The Metropolitan Area Planning Commission recommended approval contingent the deed restriction against business uses was removed at their February 24, 2014 meeting. Since then the applicant has successfully rendered the business deed restrictions null and void in District Court.

9.2 CONSIDERATION AND DENIAL OF TORT CLAIMS OF DEVANTE LYONS AND SABINE DESHAZO.

BACKGROUND: On June 13, 2014, Devante Lyons submitted a tort claim for property damage in the amount of \$650.00. The claim alleged that on May 26, 2014, Mr. Lyons hit a pothole on 16th Steet and Owen K. Garriott Road causing damage to the passenger side tire and rim of his 2002 Lincoln and on June 7, 2014, he hit another pothole on the Van Buren Street overpass causing damage to the drivers side rim. The City Attorney investigated and determined the City was not liable as alleged because Owen K. Garriott Road and Van Buren Street are state highways and the City of Enid is not responsible for upkeep of state highways. The City Attorney found no liability on the City's part regarding the incident and recommends denial of the claim.

On August 14, 2014, Sabine Deshazo submitted a tort claim for a veterinary bill in the amount of \$292.50. Ms. Deshazo alleges she adopted a mixed lab puppy from the Enid Animal Shelter on August 12, 2014. According to Ms. Deshazo, within two hours of her adoption the animal was unresponsive. The puppy tested positive for Parvo and was euthanized that day. Ms. Deshazo completed a Refund Request Form and will be reimbursed for the amount she paid for the puppy. The City Attorney investigated and determined the City of Enid was not liable as alleged because Ms. Deshazo signed a disclaimer on the day of adoption. The disclaimer states "The City of Enid is not responsible for the adopted animal's health. The City of Enid will not be responsible for additional fees you incur at the veterinarian". The City Attorney found no liability on the City's part and recommends that the City deny the claim.

RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING PARTICIPATION IN THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA AT-GRADE RAILROAD SAFETY PROGRAM FOR CERTAIN FEDERAL-AID RAILROAD SAFETY PROJECTS

WHEREAS, the Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railway Company crossings in the City of Enid, Garfield County, qualify for safety improvements under the State of Oklahoma at-grade Railroad Safety Program.

WHEREAS, representatives from the Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railway Company, the City of Enid, and the Oklahoma Department of Transportation recommend the following engineering improvements as follows:

- The installation of Pedestal Flashing Signals with Gates, Utilizing Prediction Circuitry and a new Full-Depth Concrete Crossing Surface at the following location: N. Washington Street DOT No. 673-804S. The estimated City share of the cost is Thirty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000.00).
- 2) The installation of Gates to Existing Cantilevers, Upgrading of the LED Lenses and the installation of a new Full-Depth Concrete Crossing Surface at the following location: N. Cleveland Street DOT No. 673-844U. The estimated City share of the cost is Twelve Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$12,500.00).
- 3) The installation of Pedestal Flashing Signals with Gates, Utilizing Prediction Circuitry at the following location: N. 2nd Street DOT No. 673-837J. The estimated City share of the cost is Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00).

WHEREAS, City funds will be utilized to fund 10% of the total cost of the Signal portion of the listed safety improvements at an estimated total cost to the City of \$72,500.00

WHEREAS, the City agrees to assume responsibility and to execute an agreement with the State of Oklahoma for the maintenance of the railroad advance warning signs and pavement markings after initial installation. This does $\underline{\text{not}}$ include other accessories such as signals or gates which shall be maintained by the Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railway Company.

WHEREAS, the City will not hold the Oklahoma Department of Transportation liable for any damages to city streets incurred during the rerouting of traffic.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City resolves to participate in these projects and the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute such agreements as shall be necessary to implement this resolution.

Motion was made by Commissioner Ezzell and seconded by Commissioner Stuber to remove from the table an ordinance amending the Enid Municipal Code, 2014, Title 2, entitled "Finance And Taxation," Chapter 6, entitled "Fee Schedule," Article E, entitled "Utilities Fees And Charges," Section 2-6E-3, entitled "Fire Hydrant Connection Charge," to provide a rental fee for fire hydrant meters used over one month; amending Title 2, entitled "Finance And Taxation," Chapter 6, entitled "Fee Schedule," Article E, entitled "Utilities Fees And Charges," Section 2-63-5, entitled "Water Rates And Charges," to update chart with current rates, reduce rates for users outside city limits, merge industrial and institutional users with commercial users, provide a greater base rate for larger water meters, set rate increases for political subdivisions and rural water districts at two percent greater than the current residential and commercial water rate, provide for specific annual increases through the year 2019 and for a two percent increase annually thereafter; Title 2, entitled "Finance And Taxation," Chapter 6, entitled "Fee Schedule," Article E, entitled "Utilities Fees And Charges," Section 2-6E-6, entitled "Sewer Service Charges Inside City; Billing," to update chart to current rates, merge industrial and institutional users with commercial users, provide for a two percent annual increase in rates effective January 1, 2015; amending Title 8, entitled "Utilities," Chapter 1, entitled "Utility Services; Rates," Section 8-1-13, entitled "After Hours Service Fee," to increase the after hours service fee; amending Title 8, entitled "Utilities," Chapter 2, entitled "Water System," Section 8-2-15, entitled "Conservation And Waste Of Water," to update chart to current rates and merge industrial and institutional users with commercial users; and providing for effective date, repealer, savings clause, severability, and codification, which was tabled at the August 4, 2014 special Commission meeting, and the vote was as follows:

Discussion was held regarding Item 9.4, Approve Amendment No. 2 To The Agreement For Professional Engineering Services, Project Management And Inspection Services With Tetra Tech, Inc., Oklahoma City, Oklahoma For An Additional Bridge Budgeted In The 2014-2015 Capital Improvement Program.

