BACKGROUND: This is a companion to Item 7.1. The Stonebridge development consists of single and multi-family dwellings located northwest of Chestnut Avenue and Cleveland Street. The developer is requesting a masonry amendment to the Stonebridge PUD Design Statement. The current approved PUD requires a minimum of 70% brick veneer, masonry, rock or stone on the exterior walls of all structures. The amendment would retain the 70% masonry requirement for the single-family homes and allow a minimum of 35% masonry on the exterior walls of all multi-family structures. The property is zoned R-2 Residential Single Family with a PUD Overlay for multi-family dwellings.

The Metropolitan Area Planning Commission unanimously recommended amending the Stonebridge PUD Statement at their August 18, 2014 meeting.

6.2 CONDUCT A HEARING ON A REZONING FOR PROPERTY DESCRIBED AS A TRACT OF LAND IN THE NORTHWEST QUARTER OF SECTION 11, TOWNSHIP 22 NORTH, RANGE SIX WEST OF THE INDIAN MERIDIAN, FROM "A" AGRICULTURE DISTRICT TO "I-2" LIGHT INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT.

BACKGROUND: This is a companion to Item 7.2. This concerns approximately 10.8 acres located at the northeast corner of 42nd Street and Highway 412. The applicant is requesting rezoning the property from "A" Agriculture District to "I-2" Light Industrial District. The permitted uses in "I-2" allows for both light industrial and commercial uses.

The zoning pattern surrounding this request includes "A" Agriculture District to the north and east, and "I-3" Heavy Industrial District to the south across Highway 412. The current land use is High Intensity Industrial which is appropriate for the proposed zoning change.

Required improvements to the current streets, water and sewer systems to support the rezoning:

# Streets:

Currently 42nd Street is an unimproved gravel road. The applicant will pave 42nd Street from Owen K. Garriott Road to the north access point of the Loves Travel

Plaza on the west side of the street. They are not paving to the railroad tracks. The applicant will install a new right turn lane on Highway 412 onto 42nd Street and improve the existing left turn lane in Highway 412 to comply with Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) Standards. They will redesign the Highway 412, 42nd Street and Randolph Avenue intersection; widen Randolph Avenue to the west access point of the Love's Travel Plaza. ODOT is currently reviewing the traffic impacts at this intersection and may require additional improvement. The applicant is aware of the ongoing review and will make any additional improvements required by ODOT.

#### Water:

The applicant will install a new 18-inch water line in 42nd Street that will loop the existing eight-inch water line south of Owen K. Garriott Road to the existing 20-inch water line in Chestnut Avenue. Looping the existing water system will improve water pressures, water flow and fire protection for this neighborhood.

#### Sewer:

The applicant will install a new lift station and connect it to the existing eight-inch sewer in 42nd Street south of Owen K. Garriott Road with a six-inch forced main.

The applicant is paying for the entire infrastructure improvements and negotiating recovery incentives up to 64% of this cost through the Enid Regional Development Alliance.

The Metropolitan Area Planning Commission unanimously recommended approval at their July 21, 2014 meeting.

# 8. ADMINISTRATION.

The Surface and Ground Water Supply Study was accepted January 7, 2014. The study recommends the City of Enid pursue a pipeline to Kaw Lake as a long term, reliable water source.

Staff present were City Manager Eric Benson, Assistant City Manager Joan Riley, City Attorney Andrea Chism, City Clerk Linda Parks, Director of Engineering Services Christopher Gdanski, Chief Financial Officer Jerald Gilbert, Planning Administrator Chris Bauer, Police Chief Brian O'Rourke, Human Services Director Sonya Key, and Airport Director Dan Ohnesorge.

Pastor Tom Carruthers from Willow View United Methodist Church gave the Invocation, and Police Chief Brian O'Rourke led the Flag Salute.

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Motion was made by Commissioner Janzen and seconded by Commissioner Timm to approve the minutes of the August 19, 2014 special Commission meeting, and the vote was as follows:

AYE: Commissioners Janzen, Stuber, Ezzell, Timm, Wilson, Vanhooser and Mayor Shewey. NAY: None.

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Officer Jarod Free presented "Dixie," a six-month old Daschund/Terrier mix, available for adoption at the Enid Animal Shelter.

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A proclamation was read and presented proclaiming September 16, 2014 as "The American Legion Day."

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A hearing was held regarding an amendment to the Design Statement for the Stonebridge Planned Unit Development (PUD), located northwest of Chestnut Avenue and Cleveland Street.

Planning Administrator Chris Bauer explained that the developer was requesting a masonry amendment to the Stoneridge PUD. He advised commissioners that the current PUD required a minimum of seventy percent (70%) brick veneer, masonry, rock or stone on the exterior walls of all structures. If approved, the amendment would retain the seventy percent (70%) masonry requirement for the single- family homes, and would require a minimum of thirty-five percent (35%) masonry on the exterior walls of the multi-family structures. He noted that the Metropolitan Area Planning Commission, at its August 18, 2014 meeting, unanimously recommended approval of the Stonebridge PUD Amendment.

