MINUTES OF RESCHEDULED REGULAR MEETING OF

MAYOR AND BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF ENID, OKLAHOMA, THE TRUSTEES OF THE ENID MUNICIPAL AUTHORITY, A PUBLIC TRUST, AND

THE TRUSTEES OF THE ENID ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY, A PUBLIC TRUST

HELD ON THE 14TH DAY OF APRIL 2015

The Mayor and Board of Commissioners of the City of Enid, County of Garfield, State of

Oklahoma, Trustees of the Enid Municipal Authority, a Public Trust, and the Trustees of the Enid

Economic Development Authority, a Public Trust, met in a rescheduled regular meeting in the Council

Chambers of the Administration Building of the City of Enid, located at 401 West Owen K. Garriott Road

in said city, at 6:30 P.M. on the 7th day of April 2015, pursuant to notice given ten (10) days in advance

to the Clerk of the City of Enid, and pursuant to notice thereof displayed at the entrance to the

Administration Building of said city, in prominent view and which notice was posted prior to 5:00 P.M.

on the 13th day of April 2015.

-MAYOR AND BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS-

Mayor Shewey called the meeting to order with the following members present and absent:

PRESENT: Commissioners Janzen, Ezzell, Timm, Wilson, Vanhooser and Mayor Shewey.

ABSENT: Commissioner Brownlee.

Staff present were City Manager Jerald Gilbert, City Attorney Andrea Chism, City Clerk Linda

Parks, Director of Engineering Services Christopher Gdanski, Chief Financial Officer Erin Crawford,

Interim Public Works Director Billy McBride, Planning Administrator Chris Bauer, Director of

Marketing and Public Relations Steve Kime, and Ex-Officio Member Col. John Menozzi.

Ms. Paula Nightengale from Park Avenue Thrift gave the Invocation, and Ms. Erin Crawford led

the Flag Salute.

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Commissioner Brownlee arrived and sat in for the remainder of the proceedings.

Motion was made by Commissioner Janzen and seconded by Commissioner Ezzell to approve the minutes of the special Commission meeting of April 1, 2015, and regular Commission meeting of April 7, 2015, and the vote was as follows:

AYE: Commissioners Janzen, Brownlee, Ezzell, Timm, Wilson, Vanhooser and Mayor Shewey.

NAY: None.

Proclamations were read and presented proclaiming April 6-12, 2015 as "National Crime Victims' Rights Week," April 24, 2015 as "Arbor Day," and the month of April 2015 as "Civitan Club Awareness Month," "Fair Housing Awareness Month," and "National Kite Month."

A hearing was held regarding an ordinance amending Section 11-10A-9 in Article A, Chapter 10, Title 11 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, entitled "Residential Developments: Uses Permitted," to permit boarding or rooming houses within a Planned Unit Development (PUD) in the "R-3" Residential Zoning District; and deleting language regulating signs.

Planning Administrator Chris Bauer explained that Forgotten Ministries wanted to provide housing for up to 12 persons per unit on their property located at 1804 South 4th. He stated that the property was currently zoned "R-3" Residential Mobile Home Neighborhood District, which permitted single family units with up to only five people per unit. If approved, the ordinance would allow boarding and rooming houses in the "R-3" PUD that would permit up to 12 persons per unit, and accommodate the program that Forgotten Ministries wanted to implement.

Mr. Bauer stated that to accommodate the proposal, an amendment to the PUD was required. He stated that if the ordinance was approved to allow boarding and rooming houses, Forgotten Ministries would submit a master development plan and PUD design statement which would be reviewed by the

Metropolitan Area Planning Commission (MAPC), and approved by the City Commission. Forgotten Ministries would then submit their preliminary site plan for approval by the MAPC, which would be followed by review of their final site plan by the MAPC, and final approval by the City Commission.

There being no comments, the hearing concluded.

Motion was made by Commissioner Wilson and seconded by Commissioner Ezzell to adopt an ordinance amending Section 11-10A-9 in Article A, Chapter 10, Title 11 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, entitled "Residential Developments: Uses Permitted," to permit boarding or rooming houses within a Planned Unit Development in the "R-3" Residential Zoning District; and deleting language regulating signs, and the vote was as follows:

AYE: Commissioners Janzen, Brownlee, Ezzell, Timm, Wilson, Vanhooser and Mayor Shewey.