City Engineer Robert Hitt advised commissioners that after publication of the agenda, Tetra Tech, Inc. had agreed to provide Project Management Services only for the project, at a cost not to exceed \$30,000.00. He went on to say that staff's recommendation was to approve the amendment as agreed upon, and authorize the Mayor to execute the amendment after review by the City Attorney.

Motion was made by Commissioner Ezzell and seconded by Commissioner Vanhooser to approve Amendment No. 2 with Tetra Tech, Inc. for Project Management Services only for said project, at a cost not to exceed \$30,000.00, and authorize the Mayor to execute said amendment after review by the City Attorney, and the vote was as follows:

AYE: Commissioners Janzen, Stuber, Ezzell, Timm, Wilson, Vanhooser and Mayor Shewey.

NAY: None.

Brief discussion was held on Item 9.6, Convey A 25-Foot Public Utility Easement To Oklahoma Gas And Electric (OG&E) Company, An Oklahoma Corporation, To Facilitate The Placement Of Overhead Power Lines To Support Development In The Area Of Garland Road And Willow Road.

Mr. Hitt explained that the item would convey a 25-foot Public Utility Easement to the City of Enid rather than OG&E, with full use by OG&E per its franchise agreement.

Motion was made by Commissioner Stuber and seconded by Commissioner Janzen to approve Item 9.6 as amended, and the vote was as follows:

AYE: Commissioners Janzen, Stuber, Ezzell, Timm, Wilson and Mayor Shewey.

NAY: Commissioner Vanhooser.

Motion was made by Commissioner Vanhooser and seconded by Commissioner Ezzell to award a contract for Project No. M-1502A, Convention Hall Roof Replacement, to the lowest responsible bidder, Bloyer & Sons, Inc., Winfield, Kansas, for the Base Bid and Alternates 1, 2, 4 and 5, in the amount of \$281,705.00, and authorize the Mayor to execute all contract documents after review by the City Attorney.

Mr. Scott Coontz, 5502 Pheasant Run Drive, addressed the Commission. He stated that his bid, with the alternates recommended by staff, was the second lowest bid, or \$545.00 higher than the lowest bid submitted. He stated that the bidding documents for the project had indicated that the number of calendar days to complete the project would be considered in the awarding of the contract. He noted that his bid reflected 90 calendar days to complete the work, as opposed to 100 calendar days bid by Bloyer and Sons, and asked that the Commission consider that option and award the contract to him, an in-town local contractor.

City Attorney Andrea Chism stated that State law required that the Commission had to select the lowest responsible bid. If the bid selected was not the lowest responsible bid, then the Commission had to articulate why it was the most responsible bid. If all of the bids that were submitted were responsible bids, then the Commission had to select the lowest responsible bid.

Commissioner Vanhooser asked if there was room for the Commission to consider the 10-day difference as being a justifiable reason, if articulated properly, to alter that.

Commissioner Janzen stated that he felt completing the project faster was important in this case. He noted that the roof was in such bad condition that it was creating damage to the building. If a storm occurred in that 10-day period, it could do a considerable amount of additional damage.

Ms. Chism responded to Commissioner Vanhooser's question. She stated that the Commission had to decide, and articulate why, they felt the 10 days made the low bid not responsible. She went on to say that after reviewing the bids, she wouldn't necessarily consider that enough difference, in that all of the bids submitted were within the expected timeframe for completion of the contract.

Commissioner Vanhooser made the argument that 10 days in a 100-day project represented ten percent (10%). \$500.00 represented less than one-half of one percent of the total cost, making it a significant difference in favor of the shorter contract term.

Mr. Coontz reiterated that all of the bidders knew that the number of calendar days bid would be considered in the award of the contract.

Commissioner Wilson replied, stating that did not change the law that required the Commission to take the lowest responsible bid, adding that each bid was responsible. Would the Commission like the project to be completed 10 days sooner? Probably. However, it did not make the other bids less responsible.

Ms. Chism stated again that consistent with State law, the Commission would have to articulate why the second lowest bid was more responsive. She reminded commissioners that a motion was on the table, and stated that it would have to be defeated, or rescinded.

Commissioner Vanhooser then withdrew his motion.

Mr. Benson stated that the Commission had the option to articulate the distinction on making their determination of which bid to select. In this case, the question was the dollar versus days. If the Commission articulated that as their distinction, then a revised motion would be in order, and could be accepted.

Ms. Chism responded, stating that she agreed.

Motion was then made by Commissioner Janzen to award said contract to Coontz Roofing based on the fact that the contractor had bid a shorter timeframe for completion.

Motion was seconded by Commissioner Timm.

Commissioner Vanhooser stated that he would like to articulate that he agreed with the motion from the standpoint that as had been previously stated, water was running down the walls inside Convention Hall, which was potentially leading to further damage. He stated that the quicker the contract could be completed, then he felt 10 days, and the Oklahoma environment with storms, was important. Shortening the contract time by 10 days was the more responsible approach for the Commission to take, even though that bid was \$500.00 higher.

Ms. Chism stated that she felt that was perfect.

The vote was taken as follows:

AYE: Commissioners Janzen, Stuber, Ezzell, Timm, Wilson and Vanhooser.

NAY: Mayor Shewey.

Mayor Shewey recessed the meeting to convene as the Enid Municipal Authority.