Commissioner Janzen asked staff what material would be used on the exterior of the apartment complex.

Mr. Gene Anderson from AC Developments, LLC, responded, stating that it would be a mixture of masonry product, but not specifically brick.

Commissioner Stuber asked if the developer was considering the use of EFIS on the exterior.

Mr. Anderson stated yes, that was his understanding. There being no further comments, the hearing concluded.

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A hearing was held regarding a rezoning request for property described as a tract of land in the N.W./4 of Section 11-22-6, located at the northeast corner of 42nd Street and Highway 412, from "A" Agriculture District to "I-2" Light Industrial District, for the proposed Loves Travel Plaza. Mr. Bauer stated that the rezoning request was consistent with the current land use, and noted that the Metropolitan Area Planning Commission unanimously recommended approval of the request at its meeting of July 21, 2014.

Mr. Bauer advised commissioners that to support the rezoning, the applicant had agreed to pave 42nd Street from Owen K. Garriott Road to the north access point of the travel plaza on the west side of the street. A new right turn lane on Highway 412 onto 42nd Street would be installed, and the existing left turn lane on Highway 412 would be improved to comply with Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) standards. He stated that the applicant would reconstruct the Highway 412 and 42nd Street, and the 42nd Street and Randolph Avenue intersections, and widen Randolph Avenue to the west access point of the travel plaza. He noted that ODOT was currently reviewing traffic impacts at this intersection which could require additional improvements, adding that the applicant was aware of the review and had agreed to make any additional improvements required by ODOT. He stated that the applicant would install a new 18-inch water line in 42nd Street that would loop the existing 8inch water line south of Owen K. Garriott Road to the existing 20-inch water line in Chestnut Avenue, which would improve water pressures, water flow and fire protection for the neighborhood. Additionally, the applicant would install a new lift station which would be connected to the existing 8-inch sewer in 42nd Street south of Owen K. Garriott Road, with a 6-inch forced main. He noted that the applicant was paying for the entire infrastructure improvements and was negotiating recovery incentives up to sixty-four percent (64%) of the cost through the Enid Regional Development Alliance (ERDA).

Commissioner Ezzell asked if the developer for the Thunder Travel Plaza (Pilot) had plans to improve the left turn lane heading west onto Highway 412.

Mr. Bauer responded, stating not to his knowledge. Pilot was improving the lanes that would feed traffic into their site.

Commissioner Timm asked if a traffic signal would be required at the intersection.

Mr. Bauer stated that this was a part of ODOT's traffic study and their findings would be completed soon.

Commissioner Vanhooser asked if the sixty-four percent (64%) recovery through the ERDA included all the street improvements, or just the waterline and sewer.

Mr. Bauer stated that he did not know those details, and negotiations were ongoing with the ERDA. However, a Love's representative had indicated the recovery was only for water and sewer improvements.

There being no further comments, the hearing concluded.

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A hearing was held regarding a rezoning request for property described as a tract of land in the N.E./4 of Section 10-22-6, located at the northwest corner of 42nd Street and Highway 412 lying south of the railroad right-of-way, from "R-1" Residential Estate District to "I-2" Light Industrial District, for the proposed Love's Travel Plaza.

Mr. Bauer stated that the rezoning request was consistent with the current land use. He went on to say that required improvements to the streets, water and sewer systems to support the rezoning had been addressed and satisfied in the previous item, and noted that the Metropolitan Area Planning Commission, at its July 21, 2014 meeting, unanimously recommended approval of the rezoning.

There being no further comments, the hearing concluded.

Concerns were voiced by commissioners regarding the definition of masonry, more specifically, if Exterior Insulation Finishing System (EFIS) was considered a masonry product.

Lengthy discussion followed. During discussion, City Attorney Andrea Chism stated that she understood the concerns of the Commission, and suggested that the word masonry could be removed from the amendment to ensure that the project was done as the Commission desired.

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Results and recommendations of the Surface and Ground Water Supply Study dated January 2014, were presented by Mr. Murali Katta, P.C., Project Engineer. Mr. Katta provided the following options for consideration by commissioners to meet the City of Enid's current and projected water demands through the year 2050: 1) Expansion of the City's well field; 2) Construction of a local lake for use as a water source; and 3) Permitting and developing Kaw Lake as a water source. He noted that the Surface and Ground Water Supply Study recommended that the City pursue a pipeline to Kaw Lake as a long term, reliable water source, and that staff's recommendation was to pursue detailed engineering and funding options to develop Kaw Lake as a water source. He went on to say that if the Kaw Lake option was approved, the City would still be required to maintain its well field, but as an alternate source if needed.

Motion was made by Commissioner Stuber and seconded by Commissioner Timm to direct staff to pursue detailed engineering and funding options to develop Kaw Lake as a water source.

A timeline with respect to the preliminary engineering phase of the project was discussed by Mr. Christopher Gdanski, Director of Engineering. He stated that the engineering study would begin in early February 2015. The study would be completed in approximately 12 months, at which time commissioners would determine whether or not to continue the project.
