The Mayor and Board of Commissioners of the City of Enid, County of Garfield, State of

Oklahoma, Trustees of the Enid Municipal Authority, a Public Trust, and the Trustees of the Enid

Economic Development Authority, a Public Trust, met in regular meeting in the Council Chambers of the

Administration Building of the City of Enid, located at 401 West Owen K. Garriott Road in said city, at

6:30 P.M. on the 16th day of June 2015, pursuant to notice given by December 15, 2014 to the Clerk of

the City of Enid, and pursuant to notice thereof displayed at the entrance to the Administration Building

of said city, in prominent view and which notice was posted prior to 5:00 P.M. on the 15th day of June

2015.

Mayor Shewey called the meeting to order with the following members present and absent:

PRESENT: Commissioners Janzen, Brownlee, Ezzell, Timm, Wilson, Vanhooser and Mayor

Shewey.

ABSENT: None.

Staff present were City Manager Jerald Gilbert, Assistant City Manager Joan Riley, City Attorney

Andrea Chism, City Clerk Linda Parks, Director of Engineering Services Christopher Gdanski, Chief

Financial Officer Erin Crawford, Interim Public Works Director Billy McBride, Planning Administrator

Chris Bauer, Director of Marketing and Public Relations Steve Kime, Human Resources Director Sonya

Key, and Ex-Officio Member Chief Master Sergeant Peter Speen.

Reverend Carrell Still from Willow Road Christian Church gave the Invocation, and Chief Master

Sergeant Peter Speen led the Flag Salute.

Motion was made by Commissioner Ezzell and seconded by Commissioner Timm to approve the

minutes of the special Commission meeting of May 21, 2015, and the regular Commission of June 2,

2015, and the vote was as follows:

AYE: Commissioners Janzen, Brownlee, Ezzell, Timm, Wilson, Vanhooser and Mayor Shewey.

NAY: None.

Officer Gene Robertson introduced "Rowdy," a three-month old male mixed Shepherd, available

for adoption at the Enid Animal Shelter.

Mr. Frank Baker and Ms. Lynne Benkendorf from Eagle Marketing, presented a plaque to Mayor

Shewey commemorating the 10th Annual Roberts Ranch Smokin' Red Dirt BBQ, and thanked the City of

Enid for its continued support and assistance during the event.

Motion was made by Commissioner Vanhooser and seconded by Commissioner Brownlee to

approve a resolution amending the 2014-2015 Enid Event Center and Convention Hall Fund Budget by

appropriating funds in the amount of \$627,000.00 to fund self-marketed events, and the vote was as

follows:

AYE: Commissioners Janzen, Brownlee, Ezzell, Timm, Wilson, Vanhooser and Mayor Shewey.

NAY: None.

Motion was made by Commissioner Vanhooser and seconded by Commissioner Brownlee to approve a resolution amending the 2014-2015 Water Capital Improvement Fund Budget by appropriating funds in the amount of \$696,000.00 to fund the professional services contract with Garver, LLC, for the Kaw Lake Alternate Water Supply Contract, and the vote was as follows:

AYE: Commissioners Janzen, Brownlee, Ezzell, Timm, Wilson, Vanhooser and Mayor Shewey.

Motion was made by Commissioner Wilson and seconded by Commissioner Janzen to approve an Agreement for Professional Engineering Services with Garver, LLC, Little Rock, Arkansas for Project No. W-1412A, Alternate Water Supply from Kaw Lake, and authorize the Mayor to execute all contract documents after review by the City Attorney, and the vote was as follows:

AYE: Commissioners Janzen, Brownlee, Ezzell, Timm, Wilson, Vanhooser and Mayor Shewey.

NAY: None.

Motion was made by Commissioner Brownlee and seconded by Commissioner Timm to approve Change Order No. 1 with P.P.S. Trucking, LLC, for Project No. F-1307A, Rolling Oaks Detention Facility and Drive Realignment, in the amount of \$491,853.20.

City Engineer Robert Hitt provided a brief update regarding the project. He explained that design, which covered approximately 27 acres for stormwater detention, was complete, and excavation on the north portion of the holding basin was currently underway. He stated that the change order would place a box culvert to the south of the existing Rolling Oaks Drive, and realign the Drive. This work was bid with the original project, but deferred until after improvements were in place. He added that wet detention, which would be located in the southwest corner of the basin, would be constructed in a future

phase of the project, and would provide for a permanent pond or water surface elevation, comparable to what was being done at the Garland detention.