NAY: None.

ORDINANCE NO. 2015-17

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ENID MUNICIPAL CODE, 2014, TITLE 11, ENTITLED "ZONING," CHAPTER 10, ENTITLED "SUPPLEMENTAL ZONES," ARTICLE A ENTITLED "PUD PLANNED UNIT DEVELOPMENT," SECTION 11-10A-9, ENTITLED "RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENTS; USES PERMITTED," TO PERMIT BOARDING OR ROOMING HOUSES WITHIN A PUD IN THE R-3 RESIDENTIAL ZONING DISTRICT AND DELETING LANGUAGE REGULATING SIGNS; PROVIDING FOR REPEALER, SAVINGS CLAUSE, SEVERABILITY, AND CODIFICATION.

Discussion was held regarding a resolution adopting the 2015 Annual Action Plan and Budget for the Community Development Program for the July 2015-June 2016 program year, and authorizing the Mayor to submit the Plan to the Department of Housing and Urban Development.

Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Coordinator Stephanie Carr explained that the City of Enid, as an Entitlement City for the receipt of CDBG funds, was required to submit an Annual Action Plan (Plan) for expenditure of funds to the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD.) She noted that the amount of CDBG funds available to the City of Enid was determined by

HUD, and that the funding allocation for Fiscal Year 2015 had been approved in the amount of \$399,384.00. She explained that the purpose of the Plan was to undertake projects that provided housing, expanded economic opportunities, and a suitable living environment for the city's low and moderate income residents, or those residing in low income census tracts. She noted that per Federal guidelines, there was a 20% cap on the amount that could be allocated for administration costs, and a 15% cap on public service projects. She added that all of the activities recommended by the CDBG Funding Committee had qualified for funding.

Ms. Yvonne Lewis Odom, President of the Booker T. Washington Community Center Board of Directors, addressed commissioners. She spoke regarding the benefits of after school programs and the positive influence the Center had provided not only to the children who participated in the program, but to her own children as well. She also responded to concerns of commissioners at the April 7, 2015 Commission meeting regarding numbers, documentation, funding requests, and fundraising efforts by the Center.

Mr. Clifford Porter, Executive Director of the Booker T. Washington Community Center (BTW), addressed the Commission regarding the CDBG Funding Committee's recommended allocation of \$5,000.00 for BTW. He stated that the City had always supported BTW, and the reduced allocation would be damaging. He asked that commissioners look at priorities and make their decisions wisely.

Commissioner Ezzell responded, stating that BTW had received funding from two streams in the past from the City of Enid. One via CDBG, and one from Local Program Funding, which had more discretion in how the funds were allocated. He encouraged Mr. Porter, because of the importance of BTW to the community, that if BTW did not receive funds it had requested at the meeting, to take the opportunity in the next few weeks to address its needs to commissioners.

Commissioner Wilson stated that during her role as a commissioner, she had done considerable research on after school programs. She stated that BTW was the only group in the community that saw the importance of having this type of program, and commended Mr. Porter for providing the service.

Ms. Maria Eaves, 2613 East Pine Avenue, addressed commissioners. She spoke regarding her own personal experience with BTW, stating there was a definite need for the services it provided. She urged commissioners to reconsider the \$5,000.00 allocation being recommended by the CDBG Funding Committee.

Lengthy discussion ensued regarding the proposed allocations recommended by the CDBG Funding Committee.

During discussion, Ms. Carr stated that she would be willing to give up a portion of the recommended administration costs to give to another entity(s) that needed to be funded.

City Manager Jerald Gilbert stated that cutting administration costs was acceptable to him and staff, as Ms. Carr assisted other City departments throughout the year in obtaining grant funding. He added that if approved, the costs would be absorbed in the Administration Department budget.

Commissioner Brownlee stated that he was in favor, and put on the table as a motion, of eliminating the funding for Taft Elementary School, Code Enforcement and EPTA, and applying the total, \$22,500.00 to BTW, for a total allocation to that entity of \$27,500.00.

It was noted that the CDBG Funding Committee had not recommended funding for Code Enforcement.

