract by both Seller and Buyer, evidenced by their signatures hereto, a valid and binding contract of sale shall exist, the terms and conditions of which are follows:

1. SALE: Seller agrees to sell and convey to Buyer Surface Rights only by Warranty Deed and Buyer agrees to purchase the following described real estate (the "Property") located in Garfield County, Oklahoma:

Lot Seven (7), Block Two (2), Lahoma Addition to the City of Enid, Oklahoma. (The street address of which is 2322 C Court, Enid, Oklahoma.)

PURCHASE PRICE: The total purchase price is FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$55,000.00) payable by Buyer to Seller as follows: Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) as earnest money deposit, to be held in escrow and the balance at closing.

TITLE: Seller is to provide, thirty (30) days prior to closing, an Abstract of Title certified at least to the date of this Contract, showing Seller's title to the property to be marketable in fact, as defined by the Title Examination Standards of the Oklahoma Bar. Buyer shall have seven (7) days after receipt of the abstract to deliver to Seller written objections to the condition of Seller's title.