Mr. Hitt provided exhibits depicting the layout of the project. He also provided an exhibit of the Stonebridge Development (Development). He stated that the Planned Unit Development (PUD) Agreement for the Development required that a pond be constructed in Tract 2 of the PUD to provide stormwater detention. He also stated that the PUD required a pond be excavated to maintain water for recreational purposes in the south portion of the Development. To the north was the area being excavated for the remaining capacity.

Commissioner Wilson stated that the plans shown by Mr. Hitt were not those voted on by commissioners. They were not what the public was told would happen, and not the same as the PUD.

Commissioner Ezzell stated that it was his understanding that when a PUD was approved, a tradeoff was made with the developer in exchange for additional oversight from the City. The developer gave some exceptions, but the flip side was that when the City showed a plan, they were committing to develop along those lines. He asked City Attorney Andrea Chism to explain what restrictions were upon the developer.

Ms. Chism explained that the developer was required to do everything under the PUD. She went on to explain that the portion in the exhibit to the north was not the responsibility of the developer of the PUD. That portion was the City's, so it was not truly a part of that PUD.

Director of Engineering Services Christopher Gdanski stated that the detention facility would look much like the detention facility at Prairie View, with a concrete channel running down the middle. He explained that because of the flows that would be seen under Rolling Oaks Drive, those flows could not be run through the wet feature. He went on to say that the wet feature could be enlarged somewhat, but it would be necessary to watch where the flows came from. He also stated that everything shown on the exhibit would be dry, with the exception of where the wet feature was placed.

Commissioner Ezzell stated that the PUD from the July 2, 2013 Commission meeting agenda defined the stormwater recreational pond located in Tract 2. It did not define it necessarily, but did reflect that permanent water would be maintained in the pond for recreational use by residential portions of the project, and that pedestrian trails would be established around the pond, and connected to other sidewalks.

Ms. Chism stated that the requirement referred to the wet feature to the south. There were two wet features in the detention facility. The south part was the developer's portion, and that was what the PUD was describing.

Commissioner Ezzell stated that the agenda said in Tract 2.

Ms. Chism stated that all of that was Tract 2.

Commissioner Wilson again reiterated that the wet feature shown was not what was agreed upon.

Commissioner Vanhooser asked if all of Tract 2 was owned by the City.

Mr. Hitt stated that the north part of Tract 2 was owned by the City. The south part was an easement, and would be part of the common area to be maintained by the Homeowners Association, with the City retaining the easement for stormwater management purposes.

Commissioner Vanhooser asked what the solution was for this issue.

Mr. Gdanski stated that the wet detention was planned for the next phase. However, excavation needed to be finished, and Rolling Oaks Drive needed to be relocated, to make sure that the facility worked properly. Final design on the wet detention would then be done, and a contract would be awarded for that phase in the next budget year.

Commissioner Vanhooser asked where the wet feature would be placed, and what it would look like.

Mr. Gdanski responded, stating that the engineers would like to place it in the southwest corner of the dry detention. He went on to say that it could be enlarged, and moved around some. However, what could not easily be done was putting it where the Rolling Oaks flow came directly into it.

Mayor Shewey asked what would happen to flood control.

Mr. Gdanski stated that the dry detention area that needed to manage a hundred year event would be excavated. It would then be dug deeper to put in a wet detention facility. Water would stand there, which would necessitate the need to aerate it to keep plant growth down.

Commissioner Wilson stated that the wet facility Mr. Gdanski was referring to was not what was agreed upon. That was not what was voted on. That was not what that neighborhood agreed upon.

Mr. Gilbert stated that it appeared staff needed to review the engineering on the wet feature again to try to match it to the exhibit referred to as the original PUD.

Commissioner Wilson stated that that was the plan. It was supposed to match that. She went on to say that she didn't feel it was unreasonable to expect what the Commission had voted on, on what they approved, and on what they agreed on to happen.

Commissioner Ezzell stated that commissioners did have a version of the immediate discussion in July of 2013. He read an excerpt from the July 2013 City Commission minutes which read, "Commissioner Ezzell asked if there was a more in-depth description of the modified PUD than that being shown on the screen, and asked how those modifications were being defined in the motion. He stated that there was no agreement with regard to the property." He stated that the minutes went on to say, "Mr. Benson stated that should there be any deviations from the modified PUD as described, as described being that, those changes would have to be approved by the City Commission." He stated that they all knew that if there were changes, it would have to come to the City Commission. He stated that they all knew, and it was talked about, a description that may not have entailed enough information. However, they had that picture, the PUD as unanimously approved. He understood that it didn't provide Engineering staff a lot to go on, but the changes were substantial changes to the PUD. He also stated that he wasn't sure that the contract could be approved at this meeting, so before that was done, commissioners needed to make sure they were in the clear.