Commissioner Janzen stated that he would like to reduce the allocation for administration costs by \$20,000.00.

Commissioner Wilson suggested that a portion of the administration costs be applied to CDSA and Sandbox Learning Center, and that the funding recommended for EPTA and Taft Elementary School be eliminated and allocated to BTW.

Commissioner Vanhooser recommended that administration costs be cut in half, and that funding for Taft Elementary School be eliminated completely. In addition, he recommended raising Parks & Recreation to \$20,000.00, adding \$10,000.00 to Code Enforcement, adding \$14,938.40 to the Northwest OK Disabled American Veterans, and increasing BTW to \$30,000.00.

Commissioner Vanhooser was asked to repeat his recommendations.

Commissioner Vanhooser stated he would cut Administration in half, for a total of \$39,938.40. He would eliminate Taft Elementary School in the amount of \$12,500.00, add \$2,500.00 to Parks & Recreation for a total of \$20,000.00, increase Code Administration from zero to \$10,000.00, increase the Northwest OK Disabled American Veterans from zero to \$14,938.40, and allocate BTW a total of \$30,000.00.

Commissioner Wilson asked if the recommended allocation for the Northwest OK Disabled American Veterans would be of any benefit, based on their original request.

Ms. Carr responded, stating that she had never had a project that had not been completed with the allocation given.

Commissioner Janzen stated that it had been implied that their primary project was for door improvements to their facility. He went on to say that he would be in favor of funding the door improvements, and other minor improvements, from the City's existing budget, and eliminate the project entirely from CDBG funding.

Commissioner Vanhooser stated that if commissioners agreed, the \$14,938.40 he had recommended for the Northwest OK Disabled American Veterans could be allocated to BTW as well.

Commissioner Timm asked that funds be allocated to Sandbox Learning Center.

Commissioner Brownlee stated that Mr. Gilbert had referenced that the City could take care of demolition, recommended by Commissioner Vanhooser under Code Enforcement in the amount of \$10,000.00, through other budgeted funds, which could then be applied to Sandbox Learning Center.

Commissioner Vanhooser asked if Commissioner Janzen would agree to fund the Northwest OK Disabled American Veterans in the amount of \$7,500.00, noting that it appeared they had needs that were not being met with the City's current budget.

Commissioner Janzen responded that he would cut their request to zero.

Commissioner Vanhooser then asked if commissioners would compromise by taking the \$14,938.40 he had recommended for the Northwest OK Disabled American Veterans, and allocate \$7,000.00 of those dollars to the Sandbox Learning Center, with the balance to BTW, which would bring its total allocation to \$37,000.00.

Following further discussion, Commissioner Brownlee summarized the funding recommendations made by commissioners as follows: \$10,000.00 recommended for Code Enforcement would be eliminated and allocated to Sandbox Learning Center; funding for administration costs would be reduced to \$39,938.00; CDSA would remain at \$75,000.00; the Salvation Army would remain at \$44,284.20; \$20,000.00 would be allocated for Parks & Recreation; funding for Taft Elementary School would be eliminated; EPTA would remain at \$5,000.00; and the difference would be applied to BTW.

Commissioner Vanhooser stated that he agreed, and if Commissioner Brownlee would amend his motion to reflect those recommendations, he would second the original motion.

Mr. Gilbert asked Chief Financial Officer Erin Crawford to update the CDBG funding spreadsheet to reflect exact numbers as recommended by commissioners.

Commissioner Vanhooser then moved to table said item until exact numbers could be presented to commissioners in the spreadsheet.

Motion was seconded by Commissioner Timm, and the vote was as follows:

AYE: Commissioners Janzen, Brownlee, Timm, Wilson, Vanhooser and Mayor Shewey.

NAY: None.

Commissioner Ezzell absent from vote.

It was noted that no vote was taken on the original motion.