Mr. Gdanski stated that there was nothing in the contract change that addressed digging wet detention. He stated that the spot was picked based on the engineering and the hydraulics, but the actual construction was not ready to happen yet. He went on to say that the item on the agenda was to change the contract to relocate Rolling Oaks Drive to get the flows through there and into the detention facility. He addressed Commissioner Wilson, stating that staff would obviously come up with a different plan.

Mr. Gilbert stated that staff would definitely try to match the PUD exhibit as closely as they could. He asked if the road was approved, would that, in any way, mitigate the ability to try and make the wet feature look like the feature in the exhibit.

Mr. Gdanski responded, stating that it would consume some of the space, but not a significant amount.

Commissioner Ezzell stated that part of what was being approved, along with the road, would determine the inlet structure, and the location of that inlet structure.

Mr. Gdanski stated that the box culvert under the road could not change. That was where the water had to come in. The inlet had to be where it was. The dry detention had to be at a given elevation. The wet detention would be below that given elevation, or the storage elevation.

Mr. Gilbert asked if the change order was approved, if staff would look at the engineering to make sure the wet feature matched the original PUD.

Mr. Gdanski responded, "Yes."

Following further discussion, the vote was taken as follows:

AYE: Commissioners Janzen, Brownlee, Ezzell, Timm and Mayor Shewey.

NAY: Commissioner Wilson.

Commissioner Vanhooser absent from vote.

Discussion was held regarding possible action to authorize and direct Municipal Finance Services, Inc. to proceed with the proposed issuance of indebtedness by the Enid Municipal Authority (EMA) in the amount of \$5,020,000.00, plus estimated applicable issuance costs, to finance capital improvements; authorizing the distribution of bid packets to banks; and authorizing any related action.

Commissioner Ezzell commented that this was the continuation of what commissioners had discussed for several weeks in an effort to position the City where the unrestricted EMA fund balance would make it an attractive loan candidate. He stated that a budget compromise had been reached that resulted in a debt financing number to increase the unrestricted EMA fund balance, do the projects selected, and defer some projects for future years. He then moved to take action to proceed with the proposed issuance of indebtedness by the Enid Municipal Authority in the amount of \$5,520,000.

Motion was seconded by Commissioner Vanhooser, and the vote was as follows:

AYE: Commissioners Janzen, Brownlee, Ezzell, Timm, Wilson, Vanhooser and Mayor Shewey.

NAY: None.

It was noted that Item 9.15, Approve Change Order No. 1 In The Deduct Amount Of \$1,742.13 With Luckinbill, Inc., Enid, Oklahoma, And Accept The 2014 Sanitary Sewer Point Repair Program, Project No. S-1402A, In The Amount Of \$257,138.87, was being removed from the agenda from consideration.

Commissioner Vanhooser requested that Item 9.2, Award A Contract To Layne Christiansen Company, Guthrie, Oklahoma, For The 2015 Well Field Improvements Project, Project No. W-1512A, In The Amount of \$1,012,856.00, And Authorize The Mayor To Execute All Contract Documents After Review By The City Attorney, be removed from the list of Consent Items.

Motion was made by Commissioner Ezzell and seconded by Commissioner Wilson to approve staff recommendations on the following Consent Items, with the exception of Item 9.2, and the vote was as follows:

AYE: Commissioners Janzen, Brownlee, Ezzell, Timm, Wilson, Vanhooser and Mayor Shewey.

\$1,211,548.00.

BB&T's bid also provided for a prepayment or call option that the note could be, at the discretion of the City, prepaid or called in any time through the first two years at a 1% premium.

CONDUCT A HEARING ON A LAND USE AMENDMENT FOR PROPERTY LOCATED IN THE 900 TO 1100 BLOCK OF SOUTH WHEATRIDGE ROAD DESCRIBED AS PART OF THE NORTHEAST QUARTER SECTION SIXTEEN (16), TOWNSHIP TWENTY-TWO (22) NORTH, RANGE SEVEN (7) WEST, INDIAN MERIDIAN, FOR REAL ESTATE RESULTS, LLC, FROM AGRICULTURE DESIGNATION TO MEDIUM INTENSITY RESIDENTIAL DESIGNATION.

BACKGROUND:

This is a companion item to 6.2, 7.1 and 7.2.

This item concerns property located in the 900 to 1100 block of South Wheatridge Road. The site consists of <u>+</u> 87 acres. The request is to change the land use from Agriculture Designation to Medium Intensity Residential Designation. Currently the property is undeveloped. If approved, the property will be used for a future model neighborhood development.

The site has access to US 412 by way of Wheatridge Road and anticipated through the proposed development. This infrastructure will need to be improved to handle the proposed residential development.

There is an existing 12-inch water line in US 412 frontage road at the northeast edge of the commercial site to the north. When the water is extended through the proposed commercial development to the north it will provide service to the site. A looped water line to Garland would be anticipated as part of the development.

The site is not serviced by sanitary sewer. The closest service line is approximately one-half mile to the east and is proposed to extend a 12-inch line to the site. The capacity of the line is projected at 850 GPM. Full development of the proposed 80 acres of R-7, along with the 66 acres of commercial and the 50 acres of existing residential development, is projected at peak flow rate of 1200 GPM and would exceed the system capacity.

The site development would address storm water management in the development plan. No mapped flood hazard limit exists; therefore, storm water infrastructure can be handled by the development.

Under full development conditions the sanitary sewer system will not support the land use change. Full development of the approved commercial property and the proposed R-7 development would exceed the sewer capacity by over 40%. It is recommended that a system to control development impact, limit waste water discharge, be in place prior to a land use change being approved.

There was a protest submitted by homeowners in the area. The protest within 1,320 feet of the proposed development was .71%. The balance of the protesters was beyond the 1,320 feet.

The Metropolitan Area Planning Commission expressed concerns that the proposed development did not include a proposal for improvements to Wheatridge Road; however, the Metropolitan Area Planning Commission unanimously recommended approval at their June 15, 2015 meeting.