Motion was made by Commissioner Vanhooser and seconded by Commissioner Timm to adopt an ordinance amending Section 2-6B-3 in Article B, Chapter 6, Title 2 of the Enid Municipal Code 2014, entitled "Alcoholic Beverages; Low Point Beer," to include new and additional licenses, differentiate between initial and renewal fees where required by State law, increase certain license fees to match State law and decrease low-point beer retailer fees; amending Section 3-2A-3 in Article A, Chapter 2, Title 3, entitled "Payment Required; Penalty," to ensure that the expiration of local taxes coincides with the expiration of the State licenses, provides for proration, and replaces the violation class with specific penalties; amending Section 3-2B-2 in Article B, Chapter 2, Title 3, entitled "License Required," to provide penalty for violations; amending Section 3-2B-5 in Article B, Chapter 2, Title 3, entitled "License Fee," to provide for proration and three-year licenses; amending Section 3-2B-6 in Article B, Chapter 2, Title 3, entitled "Expiration Of License," to provide for three-year licenses; and amending Section 3-2B-8 in Article B, Chapter 2, Title 3, entitled "Permitting Violation Of Laws On Premises," to allow the revocation of low point beer licenses for violations of criminal laws on the premises, and the vote was as follows:

AYE: Commissioners Janzen, Brownlee, Ezzell, Timm, Wilson, Vanhooser and Mayor Shewey.



BACKGROUND:

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1.0 GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The Planned Unit Development of Stonebridge consists of 61.83 acres more or less and is located north of Chestnut Ave. and west of Cleveland St. in Enid. The property is located in the east half of the southeast quarter of Section 2, Township 22 North, Range 7 West of the Indian, Oklahoma County, Oklahoma. (Exhibit C)

The current and underlying zoning of the PUD is R-2, Residential District. The purpose of this PUD is to allow for multiple types of housing not to exceed the maximum number of dwelling units allowed within the current R-2 Zoning District. This PUD allows for new single family dwellings adjacent to existing single family homes on the west and restricts other types of housing to the east, adjacent to Cleveland St. More than 10% of the total development will be reserved as open space, to include a body of water. This area will be engineered to accommodate storm water runoff and will maintain a permanent water level. The area surrounding the body of water will be developed into a park like setting for the use and enjoyment of the Stonebridge residents. This open space amenity will add to the value of the homes and to the quality of life for all Stonebridge residents.

2.0 OWNER/DEVELOPER

The developer of the property is AC Development, LLC. of P.O. Box 160, Waukomis, OK 73773.

3.0 SITE AND SURROUNDING AREAS

The subject property is currently zoned R-2 Residential and contains a house and barn. The land directly north, south, east and west of the site is zoned R-2 residential. Quailwood Drive and single family residential lots form the western boundary of the site. The property east of Cleveland is vacant except for a convenience store and car wash located on the NE corner of the intersection of Cleveland St and Chestnut Ave. Regional detention is planned on part of the property to the east. This plan is in harmony with the City of Enid Comprehensive Plan and makes efficient use of existing utility infrastructure.

4.0 PHYSICAL CHARACTERISTICS

The site is fairly flat with minimal slope toward the south end of the property. There are a few existing trees on the site, and will be kept wherever possible. Drainage flows from the north to the south. Per USDA-NRCS Soil Survey, soils are predominantly sandy loam and determined suitable for development.

<u>5.</u>0 <u>INTENT AND PURPOSE</u>

Stonebridge Planned Unit Development contemplates a residential development with single family homes, zero lot line garden homes, multifamily dwellings, and senior housing. This Planned Unit Development represents a response to the continuing demands for different types of housing in this rapidly expanding community. Exhibit D, Stonebridge Master Development Plan, describes the location and types of dwelling units within the PUD.

The Stonebridge Development will provide housing options for many sectors of the market. Diverse housing types will allow for multigenerational living within the same neighborhood. It is the intent of this PUD to provide housing options for families, young adults, single parents, seniors, grandparents and others. By providing more options, development can happen faster, construction is more efficient, and the neighborhood is more unified and successful. The large open space will help to unify Stonebridge by creating a community identity and a place that is accessible by all Stonebridge residents.

Following approval of this request, it is the intent of the Developer to begin construction within one year. Initial development will include the first phase of lots in Tract 1. This first phase will begin on the south and will be accessed by the entrance on Chestnut Ave. It is the intent of the Developer to continue to develop lots to the north as the market demands.