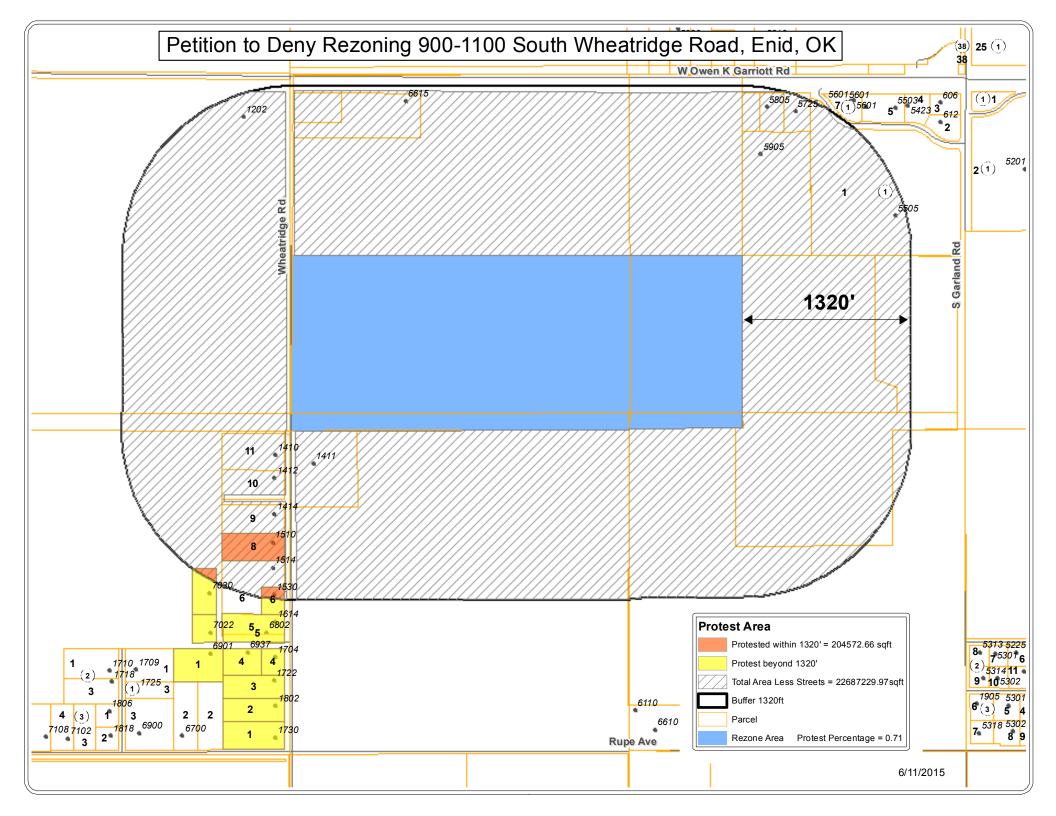

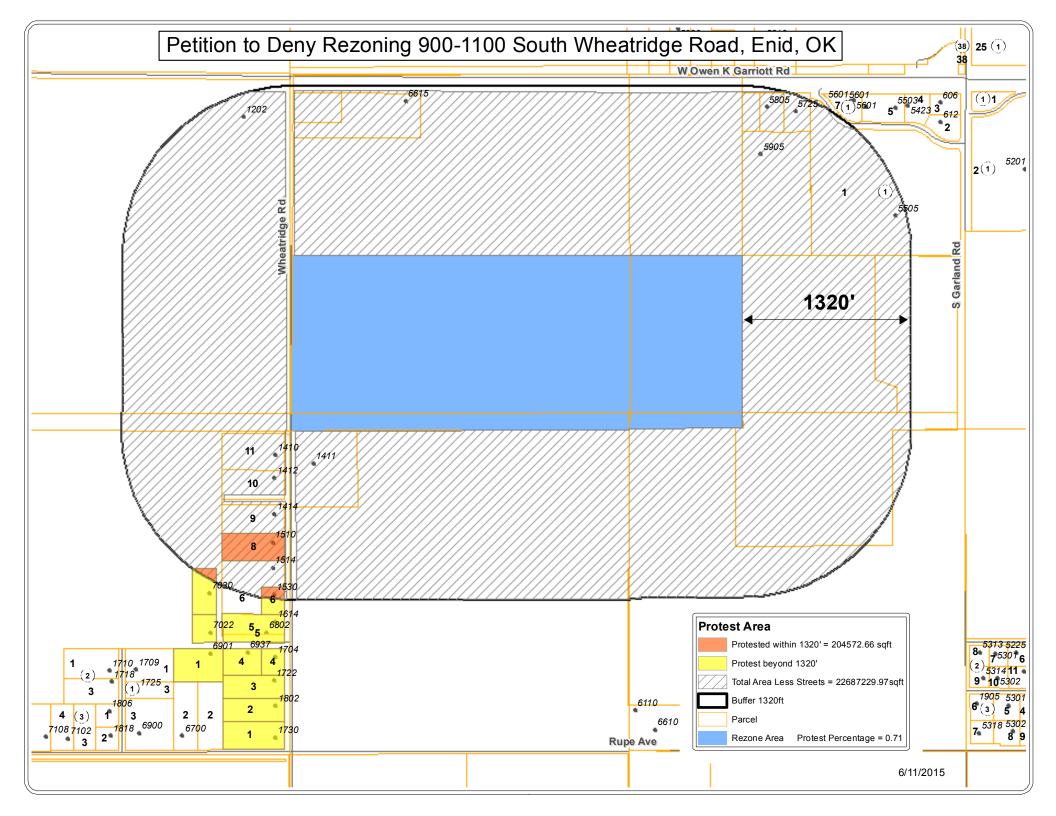

As we have become more aware of the desperate need of housing for men and women that are released form jail, we have developed a program that could quite possibly be the answer for a small group of individuals looking for a way to reenter society with people that have their best interest at heart.

We have established a preliminary reentry program that starts while they are still incarcerated. This opportunity gives us the ability to get to know them before they are released, and determine if we would be the best fit for them as they transition back into society.

Below is a broad outline of our expectations while they are still incarcerated

- Inmate will be asked to fill out an in depth application
- Sign a contract
- Be assigned to a trained and badged Mentor (designated by FM)
- · Assistance with life skill training
 - · GED assistance
 - Money Management Classes
 - Celebrate Recovery Classes
 - ID/Social Security Assistance
 - Etc.
 - Once released, individual will start phase 1 (30 days), in our temporary program housing
 - If Phase 1 is completed, inmate will continue on to Phase 2, and 3 (also 30 days each)
 - After all phases are completed participant will graduate program and start their lives elsewhere.
 - Parking will not be necessary as these men will <u>not</u> have vehicles at this stage in their transition. Most of these men will not be able to afford a vehicle until they graduate from the program.

All mentors will go to Forgotten Ministries and DOC training (in able to be badged) Mentor will help the participant with bedding, clothing, groceries, first month rent, etc. *If inmate completes all phases, they will be able to keep all of the above assistance.*

Location and Housing

Placing the appropriate style of housing is crucial to accommodating this need. We are pursuing "bunk style" crew housing that can accommodate 12 guests per unit. We are desiring to purchase two of these homes which will increase the number of guests on this particular lot to 24. We are currently determining the exact dimensions of these homes and as soon as we have the dimensions we will be passing them along. Below is a picture of the "bunk" homes in their current state. We will of course be changing the color and even possibly adding decks and maybe even different siding. The look and feel of this neighborhood is very important to us. We are increasingly more invested in this neighborhood then your average Joe. We have chosen this neighborhood specifically to plant our ministries roots, and of course. as you are aware, we just built a 10,000 sq. ft training center in order to impact our city. Needless to say, we care deeply about this neighborhood.

Not only will we be improving the quality of the neighborhood and bringing a sense of ownership to a very dilapidated and forgotten community, we are filling an urgent need that is critical to the success of men and women that are truly starting over.

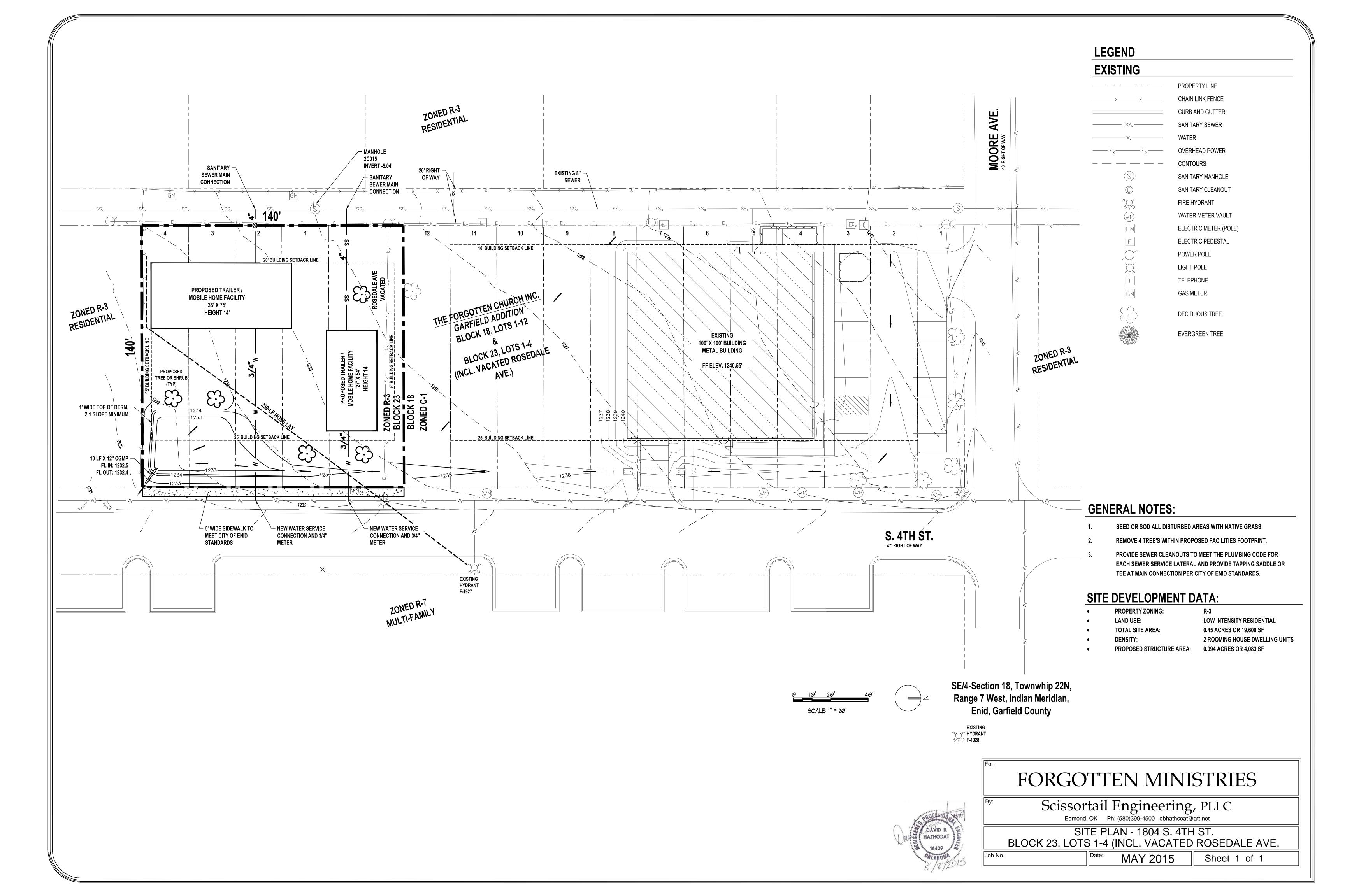

RECYCLING DROPSITE AND PROCESSING FACILITY SERVICE AGREEMENT BETWEEN SUPPORTED COMMUNITY LIFESTYLES PERSONNEL – ENID, INC. AND THE CITY OF ENID