The market conditions indicate that development of Planning Area 2 of Tract 2 could also occur at the same time Tract 1 is under construction. Planning area 1 of Tract 2, will most likely happen later as market conditions continue to evolve.

6.0 SERVICE AVAILABILITY

Following is an analysis of the existing and proposed infrastructure to serve this PUD.

6.1 STREETS

The Planned Unit Development of Stonebridge is situated north of Chestnut Ave, a two lane section line road. Cleveland St, a two lane section road, is located along the eastern boundary of the PUD. The City of Enid has announced plans to widen Cleveland St. to four lanes and make significant improvements to the intersection of Cleveland and Chestnut Ave. In the event that development along Cleveland and Chestnut precede such improvements, the Developer has agreed to install acceleration and deceleration lanes at all access points on Cleveland and Chestnut as a condition of site plan approval. The Developer has also

agreed to provide up to \$250,000 for the proposed \$1 million dollar upgrade of the intersection.

6.2 SANITARY SEWER

Sanitary sewer facilities are presently available from existing sewer lines located adjacent to the property. Sanitary sewer lines within Stonebridge will be located within the street right-of-way.

6.3 WATER

Water is presently available from several large existing water mains located adjacent to the property. Water lines within Stonebridge will be located within the street right-of-way.

6.4 OTHER UTILITIES

Electric, gas, telephone and other appropriate utilities will be extended to serve this site.

6.5 FIRE PROTECTION

The nearest fire station is Station #4 located within 1.5 miles.

7.0 USES PERMITTED

The Planned Unit Development of Stonebridge contains 3 tracts and a total of 61.13 acres. The total number of dwelling units within Stonebridge will not exceed that allowed within the current R-2 Zoning District. The total number of dwelling units allowed is 6 units per acre. This allows for a total of 370 units per 11-10A-6 B and C of the PUD Ordinance. Density and number of dwelling units can be transferred within the PUD area so long as the stated Maximum Density of 6 units per acre or the Maximum number of dwelling units of 370 are not exceeded. The use and development regulations are provided as follows:

Tract 1 17.53 +/- Acres

PUD Overlay with Underlying R-2 Residential District

Tract 1 is approximately 17.53 acres adjacent to existing single family homes on the west and development of this area will be restricted to single family homes. The density of this area is planned to be 4.1 units per acre with 72 dwelling units. This density is comparable to adjacent neighborhoods. There will not be any accessory uses within Tract 1 as defined in 11-109A-B.

Tract 2 27.30 +/- Acres

PUD Overlay with Underlying R-2 Residential District Tract 2 is approximately 27.30 acres. This area is planned for regional water detention and open space with the opportunity for permanent water, walking trails and recreation. There will not be any structures built within Tract 2.

Tract 3 16.30 +/- Acres PUD Overlay with Underlying R-2 Residential District Approximately 16.3 acres adjacent to Cleveland St. The maximum density of this area will be 13 units per acre, and a maximum of 210 units. Housing types may consist of those allowed within the R-7 Residential District. There will not be any accessory uses within Planning Area 2 as defined in 11-109A-B.

7.2 ADDITIONAL USE REGULATIONS

7.2.1 Height and Setback restrictions per the R-2 Zoning District, PUD Ordinance 11-10A-11 and 11-10A-12, and the construction code of the City of Enid will be observed.

Additionally, In Tract 1, a front building limit line of ten feet will be allowed for single family dwelling units with a side load garage, or front load garages, providing that the front face of the garage is at least twenty feet back from the front property line.

In Tract 1, a lot developed with a setback of less than five feet on one side shall maintain a minimum ten foot setback on the opposite side yard.

In Tract 1, fireplaces, bay windows, entry ways, patios, patio covers and other similar appurtenances may encroach up to two feet into the side yard setback and up to five feet into the rear yard setback. However, said appurtenances shall not extend into a utility easement right-of-way.

7.2.2 Development signage will be restricted to monument style signs no taller than 7 feet high and columns no taller than 9 feet high. Signs along the perimeter will be limited to the major access points identified on the Master Development Plan. These signs will be decorative, and well landscaped and designed to be consistent with the overall theme of Stonebridge. All signs will be permitted by the City of Enid prior to construction.