This Recycling Drop-Site and Processing Facility Service Agreement, hereinafter referred to as this "Agreement," is made by and between Supported Community Lifestyles Personnel – Enid, Inc., an Oklahoma Corporation, hereinafter referred to as "SCL," and the City of Enid, Oklahoma, an Oklahoma Municipal Corporation, hereinafter referred to as the "City."

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Supported Community Lifestyles Personnel – Enid, Inc., partners with its clients to develop a meaningful quality of life that is safe for everyone involved, including the community; and,

WHEREAS, Supported Community Lifestyles Personnel – Enid, Inc., has thirteen (13) homes in Enid and thirty-eight (38) homes around the State; and,

WHEREAS, Supported Community Lifestyles Personnel – Enid, Inc., provides community programs and services to its developmentally disabled and special needs clients, including job coaching and other employment services; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Enid owns and operates a recycling processing center and provides its residents with dropsite recycling services; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Enid needs personnel to operate both the processing center and dropsite location.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants and conditions herein stated and in consideration of the mutual benefits which will accrue to each of the parties hereto, the sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged by the parties, it is agreed by and between the parties as follows:

1. <u>Engagement of SCL</u>. The City hereby engages SCL to perform certain recycling services for the benefit of the City. SCL accepts such engagement pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth herein.

2. <u>Scope of Services</u>.

- a. SCL shall provide the required manpower at the City's Recycling Dropsite and at the City's Recycling Processing Center.
- b. SCL shall train and supervise all workers to ensure proper and safe performance of all duties at both locations.

- c. SCL workers shall assist the public with utilization of the Dropsite and will sort and bale all recyclables at the Recycling Processing Center.
- d. Services shall be provided during the hours agreed upon by SCL and the City.

3. <u>Responsibilities of City</u>.

- a. City shall pay to SCL Seven Dollars and Twenty-Five Cents (\$7.25) per client hour worked, up to a maximum of two hundred (200) hours per week.
- b. City shall pay to SCL fifty percent (50%) of the proceeds received for the sale of the baled paper, cardboard and plastic processed at the Recycling Processing Center.
- c. City shall provide all receptacles for materials and the material handling equipment, e.g. forklift, balers, etc., necessary to perform the sorting and baling operations at the Recycling Processing Center.
- d. City shall post signs informing the public that materials received at the Dropsite and all materials collected are not handled securely or in a confidential manner.
- e. City is fully responsible for the hauling and disposal of all materials received at the Dropsite and all materials processed at the Recycling Processing Center.
- 4. <u>Billing</u>. Invoices should be submitted to the City on or before the 10th day of the month following the month in which services were rendered. Payment should be sent to SCL by the 10th of the next month.
- 5. Term. This Agreement shall be effective from July 1, 2015, through June 30, 2016. This Agreement may be terminated by either party for any reason upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party. Unless otherwise terminated as provided herein, this Agreement shall automatically renew on July 1 annually. This Agreement is subject to annual appropriation by the Mayor and Board of Commissioners. If sufficient funds are not appropriated or allocated for payment under this Agreement, then the City shall terminate this Agreement on the last day of any fiscal year, without future obligations, liabilities or penalties, except for amounts due up to the time of termination.
- 6. <u>Insurance</u>. SCL shall carry and keep in force during the Term of this Agreement, policies of insurance as set forth below or as required by the laws of the State of Oklahoma, whichever is greater.
 - a. Public Liability:
 - 1) Bodily Injury, each person \$ 100,000.00
 - 2) Bodily Injury, each accident 300,000.00