- 7.2.3 Landscaping of all dwelling units will be required. Minimum standards will be stated in the Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions filed of record and will be enforced by the Stonebridge Homeowners Association. Entrances, and common areas will be professionally landscaped to provide aesthetically pleasing and inviting areas. The large central common area will include a body of water surrounded by a walking trail, and landscaping and will include a stone covered bridge that will be the centerpiece of the park and help create the identity of Stonebridge.
- 7.2.4 In Tract 1, it is requested that all public streets will be 50' right-of-way and 27' wide pavement from back of curb to back of curb. Although this is a variance from the ordinance, we feel that more than 50' of right-of-way and 27' of pavement width creates an unsafe environment for those whose driveways access this road. A wider road section invites additional traffic at higher rates of speed for those who will try to bypass the intersection at Cleveland and Chestnut. With the plans for improvements at the intersection and the widening of Cleveland St. it is unnecessary to create another "arterial" street through a single family residential area. The streets have been also been designed to meander in such a way as to discourage high speed traffic.

8.0 ACCESS

- 8.1 Access to Stonebridge shall be permitted from one point of access on Chestnut Ave. and up to three points of access on Cleveland Street. Individual residential lot access to Chestnut Ave. shall not be permitted. Road improvements to Cleveland St and Chestnut Ave. may be required of the developer as development occurs as a condition of site plan approval. Acceleration and Deceleration lanes at the point of access, will be the developer's responsibility.
- 8.2 Additional access may be provided through adjacent developments on the west or may be designed for emergency access only if the City of Enid so desires. Vehicular access will not be provided directly from Stonebridge onto Rolling Oaks Dr.
- 8.3 Access points along Chestnut and Cleveland shall maintain a minimum separation of 200 feet measuring centerline to centerline.
- 8.4 Sidewalks will be required along Chestnut and Cleveland as a condition of site plan approval. Developer is responsible for construction of sidewalks within common areas that are adjacent to interior streets. Builders are responsible for construction of sidewalks along lot lines adjacent to interior streets as homes are constructed.

9.0 PARKING

9.1 Attached or detached garages shall count toward meeting the parking requirements.

9.2 Parking and maneuvering within a private street right-of-way shall be permitted.

10.0 ARCHITECTURE

Each structure will be reviewed by developer and must meet certain architectural standards as described in the Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions. For example, exterior building wall finish on all structures shall consist of a minimum 70% brick veneer, masonry, rock, or stone. Class "C" or better roofing materials shall be required for all structures. A minimum roof pitch 8/12 will be required on all single family homes. Sight proof fencing will be defined and minimum landscape requirements will be established.

11.0 OWNERSHIP AND MAINTENANCE OF COMMON AREA/OPEN SPACE

11.1 The property owner(s) shall be responsible for maintenance of all common/open space areas. It shall be the responsibility of the property owner(s) for the installation, maintenance and replacement of all landscaping and sprinkler systems. Developer will establish a Homeowner's Association with Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions filed with the County Clerk prior to selling single family lots.

12.0 DRAINAGEWAYS

- 12.1 In an effort to be environmentally conscious and preserve the natural beauty of the area, drainageways will be left natural where possible.
- 12.2 Private drainageways are specifically allowed as a part of this development. Such drainageways must be constructed in accordance with the City of Enid Drainage Code. Such private drainageways must be designed to handle adequate flows, be submitted for review and made subject to the approval City of Enid, and the maintenance of such drainageways must be placed in a Homeowner's association.

13.0 OTHER REGULATIONS

- 13.1 The boundaries of the site and tracts are depicted on the Master Development Plan.
- 13.2 An approved and recorded final plat shall depict the development regulations applicable to each block.
- 13.3 "Common Areas" will be owned and maintained by a Homeowner's Owners Association comprised of all property owners within the PUD.
- 13.4 "Stormwater Detention/Recreational Pond" The pond located in Tract 2 will be designed to provide stormwater detention for the entire project. Permanent water will be maintained in the pond for recreational use by the residential portions of the project. Pedestrian trails will be established around the pond and connect to the other sidewalks within the project.

13.5 It is the intent of the Developer to develop Tract 1 and market lots to builders. The Developer reserves the right to build homes in Tract 1.