- 3) Property Damage, aggregate 100,000.00
- 4) Employer's Liability and Workmen's Compensation as required by statute
- b. Automobiles:
 - 1) Bodily Injury, each person \$ 50,000.00
 - 2) Bodily Injury, each accident 100,000.00
 - 3) Property Damage, each accident 25,000.00
- c. On all policies of insurance, other than Worker's Compensation, SCL shall name the City of Enid as additionally insured.
- d. Before any work shall begin or charges accrue, SCL shall furnish to the City certificates evidencing the above required insurance and shall update the certificates annually upon renewal.
- 7. <u>Disclaimer of Intent to Become Partners.</u> Neither SCL nor the City shall, by virtue of this Agreement, be deemed to be partners of joint ventures in this Agreement. It is expressly understood that SCL is an independent contractor of the City for purposes of carrying out its obligations under this Agreement. Employees of SCL are not considered employees of the City of Enid for any purpose.
- 8. <u>Compliance with Laws</u>. SCL agrees to conduct its business under the terms of the Agreement in such a manner that it does not violate any federal, state or local laws or regulations applicable to the conduct of its operations.
- 9. Interpretation of Law/Venue. This Agreement shall be deemed to have been made in the State of Oklahoma and shall be construed and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Oklahoma. Any action or proceeding seeking to enforce any provision of, or based on any right arising out of, this Agreement may be brought against any of the parties in the courts of the State of Oklahoma, County of Garfield, or if it has or can acquire jurisdiction, in the United States District Court for the Western District of Oklahoma, and each of the parties consents to the jurisdiction of such courts (and of the appropriate appellate courts) in any such action or proceeding and waives any objection to venue laid therein.
- 10. <u>Assignment</u>. Neither party shall assign this Agreement or any interest herein without the express written consent of the other party in writing.
- 11. <u>Amendments</u>. Amendments may be made to this Agreement only upon the approval, in writing, by both parties hereto.

- 12. <u>Binding Effect</u>. This Agreement will be binding upon the successors and assigns of the parties hereto.
- 13. <u>Severability</u>. If any one or more of the sections, sentences, clauses, parts or parties to this Agreement, be held invalid for any reason, the invalidity of such section, sentence, clause, part, or party shall not affect or prejudice in any way the applicability and validity of the other provision of this Agreement.
- 14. <u>Employment Verification</u>. The City requires all contractors to verify that employees working pursuant to contracts with the City are legally authorized to work in the United States. SCL shall verify and document the employment eligibility of all employees who may perform services pursuant to this Agreement. SCL shall also require all subcontractors who perform services under this Agreement to verify and document the employment eligibility of all employees who may perform services pursuant to this Agreement
- 15. <u>Non-Discrimination</u>. The parties hereto, for themselves and their successors and assigns, and for their subcontractors, do hereby covenant and agree that no person shall be excluded from participation in, denied the benefit of, or otherwise subjected to discrimination under the terms of this Agreements on the ground of race, color, age, sex, handicap, or national origin; and that, in carrying out the terms and conditions of this Agreements, no person shall be subjected to discrimination on the grounds of race, color, age, sex, handicap, or nation origin.
- 16. <u>Notices</u>. Whenever a notice is required to be given under the terms of this Agreement, or any amendment hereto, such notice shall be made in writing and either be hand-delivered or mailed by certified mail, return receipt requested, and directed to the respective parties at the following addresses:

17. Governmental Tort Claims Act. By entering into this Agreement, City and its "employees," as defined by the Governmental Tort Claims Act, 51 Okla. Stat. § 151 et seq., do not waive sovereign immunity, any defenses, or any limitations of liability as may be provided for by law. No provision of this Agreement modifies and/or waives any provision of the Local Government Tort Claims Act.

- 18. <u>Third Party Beneficiaries</u>. Nothing in this Agreement, express or implied, is intended to confer upon any person other than the parties hereto and their respective assigns, any rights or remedies under or by reason of this Agreement.
- 19. <u>Indemnification and Hold Harmless</u>. SCL shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the City and any and all officers, agents and employees of the City, against all damages, including but not limited to, any loss, liability, expense, suit, or claim for injury to persons or damages to property arising out of the activities of SCL, its employees, subcontractors and agents under or in connection with this Agreement, whether or not any act or omission complained of is authorized, allowed or prohibited by SCL, and all reasonable expenses together with all damages and penalties thereto. Expenses shall include, without limitation, all out-of-pocket expenses, attorney's fees, witness fees, and discovery costs
- 20. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, and when each party has signed and delivered to the other at least one (1) such counterpart, each counterpart shall be deemed an original, and when taken together with other signed counterparts, shall constitute one (1) agreement; provided, however, this Agreement shall not be binding upon the parties hereto until signed by all of the parties.