It is the intent of the Developer to market Planning Area 1 of Tract 2, as a potential Senior Living project. This area could develop as single family detached homes, duplex, triplex, townhomes or other type of unit designed to accommodate the needs of seniors. Apartments are not allowed in this area. It is possible that the market would demand a location for a senior living facility providing independent and/or assisted living. In this event, it would be the intent of the developer to sell this area to be developed for such a use.

It is the intent of the Developer to market Planning Area 2 of Tract 2 as a multi-family apartment project. This area would be sold to a qualified Multi-Family Developer.

Planning Area 3 of Tract 2 will be deeded to the Homeowner's Association.




SIDEWALK VARIANCE





RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the City of Enid has endeavored to purchase and acquire all rights, title and interest in fee simple to said real property by offering reasonable and just market value compensation to the owners of said real property; and,

WHEREAS, the owners of said property have declined to grant, sell or convey said property to the City of Enid; and,

WHEREAS, it has become necessary to institute condemnation proceedings to acquire fee simple title to said land and to compensate the owner adequately therefore.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Board of Commissioners of the City of Enid, that the City of Enid, pursuant to its right of eminent domain, take immediate steps to condemn and acquire fee simple title to said real property for the purposes set forth above.

ORDINANCE NO. 2015-____

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ENID MUNICIPAL CODE, 2014, TITLE 6, ENTITLED "MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC," CHAPTER 12, ENTITLED "VEHICLE IMPOUNDMENT," SECTION 6-12-4, ENTITLED "IMPOUNDMENT OF ILLEGALLY PARKED VEHICLES," TO DEFINE DERELICT AND TO PROHIBIT PARKING IN OR UPON STORMWATER DRAINAGE FACILITIES OR EASEMENTS; PROVIDING FOR REPEALER, SAVINGS CLAUSE, SEVERABILITY AND CODIFICATION.

ORDINANCE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF ENID, OKLAHOMA:

<u>Section I</u>: That Title 6, Chapter 12, Section 6-12-4 of the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, is hereby amended to read as follows:

6-12-4: IMPOUNDMENT OF ILLEGALLY PARKED VEHICLES:

- A. Fire Lane: Any vehicle found to be parked in any fire lane or other access roadway as defined in the International Fire Code¹ may be impounded.
- B. Disabled Vehicles: A disabled vehicle upon a street or highway may be impounded under the following circumstances:
 - 1. If left unattended and improperly parked on a street or highway;
 - If left unattended longer than forty eight (48) hours on the shoulder of any highway:
 - If the person in charge of the vehicle is physically incapacitated to such extent as to be unable to provide for its custody or removal.
- C. Bridge An unattended vehicle left upon any bridge, viaduct or causeway or within the structure of a grade separation may be impounded.
- D. Traffic Hazard or Obstruction²: A vehicle left unattended upon any street, alley or thoroughfare and so parked illegally as to constitute a definite hazard or obstruction to the normal movement of traffic shall be impounded.
- E. Road Construction or Improvement Locations:
 - 1. When the city plans to construct or improve any street, alley or right of way upon which a car or cars are legally parked, the city shall install a sign

to be conspicuously posted at two (2) locations upon, at or near such street, alley or right of way. Such notice shall state: "Street - Construction - Improvement, All Vehicles Must Be Removed Immediately!" Such notice shall be given at least forty eight (48) hours prior to the commencement of any construction or improvement activities.

2. Any vehicle which remains upon any street, alley or right of way at the commencement of any such construction or improvement activities shall be determined to be parked illegally and shall constitute a traffic hazard, and shall be impounded.

F. Derelict Vehicles:

- 1. When any derelict vehicle is discovered by the Police Department to have been parked upon any street in the city for a period of seventy-two (72) hours, the Police Department is authorized to impound the vehicle, and if the owner of the vehicle may be ascertained by reasonable diligence, the owner shall be notified of the action by the Police Department.
- 2. When any derelict vehicle is discovered by the Police Department to have been parked upon any airport property belonging to the city for a period of forty-eight (48) hours, the Police Department is authorized to impound the vehicle, and if the owner of the vehicle may be ascertained by reasonable diligence, the owner shall be notified of the action by the Police Department.
- 3. For the purposes of this article, a derelict vehicle shall be defined as:
 - a. Abandoned;
 - b. **Interfering** with the normal flow of traffic;
 - c. Interfering with the use of private property;
 - d. Neglected; or,
- e. Inoperable
- G. Private Property.
 - 1. An unattended vehicle found to be in violation of section <u>6-6-9</u> of this title may be impounded when the required complaint has been properly made and filed as provided in this subsection.
 - 2. If a violation of the provisions of section <u>6-6-9</u> of this title occurs, the owner or legal occupant who complains shall sign a complaint against the person parking the vehicle on the owner's or legal occupant's property, or

if the identity of the person parking the vehicle is unknown, then the complaint may be filed against the registered owner of the vehicle. The complaint shall be verified and shall allege that the complaining party is the owner or legal occupant of the property upon which the vehicle is parked or standing.

3. Upon filing of the complaint by the property owner or legal occupant, and if there appears to be proper cause to believe the provisions of section 6-6-9 of this title have been violated, the police department shall cause the vehicle to be impounded from the property and placed in storage.

H. Parked Over Water Meters:

- 1. Any vehicle parked in such a way as to obstruct ready access to a city water meter shall be impounded after notice has been given.
- Notice shall be given as follows:
 - a. Notice of the offense and one (1) hour advance notice of impoundment and an opportunity to move the vehicle shall be given to the owner or person in charge of the illegally parked vehicle if such person is present.
 - b. If the vehicle owner or person in charge of the vehicle is not present, notice of the offense and impoundment shall be left on the vehicle at least twelve (12) hours in advance of impoundment.
- I. Parked In/Upon Stormwater Drainage Facilities or Easements:
 - 1. Any vehicle parked in, over, or upon stormwater drainage facilities or easements shall be impounded after notice has been given.
 - 2 Notice shall be given as follows:
 - a. Notice of the offense and one (1) hour advance notice of impoundment and an opportunity to move the vehicle shall be given to the owner or person in charge of the illegally parked vehicle if such person is present.
 - b. If the vehicle owner or person in charge of the vehicle is not present, notice of the offense and impoundment shall be left on the vehicle at least twelve (12) hours in advance of impoundment.
- J. Prohibited Zone: Any unattended vehicle parked at the street curbing of any zone where parking is prohibited and where official signs are in place giving notice thereof in violation of the prohibition may be impounded.

- K. Blocking Fire Exits or Hydrants: Any vehicle illegally parked in such a manner that it blocks a fire escape ladder, device or exit or blocks ready access to a fire hydrant shall be impounded.
- L. Intersection: Any unattended vehicle illegally parked in any street intersection shall be impounded. A disabled vehicle in an intersection, with the person in charge of the vehicle being present, shall be moved out of the intersection and to the nearest available legal parking space at the street curbing.
- M. Handicapped Parking Spaces: Any vehicle parked in a parking space which is clearly marked for handicap parking, whether on public or private property, which vehicle does not have a clearly visible state or city authorized handicap sticker may be impounded and the owner and/or operator may be cited for violations pursuant to section 6-6-7 of this title. (1994 Code §§ 20-98, 20-99, 20-100, 20-102, 20-103, 20-104, 20-105, 20-106 2 107, 20-108, 20-109, 20-10; amd. 2003 Code)

Section II: Repealer. All ordinances or parts thereof, which are inconsistent with this ordinance, are hereby repealed.

Section III: Savings Clause. Nothing in this ordinance hereby adopted shall be construed to affect any suit or proceedings now pending in any court, or any rights acquired or liability incurred, nor any cause of causes of action accrued or existing, under any act or ordinance repealed hereby. Nor shall any right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by this ordinance.

Section IV: Severability. If any one or more of the sections, sentences, clauses or parts of this ordinance, chapter or section shall for any reason, be held invalid, the invalidity of such section clause or part shall not affect or prejudice in any way the applicability and validity of any other provision of this ordinance. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Commission of the City of Enid that this section of the Enid Municipal Code would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal or invalid sentence clause, section of part not been included.

Section V: Codification. This ordinance shall be codified as Title 6, Chapter 12, Section 6-12-4 of the End Municipal Code, 2014.
